**Free legal aid** - The Kansas Judicial Branch and Ellis County District Court announced last week that Kansas Legal Services will provide legal aid to Kansans through the Ellis County District Court Self Help Center.

**Marine Toys for Tots** – In an effort to help deliver the gift of reading to less fortunate children, The UPS Store in Hays is once again supporting the Toys for Tots Literacy Program.

**FHSU honors veterans** – Fort Hays State has joined the Heart of America Patriot Foundation to raise awareness and funding for the dependents of fully disabled or deceased veterans.

**Indian-themed mascots** – The Kansas Board of Education recommended the removal of American Indian-themed mascots and branding from Kansas school districts.

**General election results** – There were no changes in the November 8th general election results following canvassing Thursday by the Ellis County Commission.

**Disaster grant** – The Plainville Fire Department recently received an \$8,000 matching grant from the Heartland Community Foundation to purchase grain bin entrapment rescue equipment.

**Hays Area Children's Center** – The Hays Area Children's Center, a child care that is home to 79 children, is trying to bridge a funding gap without pricing parents out of the market.

**Ellis County Historical Society** – This fall, the Ellis County Historical Society was able to finish the remodel of the office portion of the basement in their main brick building.

**Grief support groups** - Three grief support groups from the Center for Life Experience will host their annual Holiday Memorial Tree Dedications this Saturday afternoon at Jackie Creamer's Dance Studio in Hays.

**Giving Tuesday** - As area families make plans for this holiday season, nonprofit organizations look to gather funds that will be used for projects throughout the following year during “the giving season.”

**WeKan Center** – The students at the WeKan Center have been busy making Christmas decorations to sell at the annual Bethesda Place sale this week in downtown Hays.

**Trafficking training** – Kansas is close to rolling out new training on child trafficking for foster parents. It will help families identify victims of trafficking in the foster care system and better care for those kids.

**Domestic and Sexual Violence Services** – Options has seen an increase in requests for services during the last year and is seeking community assistance during its annual fundraising campaign to meet those increased needs.
