KWQR Website	February 2023	Vaccine Survey	<p>The Vaccine Opinion Survey was conducted from October – December 2022 and was designed to collect information from adults in Cochise County regarding their opinions on vaccines and vaccination.</p> <p>Overall, the survey received 143 responses and the qualitative and quantitative results from this survey helped paint a nuanced picture of vaccine opinions among Cochise County residents. There are individuals who are not vaccinated and do not wish to be vaccinated, and there are many more who have received a vaccine or who have some reservations about vaccination that could potentially be addressed with time or improved messaging.</p> <p>One of the questions we asked was about holding drive-through influenza vaccination events. Of those who had been vaccinated against COVID-19, 63% said they would be interested in this type of event for their annual flu shot. CCHSS plans to conduct a pilot drive-through event for flu shots this spring because we now know it is never too late to be vaccinated for influenza.</p>

Cochise County libraries join more than 120 other libraries across Arizona that participate in the Culture Pass program.</p> <p>"We are very excited to bring Culture Passes to Cochise County," said County Librarian Amadee Ricketts. 			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Passes must be checked out in person at the library.</li> <li>• Patrons are limited to one pass per family or individual at a time, up to two passes per month.</li> <li>• Passes are valid for seven days from the checkout date.</li> <li>• Passes are not renewable and cannot be requested in advance.</li> </ul> <p>If you would like to check availability before heading to your library, you can view the library catalog <a href="#">online</a>.</p> <p>When you have checked out your pass, it is highly encouraged to contact the venue ahead of time for current hours and policies. KWQR webby	March 29, 2023	SSA	<p>On National Slam the Scam Day and throughout the year, we give you the tools to recognize Social Security-related scams and stop scammers from stealing your money and personal information. Share scam information with your loved ones. Slam the Scam!</p> <p><b>Recognize the four basic signs of a scam:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Scammers <b>pretend</b> to be from a familiar organization or agency, like the Social Security Administration. They may email attachments with official-looking logos, seals, signatures, or pictures of employee credentials.</li> <li>2. Scammers mention a <b>problem</b> or a prize. They may say your Social Security number was involved in a crime or ask for personal information to process a benefit increase.</li> <li>3. Scammers <b>pressure</b> you to act immediately. They may threaten you with arrest or legal action.</li> </ol>

			<p>4. Scammers tell you to <b>pay</b> using a gift card, prepaid debit card, cryptocurrency, wire or money transfer, or by mailing cash. They may also tell you to transfer your money to a “safe” account.</p> <p>Ignore scammers and report criminal behavior. Report Social Security-related scams to the SSA Office of the Inspector General (OIG).</p>
