**HEALTH/ SALMONELLA POISONING**

MONTANA'S DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES CONFIRMS THE FIRST CASE OF SALMONELLA IN THE STATE THAT'S LINKED TO THE SAME STRAIN AS A NATION-WIDE GROUND TURKEY RECALL. THE MANUFACTURER VOLUNTARILY RECALLED 36-MILLION POUNDS OF THE PRODUCT ON AUGUST THIRD. OFFICIALS SAY THE SICKENED PERSON IS A CASCADE COUNTY RESIDENT AND THE CASE WASN'T SEVERE ENOUGH TO REQUIRE HOSPITALIZATION. THE D-P-H-S SUPERVISOR OF FOOD AND CONSUMER SAFETY SAYS A PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION DOESN'T INDICATE THE PERSON ATE THE RECALLED TURKEY -- BUT THERE ARE A NUMBER OF WAYS TO CONTRACT SALMONELLA. 7:21-34 Melissa Tuemmler, There is a chance that you could've been exposed or cross contamination too from exposure to this product from it being on utensils or on a work surface and then transferring it from another surface. ## **ACCIDENT/ROLLOVER**

A 22-YEAR-OLD WOMAN ROLLED HER CAR OFF NORTH MONTANA AVENUE IN THE VALLEY TODAY. MONTANA HIGHWAY PATROL TROOPER CONNER SMITH SAYS THE WOMAN WAS DRIVING SOUTHBOUND ON NORTH MONTANA AT JOHN G MINE ROAD WHILE FIDGETING WITH HER CD'S. HE SAYS SHE STARTED TO SWERVE AND OVERCORRECTED HER CAR, NEARLY HITTING ANOTHER VEHICLE HEAD ON. SHE OVERCORRECTED AGAIN AND ROLLED HER CAR A COUPLE OF TIMES OFF THE ROAD. "You've got to pay attention to the road. You gotta make sure that when you are driving, you're paying attention to what you are doing and not being distracted. And always wear seatbelts." THE WOMAN WAS NOT WEARING A SEATBELT AT THE TIME. HER AIRBAG DID DEPLOY, BUT SHE WAS NOT HURT.

## **EDUCATION/NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND**

STATE AND FEDERAL EDUCATION OFFICIALS HAVE COMPROMISED ON MONTANA'S NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND BENCHMARKS FOR THE 20-10 20-11 SCHOOL YEAR. UNDER THE LAW'S "ANNUAL MEASUREABLE OBJECTIVES" -- 92-PERCENT OF STUDENTS SHOULD BE PROFICIENT IN READING AND 84-PERCENT IN MATH. THAT PERCENTAGE WAS NOT MET IN MONTANA. THE STATE SUPERINTENDANT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION ANNOUNCED NEW STANDARDS TODAY -- LEAVING 16 PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN MONTANA FALLING SHORT INSTEAD OF THE ORIGINAL 155 SCHOOLS.

## **PLANE ACCIDENT/INVESTIGATION**

TWO PEOPLE ARE DEAD FOLLOWING A SINGLE-ENGINE AIRPLANE CRASH WEST OF BUTTE. IT HAPPENED AROUND ELEVEN O'CLOCK THIS MORNING. A F-A-A SPOKESPERSON SAYS THE TWO PEOPLE ON BOARD THE PLANE WERE THE ONLY FATALITIES. THEIR IDENTITIES HAVEN'T BEEN RELEASED AND THE CAUSE OF THE CRASH IS STILL UNDER INVESTIGATION. A NEARBY RESIDENT SAYS HE HEARD SOME NOISE SHORTLY BEFORE THE ACCIDENT -- BUT THOUGHT IT WAS SIMPLY A SEMI ON THE HIGHWAY. I heard kind of a stranger noise than what you usually hear here but I thought it was probably a semi just going down the road with the brake or something like that. THE CRASH HAPPENED BETWEEN ROCKER AND RAMSAY AND CAN BE SEEN JUST SOUTH OF INTERSTATE-90. THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF BERT MOONEY AIRPORT SAYS THE PLANE HAD DEPARTED FROM THE BUTTE AIRPORT MONDAY MORNING.

## **CRIME/TASER INVESTIGATION**

A HELENA MAN IS IN CRITICAL CONDITION AT BENEFIS HOSPITAL FOLLOWING AN INCIDENT SUNDAY NIGHT WHEN HE WAS TASERED **TWICE** BY A LEWIS AND CLARK COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPUTY. BUT SHERIFF LEO DUTTON SAYS HE DOESN'T BELIEVE ROGER CHANDLER'S CONDITION IS A RESULT OF THE ELECTRIC SHOCK -- MORE LIKELY HE SAYS IT WAS WHATEVER CAUSED THE 41-YEAR OLD MAN TO ACT SO ERRATICALLY IN THE FIRST PLACE. ON SUNDAY NIGHT - DEPUTIES RESPONDED TO A CALL ON ROSS ROAD WHERE THE MAN WAS ACTING IN AN IRRATIONAL AND DANGEROUS MANNER SAYS DUTTON. HE WAS NOT RESPONSIVE TO DEPUTY'S COMMANDS. Sheriff Leo Dutton "Officers had to do something. They had to protect themselves. They had to protect the person who was out of control and they had to protect or look out for the safety of the public as well." SHERIFF DUTTON SAYS IT'S PROTOCOL TO HAVE INCIDENTS LIKE THIS ONE REVIEWED BY AN OUTSIDE AGENCY. HE'S ASKED THE MONTANA DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION TO CONDUCT IT.

## **TRANSPORTATION/SCHOOL BUS REGULATIONS**

BOZEMAN SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT KIRK MILLER SAYS THEY'VE BEEN WORKING TO DEVELOP STRICTER GUIDELINES FOR BUS DRIVERS -- AFTER TWO DRIVERS WERE CHARGED WITH DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE ON A FIELD TRIP IN JUNE. THE UPDATED POLICY STATES -- **NO ALCOHOL** ON ANY TRIPS INVOLVING STUDENTS... NO SMOKING CIGARETTES IN SIGHT OF STUDENTS AND NO CELL PHONE USE ON THE ROAD... INCLUDING TEXTING. SUPERINTENDENT MILLER SAYS THE BUS PROVIDER HAS MET EXPECTATIONS AND THE DISTRICT WILL CONTINUE TO USE THE SERVICE AS LONG AS THEY FOLLOW THEIR NEW GUIDELINES. "They really took this very seriously. They were as remorseful and upset about it as, certainly, we were when it happened in the spring and they took immediate action and that's the sign of somebody that's pretty good to work with." THE NEW GUIDELINES WILL APPLY TO ALL DRIVERS TRANSPORTING STUDENTS.

## **FIRES/SWAN LAKE**

A FIRE BURNING ABOUT SEVEN MILES SOUTH-EAST OF SWAN LAKE HAS TORCHED ABOUT 490 ACRES OF LAND SINCE IS STARTED ON SATURDAY AFTERNOON. ALTHOUGH THE CAUSE OF THE "SOUTH FORK LOST CREEK" FIRE IS STILL UNDER INVESTIGATION -- PRELIMINARY INFORMATION INDICATES IT WAS STARTED BY A PERSON. ONE FIREFIGHTER WAS INJURED MONDAY -- HE WAS TAKEN TO KALISPELL REGIONAL HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT. THE FIRE IS CURRENTLY FIVE-PERCENT CONTAINED. A FEW TRAILS AROUND THE AREA REMAIN CLOSED. WE'LL CONTINUE TO UPDATE THE STATUS OF THE FIRE AS INFORMATION IS AVAILABLE.

## **LIFESTYLES/TROLLEY TRANSFER**

THE HELENA - LEWIS AND CLARK COUNTY HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION IS PLANNING THE FATE OF A HISTORICAL TROLLEY. LEWIS AND CLARK COUNTY CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER --ERIC BRYSON-- SAYS THE CITY IS HOPING TO TRANSFER OWNERSHIP OF THE TROLLEY TO THE COUNTY. THE *CITY IS CURRENTLY* IN CHARGE OF THE TROLLEY RESTORATION PROJECT. BUT BUDGET SHORTFALLS HAVE PREVENTED THE CITY FROM CONTRIBUTING MORE TO THE PROJECT. *"And at the time, the committee came to the county and asked if the county would be able to make a request to the city to take ownership of the trolley, basically so they could continue to generate interest in the restoration of the trolley project."* THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION CHAIR SAYS IT WILL COST AROUND 50-THOUSAND DOLLARS TO COMPLETE THE TROLLEY RESTORATION. THE COMMISSION IS LOOKING FOR A FULL-TIME VOLUNTEER TO TAKE OVER THE DAY TO DAY OPERATIONS OF THE RESTORATION PROJECT.

## **ENVIRONMENT/FIRE MITIGATION**

THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT IS TEMPORARILY CLOSING SOME ROADS IN THE SCRATCHGRAVEL HILLS FOR FIRE MITIGATION. THE CLOSURES WILL BE IN AFFECT FROM AUGUST 24TH TO NOVEMBER 6TH. TREES WILL BE REMOVED FROM 210 ACRES OF LAND AS PART OF THE SCRATCHGRAVEL HILLS WILDLAND URBAN INTERFACE FUELS REDUCTION PROJECT. THE PUBLIC IS ASKED TO STAY AT LEAST 300 FEET FROM THE WORKING EQUIPMENT BECAUSE THE MACHINES CAN THROW DEBRIS. RED DEAD TREES WILL BE REMOVED AND SOME GREEN TREES WILL BE THINNED OUT. THE PROJECT IS DESIGNED TO LESSEN THE SEVERITY AND ALLOW FOR SAFER SUPPRESSION SHOULD A FIRE OCCUR IN THE AREA.

## **AUGUST 17, 2011**

### **ENVIRONMENT/POISONIOUS**

WHILE ALGAE LOOKS RELATIVELY HARMLESS -- ECOLOGISTS AT THE MONTANA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY SAY IT'S PROBABLY A GOOD IDEA TO STAY AWAY FROM IT WHILE ENJOYING TIME ON THE WATER. BLUE-GREEN ALGAE IS IN BLOOM OVER THE LAST SEVERAL WEEKS IN MANY AREA LAKES. THE TWO PREDOMINANT STRAINS ARE CAPABLE OF PRODUCING POISONOUS CYTOTOXINS. THEY ALSO MULTIPLY IN A MATTER OF HOURS. ECOLOGISTS AREN'T SURE WHAT TRIGGERS THE POISONS. THEY SAY IT'S BEST TO PLAY IT SAFE NEAR HIGH CONCENTRATIONS. *Rod McNeil "it's a nuisance. It doesn't smell particularly good. It's not a good place to go wading or swimming. If you can see it in concentrations that are high enough to bother you visually, it's probably best to just avoid that stretch of water."* INTERESTINGLY ENOUGH BLUE-GREEN ALGAE ISN'T TECHNICALLY ALGAE AT ALL. IT'S A TYPE OF BACTERIA.

## HEALTH/CIGARETTE LAWSUIT

OFFICIALS SAY THE ACTIONS OF A YELLOWSTONE VISITOR JUST FEET FROM A GRIZZLY BEAR ARE RECKLESS AND ILLEGAL...BUT SOME PEOPLE SAY IT'S YELLOWSTONE'S RULES THAT ARE THE PROBLEM. NBC MONTANA'S JESS ANTONIO REPORTS SOME OF THE IMAGES YOU'RE ABOUT TO SEE ARE PRETTY GRAPHIC AND DISTURBING. IN FACT, FOUR TOBACCO GIANTS SAY THEY'RE SO GRAPHIC AND DISTURBING THAT THEY SHOULDN'T BE FORCED TO PUT THEM ON THEIR PACKAGES OF CIGARETTES BY SEPTEMBER OF 20-12. THE TOBACCO COMPANIES HAVE FILED SUIT AGAINST THE FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION. NBC'S CHRIS CLACKUM HAS THE STORY. THE NEW, GRAPHIC WARNING LABELS DEPICTING DISEASED LUNGS, GUMS AND TEETH, EVEN A CORPSE.....WERE UNVEILED IN JUNE BY HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES SECRETARY KATHLEEN SEBELIUS. BUT NOW FOUR OF THE LARGEST TOBACCO COMPANIES IN THE WORLD ARE SUING... SAYING THE FEDERAL MANDATE TO START USING LABELS A YEAR FROM NOW IS ILLEGAL. A STATEMENT FROM ONE OF THE FOUR, RJ REYNOLDS, SAYS THE REGULATION VIOLATES CORE CONSTITUTIONAL PRINCIPLES OF FREE SPEECH AND COMPLAINS ABOUT.. ...."CONTROVERSIAL PHOTOGRAPHS THAT HAVE BEEN TECHNOLOGICALLY MANIPULATED TO MAXIMIZE AN EMOTIONAL RESPONSE FROM VIEWERS, ESSENTIALLY TURNING OUR CIGARETTE PACKS INTO MINI-BILLBOARDS FOR THE GOVERNMENT'S ANTI-SMOKING MESSAGE." ADVOCATES SAY THE WARNING LABELS ARE AIMED AT ADULT SMOKERS AS WELL AS THE FOUR-THOUSAND TEENAGERS WHO TAKE UP SMOKING EACH DAY. "The vast number of smokers start while they're teenagers. I think the latest numbers are about 90% of all smokers start smoking before they turn 19" BUT A LAWYER REPRESENTING LORILLARD IN THE LAWSUIT SAID "THE NOTION THAT THE GOVERNMENT CAN REQUIRE THOSE WHO MANUFACTURE A LAWFUL PRODUCT TO EMBLAZON HALF OF ITS PACKAGE WITH PICTURES AND WORDS ADMITTEDLY DRAFTED TO PERSUADE THE PUBLIC NOT TO PURCHASE THAT PRODUCT CANNOT WITHSTAND CONSTITUTIONAL SCRUTINY" SUPPORTERS SAY THE U-S IS MERELY CATCHING UP WITH DOZENS OF OTHER COUNTRIES AROUND THE WORLD WHO'VE BEEN USING THE GRAPHIC LABELS FOR SEVERAL YEARS NOW. ## ENVIRONMENT/BEAR POLICY

THIS VIDEO SHOWING YELLOWSTONE VISITORS DANGEROUSLY CLOSE TO A GRIZZLY BEAR CAUSED MANY TO WONDER HOW SOMETHING LIKE THAT COULD HAPPEN. PARK OFFICIALS SAY THE RULES ARE CLEAR...PEOPLE MUST STAY AT LEAST A HUNDRED YARDS FROM A BEAR. BUT BEAR SPECIALIST DAVE SMITH SAYS THE PARK NEEDS TO ADOPT A POLICY SIMILAR TO ONE USED IN ANOTHER NATIONAL PARK..."glacier's policy is simply that they don't tolerate roadside bears, they don't want bears to habituate to people, to get accustomed to having people that close" GLACIER NATIONAL PARK'S POLICY IS TO FREQUENTLY HAZE BEARS WHEN THEY COME INTO CLOSE CONTACT WITH HUMANS. YELLOWSTONE SPOKESMAN AL NASH CLAIMS YELLOWSTONE RANGERS HAZE BEARS AS WELL, BUT EVERY PARK HANDLES THINGS DIFFERENTLY. "we are much less likely to haze a bear that might happen to be out somewhere along a roadside" YELLOWSTONE PARK COVERS 2-POINT-2 MILLION ACRES... NASH SAYS IT'S JUST TOO LARGE TO STOP EVERY INCIDENT LIKE THIS FROM HAPPENING. "it's just not possible for us to have a uniformed park service employee nearby at every location where something might occur" THOUGH THE PARKS MAY DIFFER ON THEIR POLICIES TO CONTROL ANIMAL AND HUMAN INTERACTION, MOST AGREE VISITORS MUST TAKE SOME RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEIR SAFETY. "the issue that we saw on tape wasn't an issue regarding a bear, it was an issue regarding visitors" "if you're in the ocean and you yell shark, everybody runs out of the water. If you're in Yellowstone and you yell bear, everybody grabs a camera and gets closer"

## CRIME/BUTTE BANK ROBBERY

INVESTIGATORS BELIEVE A WOMAN ARRESTED IN CALIFORNIA ON MONDAY IN CONNECTION WITH A HOLD UP AT A BANK COULD BE LINKED TO A BUTTE ROBBERY. THE BANK OF BUTTE WAS ROBBED BY A WOMAN WEARING A WIG LAST WEEK. POLICE ACKNOWLEDGED THE RESEMBLANCE BETWEEN THE SUSPECT AND A SERIAL BANK ROBBER -- CYNTHIA VAN HOLLAND -- ALSO KNOWS AS THE BAD HAIR BANDIT -- BUT THEY STILL HAVEN'T CLOSED THE CASE. FORTY-SEVEN-YEAR-OLD VAN HOLLAND AND A MALE ACCOMPLICE WERE ARRESTED IN CALIFORNIA. BOTH USPECTS ARE FROM HAYDEN IDAHO -- JUST NORTH OF COEUR D'ALENE. THE BAD HAIR BANDIT IS WANTED FOR 18 OR MORE ROBBERIES IN WASHINGTON -- OREGON -- CALIFORNIA. SHE EARNED THE NICKNAME FOR THE VARIETY OF WIGS SHE WORE DURING THE ROBBERIES.

## CRIME/OLIVARAES' COASTER SHOOTING

THE STATE SUPREME COURT RULED THAT A JUDGE WAS WRONG TO IMPOSE PAROLE ELIGIBILITY RESTRICTIONS ON A HELENA TEEN SENTENCED TO THREE LIFE SENTENCES. DISTRICT JUDGE DOROTHY MCCARTER'S DECISION TO IMPOSE A 60-YEAR RESTRICTION ON PAROLE FOR SEBASTIAN OLIVARES-COSTER WAS OVERTURNED BY THE SUPREME COURT TUESDAY. HE WAS 17 WHEN HE SHOT AND KILLED ONE HELENA BOY AND INJURED TWO OTHERS. HE WAS SENTENCED TO **THREE LIFE SENTENCES** FOR THE CRIMES -- WITH TWO TO BE SERVED CONCURRENTLY, BUT CONSECUTIVELY WITH THE THIRD SENTENCE. STATE LAW AUTOMATICALLY RESTRICTS PAROLE ELIGIBILITY FOR 30 YEARS FOR LIFE SENTENCES. A SECTION OF THE STATUE SAYS PAROLE ELIGIBILITY RESTRICTIONS DO NOT APPLY IF THE OFFENDER WAS UNDER 18 WHEN THEY COMMITTED THE CRIME. THE SUPREME COURT'S RULING STRIKES THE PAROLE RESTRICTION -- BUT MAINTAINS ALL OTHER PORTIONS OF THE SENTENCE.

## **CRIME/TASER DEATH**

WERE CONVICTED OF MURDERING AND MUTILATING THREE EIGHT YEAR OLD CUB SCOUTS IN WEST MEMPHIS, ARKANSAS IN 1993.POLICE AND PROSECUTORS AT THE TIME CALLED THE KILLINGS PART OF A SATANIC RITUAL LED BY ECHOLS...WHO WAS PUT ON DEATH ROW.....AND MEEKLY FOLLOWED BY BALDWIN AND MISSELLEY WHO RECEIVED LIFE SENTENCES.BUT DOCUMENTARIES OVER THE TWO DECADES DESCRIBED THREE NOT AS MURDERERS..BUT AS MISFITS. CELEBRITIES LIKE ACTOR JOHNNY DEPP TOOK UP THEIR CAUSE.. ...AS WELL AS EDDIE VEDDER OF PEARL JAM AND NATALIE MAINES FROM THE DIXIE CHICKS' WHO WERE IN THE COURTROOM FRIDAY IN JONESBORO.....WHEN THE THREE AGREED TO A LEGAL MANEUVER THAT LETS THEM MAINTAIN THEIR INNOCENCE WHILE ACKNOWLEDGING PROSECUTORS LIKELY HAVE ENOUGH EVIDENCE TO CONVICT THEM. IT'S NOW RECOMMENDED THAT INFANTS FACE THE BACK OF A VEHICLE -- UNTIL THE AGE OF TWO -- TO LESSEN THE IMPACT OF A CRASH.
