Please be advised that the Chele Farley for U.S. Senate campaign, under provisions of the Communication Act of 1934, Section 73.1941 [47 CFR §73.1941] is seeking equal opportunity for comparable time to that given to Senator Kirsten Gillibrand - ten minutes and four seconds - on the February 20, 2018 episode of "Late Show with Stephen Colbert."

Notice Required by Section 73.1943 of the Rules of the Federal Communications Commission: Senator Kirsten Gillibrand, a candidate for the US Senate in New York, appeared without charge on CBS's "Late Show with Stephen Colbert" for a total period of 10:04 (10 minutes and 4 seconds) commencing at 11:35PM ET on February 20, 2018 and ending at 12:30 PM ET on February 20, 2018. Station WCBS New York, NY, is affiliated with the CBS Television Network and broadcast the February 20, 2018 episode of "The Late Show with Stephen Colbert," including the segments in which Senator Gillibrand appeared in.

Federal Communications Commission regulations require station licensees that permit a "legally qualified candidate for public office . . . to use its facilities" to "afford equal opportunities to all other candidates for that office to use such facilities."

Both Senator Gillibrand and Mrs. Farley can make a "substantial showing of a bona fide candidacy" for the U.S. Senate and are therefore "legally qualified candidate[s]" for Senate in the state of New York. Accordingly, Mrs. Farley is due an equal opportunity to appear on your station.
