

## **KCDV-FM, CORDOVA, ALASKA - ISSUES AND PROGRAMS LIST**

**1ST QUARTER, 2023 - January 1 to March 31**

### **I. NEWS:**

National - our affiliation with The Associated Press and the USA Radio Network provides live updates in times of crisis, cutting away to personnel on the scene.

### **II. COMMUNITY:**

Community Calendar - 3 minute program that airs 4 times per day, and includes community events and announcements, breakfast and lunch menus from the school and senior meal programs, and announcements of birthdays and anniversaries from the school music program calendar.

Classifieds - A goods and services buy/sell feature. Airls 4 times per day.

Local Weather - Hourly broadcasts of local weather conditions and forecasts

Fish Radio -- weekdays, 10:10 a.m. -- a news report on the Alaska state fishing industry.

**ISSUE OF NOTE THIS QUARTER:** 3/24 & 25 - "ALFA CREW TRAINING PROGRAM" - We did a 2-day series on this program which pairs skippers with young people interested in commercial fishing careers. This is an important effort, as the commercial fishing fleets are beginning to age out (avg = 50+)

**ISSUE OF NOTE THIS QUARTER:** 2/16 & 17 - "Alaska Department of Fish and Game's Alaska Bycatch Review Task Force recommendations" - Bycatch has been an intense issue of late, given closure of salmon and crab fisheries which may be due in part to incidental take. Our reports detailed the governor's Bycatch Review Task Force recommendations on how

to manage bycatch to the North Pacific Fishery Management Council so that our fisherman could be aware and prepared to offer input and comment in later phases of the process.

**ISSUE OF NOTE THIS QUARTER:** 1/17 & 18 – “Electronic monitoring technologies in Alaska pollock fisheries” – this series explored the proposal to replace human monitors on boats with technology. Proponents point to the scarcity of human monitors available, the dangers to monitors, and the current lack of good data. Opponents feel that the tech is intimidating and a privacy violation given its 24/7 operation.

Into Tomorrow -- weekdays, 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. -- a 90 second vignette on the latest in consumer technology.

### III. RELIGION:

IV. Emergency Services: Full participation in the EAS system at National, State, and Local levels -- with immediate relay (no delay to accommodate programming) of all Emergency Alerts, all National Alerts, all Amber Alerts, all Required Monthly Tests, and all locally originated Weekly Tests.

\*\*\* Note \*\*\* -- While KCDV is unable to carry the volume of special public interest programming that is offered on our sister station (KLAM), KCDV heavily promotes all of KLAM's special programming and encourages the audience to use both stations equally for a balance of entertainment and information.

In particular, we strongly and frequently promote KLAM'S "Town Meeting" talk show – not only mentioning extensively when the program airs and what the subject matter is, but also emphasizing that all talk shows are posted to our Youtube channel ([youtube.com/cordovatv](https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCQdovAtv)) for delayed listening on virtually every device.

**ISSUE OF NOTE THIS QUARTER:** 3/19 – “ESCAPE OF ANDREW JOHNSON” – Cordova Police Department informed us that Andrew Johnson instigated an extremely violent attack resulting in severe injury to one of their officers, and escaped custody. He was at large, considered extremely dangerous, agitated, volatile, and armed. The community should be on high alert. At CPD’s request, we ran about 6 announcements per hour every hour till he was finally apprehended, telling citizens to secure vehicles, doors, cars, boats, and anything that could provide shelter or further escape. Residents we told to be hyper-alert and aware, use EXTREME caution, do not confront, Call 911 immediately.
