I'll ask National Security Advisor H.R. McMaster and the former Chairman of the Joint Chiefs Admiral Mike Mullen. Joining me for insight and analysis are Joy Reed, host of AM Joy on MSNBC; Rich Lowry, editor of The National Review; Amy Walter, national editor of the Cook Political Report; and Helene Cooper, pentagon correspondent for the New York Times. Welcome to Sunday. It's Meet the Press.

This Sunday, after Charlottesville. President Trump makes his "both sides are to blame" argument. DONALD TRUMP: But you also had people that were very fine people, on both sides. Equating the white nationalists with the protestors. DONALD TRUMP: Excuse me what about the alt left that came charging at the—as you say the alt right? Do they have any semblance of guilt? Did the president lose his moral authority this week by failing to condemn white supremacists, the Klan, and neo-Nazis? I'll ask former Republican congressman J.C. This Sunday, nuclear tension. North Korea claims it has detonated a hydrogen bomb that could be mounted on an intercontinental ballistic missile. What does this mean and how will the U.S. react? We'll have the latest. Plus, after Harvey. FEMALE STORM VICTIM: I just was in such denial. I didn't put anything up. I didn't grab anything. The greatest rainfall event ever in the continental United States. GABE GUTIERREZ: The rainfall amounts really are staggering. Tens of thousands still in shelters. I'll talk to Republican Senator Roy Blunt of Missouri. Joining me for insight and analysis are, NBC White House Correspondent Kristen Welker, Matthew Continetti of The Washington Free Beacon, U.S.A. Today's Washington Bureau Chief, Susan Page, and Eddie Glaude of Princeton University. Welcome to Sunday, it's Meet the Press.

This Sunday who's party is it anyway? First, the Republicans, President Trump's reversal on immigration has conservatives furious. It could have just been an off week, but the more time we spend talking about water safety, the greater the risk that the discussion becomes stale and begins to sound like elevator music. After a while, no one seems to be paying attention.

And this makes me begin to think that if we don't get this water quality issue resolved, it could be our fault just as much as Chemours.
