**Issues and Programs List for the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2018**

**We identified the following issues of public importance:**

- 1- Opioid abuse and treatment in Fairfield County.**
- 2- 2018 General Election**
- 3- Fall events of interest to the community**
- 4- Our local public library activities and learning opportunities.**
- 5- Lancaster City Council actions and initiatives.**

**We aired the following programming to respond to these issues:**

- 1- Focus on Fairfield County hosted by Anne Darling devoted a 13 minute show to the upcoming ADAMH Ballot Issue requesting additional funding for opioid addiction treatment. This aired from 8- 8:13 am on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup>, 2018- ahead of the general election.**
- 2- On election Night- Tuesday November 6<sup>th</sup>, WLOH provided live updates from the Fairfield County Board of Elections starting at 8PM and running through Midnight. Listeners were informed of the results as they were made available. Of particular interest were three county wide levy issues for Meals on Wheels, The Fairfield County District Library and ADAMH. Also, listeners were kept informed via Ohio News Network reports on State Issue 1- a controversial proposed change to the Ohio Constitution.**
- 3- WLOH provided twenty hours of live coverage of the Fairfield County Fair- October 8<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup> 2018. WLOH also broadcast the Veteran's ceremonies live from downtown Lancaster on Sunday November 11<sup>th</sup>. WLOH broadcast live coverage of the annual Christmas Parade on Saturday November 17<sup>th</sup>.**
- 4- Every Saturday during the quarter, WLOH broadcast "Read Learn and Connect" from 6:30 to 7:00 AM. This show covered the weekly events happening in the local libraries with a focus on children's literacy programs. Other topics included the art displays in the main library and new circulation items.**

- 5- **City Council President David Uhl was interviewed for Focus on Fairfield County which aired Sunday December 23<sup>rd</sup> from 8 to 8:15 AM. City council member Becky Tener (R- 6<sup>th</sup> Ward) was also interviewed for broadcast on Sunday October 28<sup>th</sup> from 8 to 8:15 AM. These shows were devoted to city issues such as the new 'toter' system for collecting household waste. This system was implemented during the period and numerous questions were answered on what was expected of residents.**
