NWS forecasters called for southeast winds 35-45 mph with gusts up to 80 mph, stating the high wind warning will be in effect until 10 a.m. today. Waves around 30 feet are expected with the potential for low-lying areas such, including U.S. 101 near South Beach to flood. The coastal flood warning will be in effect from 8 a.m.-11 a.m. Thursday and the high surf warning will be in effect from 3 a.m. Thursday to 6 a.m. Friday. The landslide beneath the highway prompted the Curry County Board of Commissioners to declare a local emergency and activate their emergency operations center. Commissioner Brad Alcorn said he received a call from Emergency Management Director Monica Ward that the slide had occurred. He said that officials had been concerned about that stretch of road for a few days before the slide.^[1]^[SEP] Cal-Ore Lifeflight has air support needed to help patients access medical services, Alcorn said. Geotechnical engineers are evaluating the scene and watching for additional movement. There is currently no estimate for when the highway will reopen and no local detour for that stretch of U.S. 101.^[1]^[SEP] ODOT states that its crews first noticed landslide activity on Jan. 2 when cracks formed in the pavement.
