Sunday, April 3, 2016 – West Coast Forum 6:00 a.m.

Host: Jeff Slater. Guest: Eric Lyman, Vice President, Industry Insights for true car.com. More and more people are looking for green cars or cars that are hybrids. School is out, and that means more children will not be getting enough to eat. During the school year, low-income kids get fed through government assistance at school. When school's out, many kids won't get breakfast or lunch. During the summer break, the average family's monthly grocery bill goes up \$300.00 which many families can't afford. Mr. Slater and Ms. Rowe discussed the "Feeding Our Future" program that provides meals for children. How the program works, how you qualify, and what local groups and charities are supplying the food to low-income families are some of the topics covered.

Mr. Anderson elaborated on some of the procedures in place for trying to keep the boys out of trouble so they can become productive citizens.

Mr. Slater and Ms. Sullivan discussed the study and how our local government can use the information to keep millennials from moving away. The study showed a vibrant downtown is what's most important to millennials along with public transportation and green transportation. Millennials also say the local food and brew scene is also very important as well as more urban centers. Millennials are also looking for cities that have music and art festivals.

Mr. Slater and Dr. Atkins discussed the different health issues between minorities and whites that need to be treated and the accelerating health equality for the vets. Dr. Atkins also elaborated on why he thinks minority vets are less likely to seek help from the VA. He feels that minority vets are less likely to trust the VA. Dr. Atkins also discussed the current research the VA is doing regarding minority health issues.

Today is Mother's Day. While we take time out to remember mom, why not take time out to honor Foster Mothers? Mr. Slater and Ms. Offutt discussed being a foster mother. Why being a foster parent can be important to a child who has been taken from their family (normally due to violence), how foster parents provide essential support for kids in foster care, and why not all kids in foster care are "bad" kids. Mr. Slater and Ms. Offutt talked about the qualifications to be a foster parent – i.e., Do you have to own your own home? Do you have to be married? Does income matter? Ms. Offutt answered those questions and more.
