Here follows a listing of some of the significant issues responded by Station KPYG (FM), Cayucos, KWWV (FM) and HD-1 Santa Margarita, KWWV-HD-2 Santa Margarita, and KWWV-HD-3 Santa Margarita, KXOZ (FM) Templeton, KXTZ (FM) Pismo Beach, KYNS (AM) San Luis Obispo, California, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period October 1 - December 31, 2020. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority or significance.

Brotman, executive policy adviser, legal analyst, author, says that the online work and school at home has expanded greatly due to COVID-19. He outlines the increase in digital privacy issues related to this trend and what is necessary to address this problem. He talks about privacy issues related to agreement terms, and that consumers typically ignore when installing apps or other software. Ajit Mathew George, founder of Second Chances Farms, LLC, Wilmington, DE from his organization employs only convicted felons, training them in entrepreneurship through mentorship programs and green collar jobs at hydroponic, indoor vertical farms in distressed towns. He explains through this farming experience recidivism has been reduced, developing capitalism and entrepreneur-in-residence into "Agripreneurs". He states that farms adapted rapidly to serving consumers directly when coronavirus lockdowns closed restaurants. Stephanie L. Bonne, MD, Assistant Professor of Surgery, Director of the Hospital Violence Intervention Program, Rutgers New Jersey Medical School, indicates from her study that glass top tables causes thousands of injuries yearly. As a result many surgeries and long hospital stays are required. She says the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission requires tempered glass for doors and car windshields, but it voluntary for horizontal surfaces.

Rickard, Tobacco Treatment Specialist, author, explains that 70% of smokers would like to quit, but only 4-7% will be successful. She says that smokers perceive the benefits, and why it is so hard for them to stop. She discusses the risks associated with e-cigarettes and vaping. She suggests resources that smokers can use to quit for good. Matthew Freeman, Co-Founder & Senior Executive Consultant at TMI Consulting, a diversity and inclusion management consulting firm, co-author, believes that every human is biased in one way or another, and it is a constant process to reduce this bias. He feels that bias affects every aspect of life, and how companies should address this issue in the workplace. He explains to reduce bias is to develop meaningful relationships with those who are different. Gloria Lopez-Cordle, nationally-recognized patient advocate, creator of "the Personal Medical Journal", a patient organizational tool, states from her study that American hospitals are making preventable medical errors that kill many Americans yearly. She believes that patients and their families must take charge of their medical information to prevent doctors' mistakes. She offers advice on what kinds of medical data is important and how to organize it.

He explains why the boomer generation has remained the dominant homeless population in the U.S., and what can be done about this problem. He notes that those homeless people live to 64-65 years. Christopher Ali, PhD, Associate Professor, Department of Media Studies, University of Virginia, states that 40 million homes do not have quality internet connection cutting them off from work, schools, and more. He thinks that government efforts should improve the broadband service today. He feels that the lower income and minority Americans are affected by the digital divide. Michael S. Pollard, Senior Sociologist at the RAND Corporation, Professor at the Pardee Graduate School, states that alcohol consumption has increased greatly during the pandemic shutdowns. From his study he discovers that drinking by women rose 41%. He explains who is most at risk of binge drinking, and why this is a serious problem.

He feels the main cause is mental illness, and with COVID-19 with the social isolation factors has contributed to this. Joseph Dieleman, PhD, Associate Professor, Department of Health Metric Science, University of Washington, faculty lead of the Resource Tracking team, Institute for Health Metrics & Evaluation, states health risks ie. obesity, high blood pressure, and smoking are linked to over \$730 billion in preventable US health care spending in 2016. He suggests policy changes and public awareness programs that may influence people to avoid costly health problems. David B. Soma, MD, Pediatric Sports Medicine Specialist, Mayo Clinic, supports students to exercise and develop socialization skills, but realizes that COVID-19 has limited nationwide sports programs. He explains the risks of different sports, and what parents and student athletes can do to reduce the chances of contracting COVID-19 during sports activities.

She talks about the importance of girls taking STEM classes in school. She suggests that girls find mentors to help them find jobs in the commercial space industry, and stresses how important for women to be included in the future space exploration. Tom Corley, Certified Financial Planner, author, explains that money mistakes can eventual impact an individual savings. He stresses that people need to develop good money habits in order to have lifelong financial success. He outlines four ways that an American can become wealthy. Lois E. Krahn, MD, psychiatrist and sleep specialist, Mayo Clinic, Phoenix, states that most people like to change to standard time with an extra hour of sleep. She explains how time changes affect the body and sleep patterns ie. increased traffic accidents. She offers tips to adapt to the schedule change

She explains that financial scams including telemarketer offers for contact tracing for a fee to reserve places for future vaccine. Many older adults do not realize they are targets of the scams. She adds that changes in financial decision-making maybe the early signs of dementia or cognitive decline. Steve Webb, PhD, Certified Social Media Intelligence Expert, Certified A.L.I.C.E., Active Threat Training Instructor, Solo Engagement Tactics Level II Instructor for law enforcement, Associate Professor in Education Administration, Southern Illinois University and McKendree University, author, explains that children are spending more time in front of computers, and parents would be surprised how much data about their children is collected when they are online. He talks about cyberbullying and its affect on the children's suicides rates. Denisa Gandara, PhD, Assistant Professor of Higher Education, Southern Methodist University, Dallas, states from her study of college promise programs at community colleges that free tuition has boosted enrollment rates for black and Hispanic students. She explains how the programs operate and how they are funded. She expresses concerns about the sustainability of these programs, as state budgets struggle as a result of COVID-19.</p>

He discusses adults face technical handicaps and working from home produces less innovation. He mentions the inequality effect as the more educated, higher-earning employees are more likely to work from home, but continued to be paid, develop their skills, and advance their careers. Shelby Kerns, Executive Director, National Association of State Budget Officers, explains that the U.S. states are facing the biggest cash crisis since the Depression as tax revenues collapse because of the lockdowns for months. She says that states have responded including spending reductions rangings from 0 to 20%. She discusses the probability of state tax increases or bailouts from federal taxpayers for states in the greatest trouble. Linda Pagan, PhD, Senior Researcher, CHU Sainte-Justine Pediatric Hospital, Montreal, explains from her study that examined the readiness of children for kindergarten, and how it affects academic performanc through age 17. She states that when children have a good basis in kindergarten for subjects like vocabulary, they tend to have less anxiety at age 17. She offers advice to parents.</p>

He discusses the similarities and differences between the two so much so that doctors may diagnose incorrectly. He addresses reports that cases of influenza have decrease 98% throughout the world. He recommends that patients contact their doctors via email or phone if they believe they have COVID-19 to avoid spreading it in waiting rooms. Justin Reich, PhD, Assistant Professor, Comparative Media Studies/Writing Department, MIT, Director of the MIT Teaching Systems Lab, author, gives transformative educational technologies report which is an assessment technology measuring whether a child is truly learning. He feels this technology does a poor job of measurement since most teachers are ill-prepared to make a change to online learning this year. He explains how this problem can be addressed. Nick Rizzo, Fitness Research Director, RunRepeat.com explains that gyms are having difficulties in that only 31% of the gym members have returned to the fitness clubs, less than the gym owners expected. He thinks with new lockdowns this winter that many gyms may never reopen.

Ted Frank, career consultant, author, discusses the importance of effective communication in the workplace. With effective communication, efficiency and productivity improve. He believes that presentations should focus on three key points at a time and that examples and illustrations are a must in improving communication. Steve Cicala, Assistant Professor, Harris School of Public Policy, University of Chicago, states from his study that deregulated power markets on the wholesale level have cut the cost of generating electricity, saving consumers 3 billion yearly. He discusses how this little-known market operates, and why it should matter to consumers. He explains how smart meters will eventually give consumers even greater power in managing their energy costs.

This ability gives women influence in the workplace. She outlines techniques that enable women to be more clearly understood and respected. John Hagan, PhD, John D. MacArthur Professor of Sociology & Law, Northwestern University, discovers from his study the connection between higher unemployment rates and school shootings. This connection is consistent throughout the U. S. regions, and that shooters come from all backgrounds and income levels. He offers possible explanations for this trend. Jason Hanson, former CIA officer, security specialist, author, discusses ways to prevent and react to home invasions or abductions. He explains steps that homeowners can take to make a house criminal-proof. He also offers tips on how to stay safe while traveling.

He also examines individual states across the U.S. He states with higher age bias, there is higher Medicare costs. Shujing Sun, PhD, Assistant Professor of Information Systems The Naveen Jindal School of Management, University of Texas, Dallas, states that the quality of patient care is poor with overcrowding emergency rooms. She investigates the potential of telemedicine as a generic solution to reduce ER congestion. She finds that on-site nurse practitioners of physician assistants can effectively treat patients with minor conditions under the remote supervision of off-site physicians. She believes that stroke victims are better treated if emergency physicians can consult remote stroke specialists. Diana Enriquez, doctoral candidate in the Department of Sociology, Princeton University, from her study examines the impact of the COVID-19 on black households. She discovers that low-income black households experienced greater job loss, more food and medicine insecurity, and higher indebtedness compared to low income white or latinx low income households. She believes that black households are continuing to struggle from government-ordered closings.
