CRIME

NEWS 07/03/2023 A fight at the Coxsackie Correctional Facility has left a Sargent and a Corrections Officer out of service, due to injury and several staff members injured as well. The Correctional facility is saying Thursday an inmate tried to stab another. NYSCOBPA says staff later found the weapon to be a sharpened toothbrush. In the process of trying to stop the stabbing the Sargent was stabbed in the wrist. After initially being restrained, and in the process of being transferred to another correctional facility, he punched and kicked staff members. Between the two incidents, nine staffers were injured and one officer was taken to the hospital.

07/05/2023 In Queensbury, two men are under arrest for an armed robbery at the Speedway on Aviation Road yesterday morning. Troopers say Justin Cabral had a knife and demanded money from a clerk. He took off in a car that was driven by Garrett Murray. Both men were taken into custody a short time later.

07/06/2023 A man is behind bars accused of stabbing a Police canine 12 times. Canine Norby is expected to make a full recovery and will return to active after rehab. Troy Police say Norby responded to the Emerald Greens neighborhood with officers around 4am yesterday for reports of a man trying to break into several homes. Norby tracked him, leading officers to a wooded area where Police say the suspect stabbed the canine. That suspect, Curtis Knockwood, was arraigned yesterday facing attempted burglary, assault and aggravated cruelty to an animal charges.

07/06/2023 A man from Schaghticoke is facing charges, accused of drugging a pregnant woman to trigger a miscarriage. According to the Rensselaer County Sheriff's Office Dia Beshara gave her the abortion pill mifepristone without her knowledge. He's charged with 2nd degree assault and has been arraigned and released. An order of protection is in place on behalf of the victim.

07/18/2023 The manager of a construction materials company in Grafton is facing a criminal charge in connection with the death of one of his employees. The Rensselaer County D.A.'s Office says 44 year old Anthony Valente has been indicted on a count of 2nd degree manslaughter. Prosecutors say he was operating a crane at the RJ Valente Gravel Quarry last October when a cable broke and dropped a 285 pound cast iron ball on 35 year old Darren Miller of Poestenkill, who later died from his injuries.

07/20/2023 Rotterdam Police are now charging a suspect in connection to the double homicide earlier this month that happened in a home on Fern Avenue. The adult son of one of the victims is facing a fugitive from justice warrant for first degree murder. Anthony Lewis is currently in custody in Pennsylvania on unrelated charges. They say he's been there behind bars since July 7th which was the same day the murder victims Lewis's 65 year old mother and 73 year old step-father were discovered.

07/24/2023 Former cult founder and leader Keith Raniere is asking for a re-trial, but a US Attorney is asking the court to shut down the motion. Raniere claims the Government manufactured child pornography and planted it on his computer. The US Attorney for the Eastern District of New York is asking the court to deny his bid, saying the motion is untimely and meritless. Raniere was sentenced to 120 years in prison in 2020 for his crimes, including, sex trafficking.

07/25/2023 A Troy man has been arrested accused of driving a stolen vehicle and possessing a ghost gun, which is an untraceable weapon assembled at home. Police say they pulled over Nazir Joseph on Friday night near 10th and Middleburgh Streets. The vehicle had earlier been reported stolen in Albany. As they were talking to Joseph they say they found the gun in his waistband. Joseph faces two felony charges.

07/28/2023 The Albany County District Attorney is once again calling for changes to the Raise the Age Law. D.A. David Soares is pushing to make those changes following new numbers on violence here in the capital city. His office says that there are 12 teens who have committed violent felonies in the past that are being re-arrested including 4 in just the last couple of months.

07/31/2023 Governor Kathy Hochul says that the number of shootings are down in the state's largest cities. She says shootings are down 28 percent in 20 cities where extra resources have been made available. According to state data, New York State Police seized 735 guns in the first 6 months of 2023. That's a 6 percent increase over this time last year.

08/14/2023 State Police have made an arrest connected to a homicide in Indian Lake over the weekend. They say a little after 8 o'clock Saturday night they responded to a shooting on Big Brook Road. There they found 32 year old David Shaneer dead. Police have arrested Ann Favro for 2nd degree murder. She remains in jail without bail and the investigation remains ongoing.

08/15/2023 A man faces several charges after Police say he crashed into a Schenectady liquor store with a rented vehicle. They say Karem Lulu pulled out into the street, allegedly not paying attention, causing him to T-bone another vehicle. They say he hit the vehicle a second time before fleeing the scene. As he was speeding away, that's when he crashed into the store then took off on foot before being caught by the Police. Lulu faces several charges including resisting arrest.

08/15/2023 A man charged with the murder of his wife in Montgomery County, pleading guilty to manslaughter yesterday. Michael Darling will face 17 years behind bars following the plea deal, when he's sentenced in October. His wife Christine was found shot to death in their home in 2019, when prosecutors say Darling reported the death as a suicide in Fort Johnson. It's not Darling's first run-in with the law. In 2021, he pleaded guilty to possessing 6 pipe bombs.

08/15/2023 Three men convicted of kidnapping and beating a man, all captured on Snapchat videos have now been sentenced. Duane Henderson and Danny Harrell will spend 25 years each in prison, Diego Harrell will spend 10 years behind bars. Prosecutors say in 2021, the three men kidnapped a man from Schenectady, allegedly for stealing drugs from Henderson and then took that victim to a home on Albany Street, holding him hostage for 22 hours, beating him and encouraging a dog to bite him several times.

08/16/2023 A man from Troy has been arrested and charged after a string of suspicious fires in a Lansingburgh neighborhood the past few weeks. Police say George Leque, also known as George Brundige, has been identified as a suspect in the fires, thanks to surveillance video. He's accused of intentionally setting several vehicles on fire and is also a suspect in some thefts from parked cars.

08/21/2023 Two people are in the hospital and a suspect is in custody after a standoff in Guilderland. According to Guilderland Police, they got reports of a stabbing around 10 o'clock yesterday morning at the Brandywine Parkway Complex. Upon arriving, they found a 13 year old and a 52 year old with stab wounds. The victims were transported to Albany Medical Center. They discovered the suspect, 26 year old Kahylee Hackworth. Officers engaged in a five hour standoff with Hackworth, eventually leading to the arrest.

08/25/2023 A 16 year old is being charged as an adult in connection to a deadly shooting in Troy. Prosecutors accuse the teen of killing Alexander Crawford, who was shot in front of the Family Dollar back in July. Despite the adult charges, the minor's name is not being released at this time, but they are in custody.

08/31/2023 A Moreau man pleads guilty in connection with a Queensbury Walmart parking lot shooting that sent a victim to a hospital last November. Adrian Semental pleaded guilty to felony assault and weapon's charges. Prosecutors say he shot at the victim during a dispute after he followed that person into the parking lot because of a road rage incident nearby. Simental is expected to spend up to 12 years in prison when he is sentenced next month.

09/06/2023 A man from Fulton County has been arrested on ten weapon and motor vehicle related charges, including possession of a ghost gun. Montgomery County Sheriff's say Justin Staufenburg was allegedly driving under the influence of a drug Monday in Hagaman. A search of his vehicle uncovering a loaded gun where the serial number had intentionally been removed. Staufenburg also did not have a pistol permit.

09/07/2023 A second suspect has been indicted in connection with the deadly shooting in Cohoes last month. Twenty-five year old Nalik Seely from South Carolina is charged with second degree murder, among other charges. The other suspect Dontie Mitchell was indicted last month. Both are charged in connection with the shooting of 27 year old Shieer Leggett.

09/08/2023 A man is charged after a shooting in Albany last week. Officers responded to the 200 block of Second Street and found a 38 year old man with gunshot wounds. An investigation identified Michael Johnson as the suspect. He now faces an attempted murder and gun charge.

09/08/2023 An Albany man pleads not guilty after Police say he threw a brick at the front door of Albany's South Station. Last month the glass on the door was left cracked and Police say three vehicles were also damaged. LaQuan Brown was put in handcuffs outside the station. Police at the time said that they were already familiar with Brown and that he has a history of mental health issues. Brown pleaded not guilty yesterday to four counts of criminal mischief and was released.

09/12/2023 A Niskayuna man is facing charges in connection to a cold case murder in Virginia from nearly 30 years ago.Investigators from Fairfax County Virginia say DNA evidence links 51 year old Stephen Smerck to the murder of Robin Lawrence in 1994. Detectives came to Niskayuna to question Smerck. He turned himself in for the murder, just hours after speaking with those detectives. Smerck is currently being held as a fugitive here in New York and will be extradited to Virginia in the coming days.

09/13/2023 An undocumented immigrant has been charged for murdering a man from Troy. Carlos Corales-Ramirez is accused of stabbing and killing Hario Hernandez-Sanchez, back on September 2nd in the city of Troy. Authorities say Coralles-Sanchez was in the country illegally. He was also arrested in Maryland for a stabbing at a 7-11 in February.

09/14/2023 Two men are facing time in prison for killing a 21 year old man in his Richmondville home last year. The Schoharie County D.A.s office says Devon Hunter and Jeffrey McGoff pleaded guilty last week to manslaughter and robbery charges. The two shot and killed 21 year old Connor Delaney at his home on Height Road last year. A dog was also killed. Both men are scheduled to be sentenced in November.

09/18/2023 Bennington Vermont Police have tracked down and finally captured fugitive Zachary Dumas, after being on the run for almost ten days. He's been accused of attempted murder, assault and robbery. According to the Bennington Banner, Police were able to capture Dumas around 8 o'clock last night after an hour-long standoff outside of a home on Division Place.

09/20/2023 In Fort Ann a 17 year old is being charged as an adult in the shooting that left a 14 year old boy dead. The shooting happened earlier last month. According to court documents the judge determined the teen should be charged as an adult, based on witness accounts of the incident.

09/21/2023 A Judge has dismissed the indictment against a Vermont Sheriff's Deputy charged in that officer involved shooting in Saratoga Springs last November. The D.A. 's Office had charged Vito Castlenova with attempted murder and assault. His Attorneys filed a motion to dismiss the case claiming the Prosecution failed to instruct the Grand Jury properly and while Judge James Murphy agreed with a lot of what they had to say, the Judge in his decision said there was inadmissible hearsay and speculative testimony in that Grand Jury proceeding.

09/25/2023 Governor Kathy Hochul signing new legislation aimed at cracking down on Telemarketers. The new fine raises it from \$11,000 to \$20,000, targeting those numbers that are called from the National DO NOT CALL list and the legislation had bi-partisan support. You can file a claim on the DO NOT CALL registry's website.

09/26/2023 A Troy man is facing charges after Police say he set fire inside his own home. 66 year Blaze Lanni is facing arson charges, no injuries were reported. The fire chief said it was a difficult fire to fight, but eventually his crew was able to get things under control.

NEWS 07/05/2023 One local organization is making sure no one missed out on Independence Day celebrations yesterday. The Capital City Rescue Mission in Albany hosted a 4th of July picnic lunch and it's not just on the 4th that they serve up this food. The organization provides 3 hot meals per day, Monday through Saturday to people in need. Fireworks at the Empire State Plaza were postponed last night after storms moved through the area. Fireworks will take place tonight at 9pm.

07/24/2023 Iron Works Restaurant in Troy donated 70 meals to displaced Harbour Point Gardens Apartment residents, after they were forced out due to safety concerns. The restaurant says they were inspired to help out after learning that the residents had no steady source of food or kitchens to cook for themselves.

07/27/2023 The community came out yesterday to support keeping the Burdett Birth Center at Samaritan Hospital in Troy open. Last month, St. Peter's Health Partners announced it had plans to shut down the center. People yesterday held signs and even brought their families to the event that was hosted by the Save the Burdett Birth Center Coalition. Back in June St. Peter's Health Partners said it submitted a plan to the State Department of Health to close down the center. If approved it's said that the unit will close within 4 to 6 months. There's still no word yet on whether the Department of Health has approved the plan.

07/31/2023 Girls Inc. of the Greater Capital Region hosted its 2nd annual Teen Con at U-Albany over the weekend. The two-day event connected girls with women from diverse industries, teaching them about the various educational and employment opportunities available to them after High School.

08/01/2023 The Mohawk Hudson Humane Society and Troy Animal Control are working to save dozens of cats found inside a home in Troy. Officials call it one of the worst scenes they've ever laid eyes on. So far they've been able to trap and rescue 18 cats from the home. They're now safe and recovering at the Mohawk Hudson Humane Society. The Humane Society says they'll be at the house over the next couple of days working to catch all of the cats in humane traps. Many of the them were still hiding in the ceilings, walls and under furniture. Two cats have been found dead and officials expect more remains to be found.

08/01/2023 A new program called Project Rise is helping grassroots community organizations here in Albany and across the state to prevent gun violence. Created after the pandemic emergency here to help prevent gun violence in 7 major New York cities including Albany, with the state allocating 2 million dollars in funding for each city to go towards this effort.

08/04/2023 The Columbia Greene Humane Society is announcing that all pet adoption fees will be waived in August. This is all because of a gift from an anonymous donor and the donor is sponsoring all of these adoption fees for cats, dogs, rabbits and even Guinea pigs. Officials say the goal for this month is to completely empty the shelter.

08/08/2023 The Red Cross is allowing more gay and bi-sexual men to donate blood now under new guidelines. Back in May, the FDA dropped a nearly 40 year rule barring that group from giving blood over concerns about HIV-AIDS. The expanded eligibility comes as the U.S. still faces a shortage of blood, especially during the summer months.

08/15/2023 The Mohawk Hudson Humane Society is calling on community members to adopt a pet or to foster one if they're able. The Humane Society says they are at capacity when it comes to dogs in their care and they're close to that number with cats as well.

08/17/2023 A Who's who of the racing world was out in force yesterday at Saratoga National to support workers on the Saratoga Race Course backstretch. The annual New York Racing Chaplaincy fundraising brunch brought out everyone from NYRA Board members to owners, trainers and hall of fame jockeys. The money raised will help a variety of chaplaincy programs from food pantries to counseling services to summer enrichment programs for kids.

09/05/2023 A local organization holding a fundraiser for mental health in schools later this month.

The Capital Region Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention is hosting its Out of the Darkness Capital Region
Walk for Rita on September 24th at the Saratoga Spa State Park. For more information go to AFSP dot org.

NEWS 07/06/2023 State leaders working to fix the workers shortage here in New York. Two and a half million dollars being allocated in the state budget to waive the cost of civil service exam fees, which typically cost between \$25 and \$45 dollars.

07/18/2023 The replacement of the old Beech Nut Baby Food Factory in Canajoharie now heading into its next phase. Officials say the construction contracts have been written up to demolish the factory and funding has also been secured for its proposed replacement. Renderings featuring a 27 acre site, with a park and a community space at the center.

07/18/2023 The Capital Region Aquatic Center is going to be located in the Via Port Mall in Rotterdam. It's a brand new 40 million dollar center that's been proposed to offer a variety of water related activities, including aquatic therapy and swimming lessons. Organizers and the President of the organization hopes to have it open by early 2024.

07/20/2023 Two new Chik-fil-A Restaurants are opening today, one in Clifton Park and the other in North Greenbush. They are the first stand-alone Chik-fil-A locations in our area. Both are set to open up this morning and will be open Mondays through Saturdays from 6:30 in the morning until 10 o'clock at night. The stores will be closed on Sunday.

07/20/2023 More funding is on the way for Vermont after historic flooding last week. The President increasing the federal cost share for their emergency aid from 75 percent to 100 percent. That frees up more money for cleanup and recovery for homes and businesses.

07/20/2023 Construction continues on the new Hatties Chicken Restaurant in Albany, located in the old Lombardo's Restaurant, downtown, on Madison Avenue. The popular spot also has locations in Wilton, at the Saratoga Race Track and in downtown Saratoga Springs. No word yet on its opening date.

07/24/2023 Starting today Amtrak says services from the Adirondack line will resume back into Albany and Saratoga Springs, but service to Montreal remains suspended until mid-September. The partial restoration of the service comes after Amtrak was forced to cancel services north of Rensselaer earlier this summer due to high temperatures in Canada. NY Assemblyman Angelo Santabarbra sent another letter to Amtak's CEO saying this recent call to action falls short and hopes to see the trains operate at least to Plattsburgh.

07/26/2023 Small businesses are still feeling the impact of the covid-19 shutdown on their finances. New York State continues to charge them an additional annual fee to help pay back the billions of dollars of debt the State racked up in unemployment benefits during the pandemic. The business community is outraged, calling on the Governor to use federal pandemic relief funds to pay back the billions of dollars that the state owes the federal government.

07/27/2023 The City of Rensselaer is losing its only big grocery store. Aldi's will be closing and moving to a new location in North Greenbush, but city leaders say it could create a food desert there in the city of Rensselaer and they're now working with the county and CDTA to expand options for transportation and bring another grocery store to the area.

08/02/2023 New York is the second most expensive state in which to be a homeowner in, according to U.S. census data. Governor Kathy Hochul spent yesterday in Amsterdam addressing this housing crisis while attending the opening of the new Amsterdam Apartments, a recently renovated affordable senior housing development. She's pushing to strengthen the supply of housing or apartments available, which she hopes to address the unaffordability of housing. Most recently she announced Executive actions, including funding pro-housing communities and reviewing state owned sites to be looked at for more units. Now the Governor is announcing even more opportunities with 406 million dollars in bonds and subsidies that will also help new construction of nearly 800 units across New York.

08/03/2023 Hospitals here in upstate New York will soon see a major financial boost. One billion dollars in federal funding will go toward hospitals all across the state. The capital Region will see 192 million dollars distributed between 8 hospitals in our area and the money can be used by these hospitals as they see fit. Federal leaders believe it will provide solutions when it comes to the healthcare worker's shortage.

08/03/2023 Business owners in Albany can once again apply for federal covid relief funds after city leaders opened the second round of applications. Many local business owners benefited from American Rescue Plan money the first time around.

08/08/2023 A New York State Supreme Court Judge putting new cannabis shops temporarily on hold. According to Politico, that ruling came down just yesterday. It's being sought by a group of people who want to open marijuana businesses, but have not been able to apply for licenses. Under state policy applications are restricted to people who were directly harmed by the drug's prior criminalization. In the lawsuit the coalition claims this policy is restrictive and unfair. The decision is only temporary, as this case continues to move forward.

08/09/2023 New York State is about to raise taxes on cigarettes. A single pack will now cost a dollar more in taxes beginning September 1st. Those taxes will now be \$5.35 per pack. Most of that money, about % of it goes toward health care costs here in New York State.

08/11/2023 Sixty million dollars is coming to Albany International Airport for a major transformation. Governor Kathy Hochul says this transformation won't only consist of how the airport looks, but also the process of traveling in and out of the airport. The money will expand the security area, create a children's play zone, add more waiting areas and concession stands.

08/11/2023 Cannabis growers now have a chance to sell their goods to customers in the state's first cannabis growers showcase held in New Paltz. The event provides a unique opportunity for buyers and sellers to interact in an outdoor space. The event will be held weekly every Thursday through Saturday.

08/11/2023 Starting today, eligible homeowners impacted by the recent historic flooding will be allowed to apply for emergency assistance in repairing their homes. Earlier this week, Governor Kathy Hochul added three million dollars on top of the three million dollars initially pledged last month. These funds are for homeowners in 8 counties in the Hudson Valley, North Country and Finger Lakes. Grants of up to \$50,000 will be awarded based on the scope of work and applicants must have incomes at or below 80 percent of the area's median income.

08/18/2023 A new business opportunity has struggling marijuana growers coming together to participate in the state's cannabis growers showcase initiative. Columbia County is welcoming them to the county's first pop-up cannabis farmer's market at Empire Farms. It's a women owned and led operation. Last month, the state's cannabis control board approved a measure to allow farmers to sell stockpiled crops at community events. The move provides much needed financial relief to those in the industry impacted by the state's slow roll out. This growers showcase will happen every Thursday through Saturday for those 21 and over from 12 to 8 for the rest of the year.

08/21/2023 A State Judge has upheld a ruling saying that state regulators cannot approve any new retail cannabis applications. The case focuses on the CARD Program that allows people with prior marijuana convictions to get first priority for licenses. A group of 4 military veterans filed a lawsuit against the program claiming it kept them unfairly out of the industry.

08/23/2023 The proposed Costco in Guilderland is one step closer to finally breaking ground. The Town's Industrial Development Agency approved several tax breaks totaling over 40 million dollars. The controversial tax breaks have been protested by community members who felt that the developer of the project should not be able to obtain it.

09/01/2023 Starting today, New Yorkers will see a one dollar increase in the state's cigarette tax. The one dollar hike, the first increase for that tax since 2010, bringing it from \$4.35 to \$5.35 per pack. That one dollar bump now makes New York's cigarette tax the highest in the country.

09/01/2023 Starting today and affecting many students, interest will once again start accumulating on federal student loans. It comes after three years of zero interest and deferred payments. Borrowers don't have to start making payments again until October 1st, but you can make a payment earlier.

09/11/2023 UBER is now offering rides for teenagers in the capital region. Parents and guardians can use their own account to invite their teen to set-up a profile. They can start requesting rides on their own. The company says only the most experienced, highest rated drivers are allowed to take teen riders. Lots of safety protocols are in place.

09/15/2023 State Lawmakers in both parties are asking Governor Kathy Hochul to sign a bill to help cannabis growers sell their product. New York State has only 23 licensed dispensaries at the moment. Officials say it's a big problem for growers who have more product than they can sell. Now a bill that passed in both the State Senate and Assembly is coming up with a possible solution. It would allow farmers to sell tested, packaged and sealed cannabis to tribal nations.

09/19/2023 The New York State Thruway Authority has approved an increase to toll rates that will start in January. E-Z Pass users will pay 5 percent more than they do now. The second rate hike, another five percent, will come in 2027. Rates for non E-Z Pass users will go up much more. The Thruway Authority said if it doesn't increase rates it'll be coming up millions of dollars short starting in 2024 and they need that money to fix or replace at least 85 bridges over the next decade.

09/21/2023 Leaders in Albany are proposing changes to the city's rules for cannabis distribution and consumption. One of the new proposals would ban cannabis dispensaries from opening before 8 in the morning or after 10 o'clock at night. Existing regulations require them to be at least 1,000 feet from certain buildings like a Church or a school.

09/27/2023 Military families in New York State who receive federal assistance for childcare will soon have more providers to choose from. Fifteen thousand state accredited child care providers in New York will now be eligible for the federal military fee assistance program.

09/27/2023 City leaders in Schenectady are rolling out a new plan to revitalize the vacant casino building in Central Park. They got \$500,000 from the state to turn the 80 year old building into an environmental education center.

NEWS 07/04/2023 A health alert this morning. Schenectady Police are warning the public after the City sees four suspected overdose deaths over the course of three days. While Police say toxicology reports are still pending, the signs are there. An investigation is underway right now. Detectives are trying to learn more about the suspected overdoses to pursue criminal charges against whomever might have supplied the drugs.

07/17/2023 Another air quality alert has been issued across the state today, including the capital region, due to the ongoing wildfires in Canada. This advisory is set to be in effect until midnight tonight. State officials say the air quality will likely be unhealthy for sensitive groups and those groups should be cautious when outside.

07/19/2023 Heavy and intense rainfall last night led to flooding in some areas, including on Western Avenue near Stuyvesant Plaza in Guilderland. The intersection of Fuller Road and Western Avenue were shut down in all directions as more than 3 inches of rain fell in less than two hours. Governor Kathy Hochul is seeking a federal disaster declaration for the recent flooding in New York State, particularly in Orange County.

08/02/2023 A new bill being introduced in the state legislature would ban the practice of killing wildlife for cash prizes across New York State. Advocates of the bill claim that many events are advertised in secrecy, using chatrooms and social media to get the word out. However, opponents say the bill has many misconceptions when it comes to those contests and competitions.

08/14/2023 The Department of Environmental Conservation is accepting comments from the public on what to do with the Dunn Landfill in Rensselaer, which has been operating without valid permits since 2022, after officials in Renssealer discovered the presence of PFAS chemicals those forever chemicals, in the groundwater around the landfill back in 2020.

08/29/2023 A new strain of COVID-19 is behind rising cases of the virus across the country. The Albany County Department of Health says the uptick locally was expected amid this new variant, along with the fall season approaching when more respiratory diseases tend to increase. They're recommending everybody consider getting another booster shot to protect themselves.

08/30/2023 More homes are testing positive for lead in the water in the City of Troy. City officials say 60 more homes and buildings tested positive for it. They say the source of the city's water is lead free, but the problem is old lead service lines and lead plumbing inside the homes. The city continues to try and remove all those service lines.

09/06/2023 Governor Kathy Hochul is announcing the state is making covid-19 rapid testing kits and masks readily available for school districts by request. In a statement released yesterday, Hochul says frequent testing is still important in preventing an outbreak. This comes as new reports say a new covid-19 variant is causing a rise in cases and hospitalizations this summer.

09/26/2023 A new audit by the State Comptroller's office finds the Department of Environmental Conservations is not doing enough to monitor air pollution. They found that more than half of the state's nearly 9,000 facilities may not be in compliance with pollution requirements, recommending the DEC improve its monitoring and oversight.

09/28/2023 Glenville town leaders are seeking damages from two big companies who manufactured products using PFOAs after those forever chemicals, as they are known, were found in the water supply. They're seeking damages from 3M and Dupont stemming from claims that chemicals from firefighting foam they manufactured seeped into the town's water supply. The town is investing more than 5 million dollars in its water plant to try and remove those chemicals.

NEWS 07/17/2023 A local UPS workers Union is holding a practice strike in Latham. Employees calling for better working conditions, like air conditioned trucks and better pay for part time workers. The UPS Teamsters contract expires July 31st and if a deal is not reached by then, hundreds of thousands of UPS workers across the country are expected to go on strike in August.

07/19/2023 The Transportation Department at Shenendehowa Central School District is feeling strained due to staffing shortages and as a result, they have not been able to help out with town summer camps and field trips as they usually do.

07/21/2023 A major manufacturer is pulling out of the capital region. Paper goods company Etsity has ceased operations in South Glens Falls immediately. Its facilities in Greenwich and Saratoga Springs will be the next to go. In a statement, the company says this is no reflection on the skills of local employees. Ultimately 300 people will lose their jobs.

08/03/2023 The influx of asylum seekers arriving in the capital region is leading to growing concerns over how it could cause severe financial and staffing issues for local school districts this fall. According to New York City Mayor Eric Adams 93,000 asylum seekers have arrived in the Empire State since the spring of last year. State officials say that around 70 migrant children are in Schenectady County ahead of the upcoming school year and many state leaders are calling for aid to affected schools.

08/07/2023 School districts across the capital region are facing the ongoing teacher shortage problem. Local school officials say they're seeing fewer people applying for open positions and they're experiencing a shortage in mental health professionals in schools as well, another big concern.

08/17/2023 The New York State Park Police are looking for its new class of officers, looking for people who love the outdoors, are willing to serve the state and work outside of that typical 9 to 5 job. You must be at least 20 years old, but no older than 35, by June of 2024. Applications are due at the end of September.

09/13/2023 State Lawmakers are eyeing the creation of a New York only work visa for migrants. This is all in an attempt to help ease the asylum seeker crisis in New York City, but this move could conflict with existing federal immigration laws, that's because federal law requires migrants to wait roughly 180 days before they can even apply for work papers. The process can then take at least another two months to complete. At least four state lawmakers have floated this new proposal. Governor Kathy Hochul says a special legislative session is on the table.

09/18/2023 A new law, now in effect in New York State, requires companies to be more upfront about wages when you apply for a job. It's called the Pay Transparency Law. Moving forward, all employers with at least 4 employees, must include a salary or a salary range for all advertised jobs and promotions.





"I want to thank my entire team, as well as the community, for the continued excitement and for helping make this possible."

The restaurants, at 304 Clifton Park Center Road and 502 North Greenbush Road, will employ approximately 200 employees and be open for dine-in, drive-thru and takeout from 6:30 a.m. to 10 p.m. Monday through Saturday. The franchise is closed on Sundays.

Will Pots, the independent franchised owner of the North Greenbush restaurant, said he is grateful for the support of the local community leading up to its opening.

"I'm honored to have been selected to open and operate one of the first free-standing restaurants in the Capital Region and look forward to introducing the Chick-fil-A brand to the community, meeting our guests on opening day and building lasting connections with our neighbors," he said.

The Chick-fil-A at Albany International Airport has been open for several years, but it is behind the security checkpoint. It's unclear when the other restaurants planned for the Capital Region will open. Last month, the New Baltimore Service Area in Hannacroix reopened to travelers after a year of renovations, but missing in its lineup of new restaurants was the popular fast-food chain.

The Atlanta-based company also wants to debut another standalone location at 579 Troy-Schenectady Road, according to planning documents filed with the town of Colonie. But plans remain in the early stages due to traffic issues, said Sean Maguire, Colonie director of planning and economic development.

To celebrate the grand openings, Chick-fil-A is donating \$50,000 to Feeding America to support hunger relief efforts of the Regional Food Bank of Northeastern New York. The restaurants will also recognize 100 local heroes making an impact in the Clifton Park and Rensselaer areas by providing them with free Chick-fil-A for a year. The locations will also participate in the Chick-fil-A Shared Table Program that redirects surplus food to local soup kitchens, shelters, food banks and nonprofits.







Local Families and Ribbon Café Team Up to Raise Money for Local seven-year-old with Brain Cancer

What: Together with local families, Ribbon Café will be putting on a Lemonade Stand, all proceeds benefiting local 7-year-old Aiden Rodriguez battling brain cancer.

The Ballston Spa Sunshine Kids are back, and this year they are shutting down part of Prospect street to host a variety of kids activities, vendors, music and more at their lemonade stand July 29th, all for a little boy who needs the community's help.

Aiden Rodriguez is a 7 year old little boy who was diagnosed on September 26, 2022 with grade 3 Choroid Plexus Carcinoma (CPC) and Li-Fraumeni Syndrome (LFS). CPC is a rare and aggressive

type of brain cancer. LFS is a rare germ line mutation of the P53 tumor suppressor gene. To date, Aiden has endured: 3 major brain surgeries, a port-a-cath placement surgery, 2 emergency exterior ventricular drain (EVD) surgeries, a procedure to harvest 20 million stem cells, 2 embolization procedures, a surgery to place two permanent brain shunts, 4 sessions of inpatient chemotherapy, and an emergency appendectomy. In addition, Aiden has suffered a stroke, and has received many blood, platelet, and coagulant transfusions. Aiden has spent countless days in the pediatric intensive care unit (PICU) and continues physical, occupational, and speech therapy on a weekly basis. Most recently, Aiden was enrolled into a clinical trial where he is subject 0; meaning he is the first and only patient in the trial. The trial consists of intra-arterial infusion of chemotherapy - which has never been done before for this type of brain cancer.

Aiden was under the care of Albany Medical Center's Department of Pediatric NeuroSurgery, Department of Pediatric Hematology and Oncology (The Melodie's Center for childhood cancers and blood disorders) and the Department of Pediatric Neurology. He is also under the care of the Department of Pediatric Hematology and Oncology at Golisano Children's Hospital in Rochester. As of May 2, 2023, Aiden is also under the care of the Department of Pediatric NeuroSurgery and the Department of Interventional Radiology at Weill Cornell and NY-Presbyterian/Columbia in NYC.

The family traveled back to NYC on June 12, 2023, where Aiden endured his 4th major brain surgery in an attempt to resect the remainder of the tumor. They were able to get all of the mass, but his struggle still continues.

After surgery, they traveled to Rochester where Aiden is undergoing high doses of chemotherapy to kill any remaining cancer/cells that may be left behind. During this treatment, Aiden's immune system will crash wherein they will transplant Aiden's own stem cells back in, bringing his immune system back up.

Normally, radiation would be used to treat this form of brain cancer however, LFS eliminates radiation as a form of treatment. The mutation exacerbates cancer and puts him at risk for various other forms of cancer. Because of this, stem cell transplants are our only other option.

Through everything, Aiden is happy, loves his brother, his papa, his granny, his aunts, his cousins, friends, and his mommy and daddy. He has missed countless days of school, loves his teachers, his bus driver and his bus aide. He is affectionate, silly, and bossy not to mention, fierce! He has given his all to fight this horrible disease and we are giving our all to fight with and for him as well as bringing awareness to others.

Aiden will be joining the events at lemonade stand, so come show your support for this strong little boy!

Who: Activities at the event will include Saratoga Children's Museum, appearances from miniature donkeys from Maple Rock Farm, baby goats, a DJ, vehicles from local fire departments and EMS stations, Ballston Area Community Center will be doing face painting, kids games, and more.







ALBANY, N.Y. (NEWS10) -The upcoming holiday season looking to be not so bright for a second year. The Albany Police Athletic League (PAL) pushing the date back of their Capital Holiday Lights Extravaganza to 2024.

Capital Region families enjoyed PAL's Capital Holiday Lights in Albany's Washington Park for decades. But the tradition that started in 1997 turned into a nightmare before Christmas in its last few years. People who lived around the park complained about the increased traffic and safety concerns.

Executive Director of PAL, Leonard Ricchiuti, and his team settled on the Altamont Fair for their new location. The area needs more work to be a winter wonderland. "We had to settle on a route. What is the infrastructure on the route? Have to try to heat buildings that have never been heated before."

If by a Christmas miracle the show was on, there would not have been anything under the trees, as sponsors and vendors needed to plan ahead. "Most of them have already committed to other shows or they just logistically can't produce enough product now at this point," explained Ricchiuti.

The police athletic league relies on funds raised from the holiday light show to provide services for Capital Region kids. This includes after school programming and summer camps. But lights out on this year's festivities does not mean all hope is lost for PAL's programs. "Last year our partners came to our aid. Helped us sustain through last year with no show. We're hoping that folks in the Capital Region are reminded of the work that we do," described Ricchiuti.
