WSKG filled the following positions: Science Internship - Binghamton University (Spring/Summer 2022 Research Internship - LeMoyne College (Spring/Summer 2022)	Approximately 75 people participated in this day-long event. • WSKG hosted 'Women in Entomology' - a Women in STEM panel in partnership with the Museum of the Earth and Cornell University. This Live-streamed event featured mentor Dr. Corrie Moruea and three PhD students in her lab. They shared their journeys in science and how this isn't a linear path. This event was geared towards middle and high school girls, their families and teachers reaching 1,600 people across 4 countries. (10/22) • WSKG hosts a digital monthly science lecture series, Science Pub, connecting scientists and experts to our local and global communities. Topics included IF/THEN Ambassador Dr. Ray Wynn-Grant, autism and genetics, science of relationships, solving crimes using genealogy, science of home health, spiders, and geothermal science. Educators share these virtual events with students to participate in. WSKG has reached approximately 11,250 people with the Science Pub series.
