Eighty-four-year-old William Wilson died as a hospital inpatient on Sunday. Jeffrey Sand, who was 69, died at the facility on April 9.

The facility, which is privately operated by The Geo Group, is reporting 43 confirmed cases of coronavirus, including 34 inmates. There are just 10 additional cases involving prisoners through the state's entire prison system.

The FDOH dashboard shows Santa Rosa now with 118 confirmed cases of coronavirus.

Escambia County has 277 confirmed cases, with 4 deaths. Okaloosa has 117 cases and 1 death. Walton is still holding at 26 cases and no deaths.

Statewide, there are currently 307 long-term care facilities with positive cases of COVID-19. That includes 11 facilities in Escambia, and one each in Santa Rosa, Okaloosa and Walton counties.

And, the Blackwater River Correctional Facility in Santa Rosa still has one of the highest outbreaks of coronavirus, reporting the only 4 deaths among state prisons. The facility now has 52 confirmed cases, including 42 inmates. It's second only to Tomoka Correctional Institution, which has 54 total cases.

The National Weather Service office in Mobile plans to deploy teams of meteorologists across the region over the next several days to determine if damage from Sunday night's severe weather was the result of a tornado.

Weather officials have confirmed an EF-1 tornado in Baldwin County, 8 miles northeast of Robertsdale. The estimated wind peak was 105 mph and it cut a path 300 yards wide that extended for about a half mile.

One person was injured.

Another EF-1 tornado was confirmed in Mobile, about 3 miles south-southwest of Mobile Regional Airport. The wind peak was 100 miles an hour, and the 100-year path extended for nearly 9 miles.
