HCS report on bullying cases in 2021 and 2022 have jumped by over 40% compared to before the pandemic.

Sheriff Austin Garrett says the suspect Damean Jones got out o his car and pointed a weapon at law enforcement prior to the shootout. The three deputies are Detective Jeremy Vandergriff, who Garrett says was the deputy Jones shot, Corporal Chris Walker and Civil Process Server Jason Cooper. CPD says the two officers who opened fire are officer Ryan Blevin and Investigator Brian McClard. All those involved people are on leave with pay. Damean Jones died in the shootout.

PCD says they were responding to a shots fired call near the home, stopped three suspects and learned the suspect with the warrants was inside. CPD says the suspect was known to be armed in the past so they took precautions to negotiate him coming out. Officials tell us the suspect is a minor so they will not be releasing his name.

A short time later, police were notified of a second victim who was dropped off at a local hospital by vehicle matching the stolen vehicle. Both victims have non-life threatening injuries. The investigation is ongoing.

In the lawsuit, Ervin Moore claims other inmates hurt him when he was placed in the wrong compound. It also says the his room had multiple issues including mold that aggravated his asthma. This follows several lawsuits involving Silverdale that cite violent incidents we've covered in the past. Moore is suing for damages in multiple categories that will all be determined at a trial.

He walked out of jail on December 22nd. Online records show he was booked again on January 13th. The Tennessee Department of Corrections tells us they are digging deeper into what happened.
