Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- **Community:** Some of the issues covered deal with community related programs and how they impact and meet the needs of the citizens throughout the greater Sioux Falls area.
- **Education:** Many of the topics discussed pertain to education related issues and how the city of Sioux Falls and surrounding communities plan to address the learning and knowledge opportunities/challenges that affect both youth and adults alike.
- **Veteran's Support:** Some issues discussed dealt with the needs of the military veterans in the community and the steps being taken to help and assist them.
