

WWAC-AM ISSUES & PROGRAMS REPORT

OCTOBER 2023

WWAC-AM Issues and Reports this month include a sample of the 30 most popular and requested issues as evidenced by calls, email and listener response. Each Issue segment airs each day, Wednesday through Saturday between 5am and 12 midnight and include the guest, the issue and the questions most asked by listeners. They range in length from 3 minutes to 2,5minutes depending on content. October 5th and 6th we reported on the growing problem of Fentanyl in Atlantic City Schools and what the administration is doing to combat it. Interviewed were former school board member John Devlin. This two part series answered many of the questions parents wanted answers to. October 11th, 12th and 13th, WWAC provided a three part report on the growing danger of bulkhead failures in Atlantic City. Requested by many listeners, Donna Anderson of Lower Chelsea described the ongoing challenge of increased flooding in the city. Mayor Marty Smalls Chief of Staff Ernest Coursey was the featured interviewee. The segments were 4 minutes, 3.2 minutes and 4.1 minutes. Signature Issues most addressed the latter part of the month were the increasing gun violence in Wildwood, Vineland and Atlantic City. This four part series aired on October 22nd, 23rd and 24th featured Guy Petinga of Lady Liberty Gunsmithing in Atlantic City. Listener questions included the frequency of guns being purchased in the city, to new rules and regulations regarding gun safety. October 29th and 30th, WIBG Issues heralded a report on educational challenges in the Egg Harbor Township school district and what is being done to meet the needs of students and parents regarding in class training.

NOVEMBER 2023

November 4th and 5th, introduced a report and commentary from Ocean City school board member Robin Schaefer discussing the origins of the woke movement. Listeners response and feedback to this subject created a three part series on the motivation by the left in local school boards to launch these programs without parental endorsement. WIBG listeners reacted with strong comment on the voracity of this issue and how parents are pulling their kids out of woke schools. This two part series ran on the concurrent dates length at 3.2minutes and 1.55 minutes. November 9th and 10th, a full report on veterans rights in light of the Veterans Day memorials in the area. Director of Veterans Affairs Joe Griffes lead the national charge on the effect veterans rights are having on the future of area veterans. Many area listeners took part in the programs airing at 7am and 5pm. November 15th and 16th, WWAC-AM provided full spectrum coverage of the Ongoing legislative dispute over legislative salaries expected to double next year. Many people called to oppose these stiff increases. The two part series ran 2minutes each. November 24th and 25th, WIBG-FM provided a full Issues report on the growing security issues at Harborfield Youth Detention in Egg Harbor City. Several prominent local officials include Mayor Lisa Giampetti took part in the on air discussion. Resident of the area took issue with the lax security at the facility.

DECEMBER 2023

Full spectrum coverage of the maximal issue discussed by listeners on the sagging Biden economy and the impact on the Atlantic City International Airport. Egg Harbor Township Mayor Laura Pfromer

answered questions emailed to the program. The Issues program aired December 6th and 7th at 7pm. Many positive responses to the panel of guests that explained the financial impact of the expansion of the airport. December 20th and 21st, we addressed the Toys for Tots radio campaign and the vast number of children who would be without gifts on Christmas were it not for the Toys for Tots volunteers in Atlantic and Cape May. The programs aired at 7 and 8am, both days.

December's Issues programming concluded with a veteran issues centered program, dealing specifically with returning soldiers suffering from ADHD. The program aired Sunday morning between 9 and 11am.

Both segments ran 15 minutes with positive listener response
