Community Needs & Issues

Based upon WYFF-TV's involvement in its community and input from community leaders and various organizations, WYFF-TV has determined that the following issues are the concerns of the community:

➤ **Community Relations**

This issue focuses on the people and stories that make an impact in the community. They may not always be newsmakers but what they have done in our community is a story worth telling. We also look at communities and neighborhoods as a whole and provide the citizens with relevant information about the area they live in. Also talks about upcoming local events and local politics. This section also looks at national stories that affect citizens locally.

➤ **Crime / Crime Prevention**

Issues surrounding crime and crime prevention are an important part of keeping the public informed. Public safety is a key focus of this issue and WYFF 4.

➤ **Economy/Consumer News**

We provide information on the state of the economy to the public. Also we provide helpful tips on money management, employment and other economic issues that affect our citizens. This area also looks at the quality and performance of products and services for consumers.

➤ **Education & Children's Issues**

Funding, school safety, and quality of education are all issues of public concern. We take a look at education on all levels, public and private. Also looks at issues that affect children and youth related stories.

➤ **Environment & Severe Weather**

Environmental issues such as pollution, land use and other environmental factors that have real impacts on the way citizens live in our community. Information on severe weather can impact the safety of our citizens and our local property. Also included are national environmental and weather stories that impact viewers.

➤ **Health Issues & Personal Safety**

A look at new treatments for diseases and illnesses, groups helping individuals to cope with medical problems and issues facing health institutions in our area. Also a look at how citizens can keep themselves and their children out of harms way. This section includes national and local stories about personal health, healthy living, personal safety and health institutions.

➤ **Travel | Traffic Safety**

With road construction prevalent across the market, we keep viewers up-to-date on the latest in road closings, detours, etc. We also look safety issues that face drivers as they travel across the area. This section includes all local and national traffic issues that are relevant to local travelers.

➤ **Government/Political**

WYFF 4 provides information on decisions made by local, state, and federal government. We cover stories that explain how taxpayer money is spent. We check on how our legislators vote and provide information on the impact of bills being considered. We are also committed to extensive coverage of elections and informing voters of political candidate's platforms.

➤ **Social Media/ Technology**

Our stories explain technology and incorporate information started and shared on social media. We monitor trending stories in the digital world and explain the local impact of viral social media stories. Often, we help viewers understand which stories on social media are factually accurate and which ones are not.

➤ **Substance Abuse/Opioid Addiction**

WYFF 4 explores the growing problem of opioid addiction in the Upstate and the surrounding area. We are diligently working with law enforcement agencies, medical and psychological groups and our viewers of the need for rehab, new laws and education to counter this ever-growing national epidemic.

➤ **Project CommUNITY**

WYFF 4 and Hearst Television has launched a year-long 2023 initiative to investigate, chronicle and study undertakings across the country focused on uniting people within their communities. In today's divisive climate, Project CommUNITY will move critical conversations forward and shine a light on the positive efforts bringing neighbors together.
