Reverend Al Sharpton and National Action Network extend a heartfelt congratulations to **U.S. Representative Hakeem Jeffries** on being elected leader of the House Democrats in Congress.

Congressman Jeffries discussed the new leadership post on Reverend Sharpton's nationally syndicated radio show and will speak at NAN's House of Justice.

A committed member of National Action Network for more than a decade, Congressman Jeffries has worked closely with Reverend Sharpton on a host of civil rights issues across the years. Another barrier to equal representation has come down.

Next year, Democrats will enter the House Chamber led by a Black representative for the first time, said Reverend Sharpton. This has been a long overdue moment in America – more than 150 years after Joseph Rainey became the first Black American to serve in the House.

"I think today of one of my mentors, Brooklyn's own **Shirley Chisholm**, who over 50 years ago became the first Black woman elected to the House," Reverend Sharpton said after news broke that Congressman Jefferies made history to become the first Black to hold the post. "She fought to make sure Black voices didn't only have a seat at the table – but that America listened when they spoke. They and those who came in between laid the groundwork, so that today we can call Hakeem Jeffries the House Minority Leader."

Added Reverend Sharpton:

"Rep. Jeffries has been our ally in government who appreciates that legislation is the true pathway to change," he said. "Even with a GOP-led House, we are confident he will not give up on the John Lewis Voting Rights Act or the George Floyd Justice in Policing Act. In turn, we will not give up there is more diversity and inclusion in House leadership."

"After nine horrific months behind bars, Brittney Griner's family, friends, and teammates can finally breathe a sigh of relief that she's on her way home," said Reverend Sharpton. "For months we kept the pressure on President Biden to do everything in his power to bring Brittney home.

Today, we gladly applaud the administration for the hard work of ensuring Brittney's imprisonment finally came to an end."

Reverend Sharpton said that the nation should continue to pray for Brittney and her family because her journey is far from over.

"Brittney returns home with spiritual and emotional wounds that can only heal now that she's free," he said. "I and the ministers who were denied access to see her in Russia look forward to meeting her here, so we can finally pray over her and offer her spiritual guidance. We also continue to pray for the release of Paul Whelan and all U.S. citizens detained abroad."

1. "Loudmouth' Opens With a Major Roar

Across the nation, thousands of movie-goers headed to theatres throughout the week to view 'Loudmouth,' the documentary that traces the activism of National Action Network's Founder/President, the **Reverend Al Sharpton.**

The 2-hour documentary has received raved reviews and is the first major documentary focused squarely on the life of a living civil rights leader. On opening night last Friday, **New York City**

Mayor Eric Adams joined Reverend Sharpton at a screening at the Magic Johnson Theater in Harlem.

1. Congressman Hakeem Jeffries Returns Home to NAN's House of Justice

Reverend Sharpton welcomed leaders from across New York City to NAN's House of Justice last Saturday to celebrate the historic selection of incoming **House Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries.**

Dubbed "Hakeem Jeffries Day," the Brooklyn Congressman—who has been a member of National Action Network for decades—spoke to the audience.

"This is a historic moment and an enormous step for the Black community," said Reverend Sharpton. "I have seen Hakeem Jeffries grow over the last 25 years, and over that time I have seen his passion and dedication to the fight for racial justice. NAN is excited to declare this Saturday as Hakeem Jeffries Day to recognize this monumental occasion."

Rep. Jeffries was unanimously elected as House Democratic Minority Leader, following Speaker Nancy Pelosi's decision to step down from her long-held position. The vote was a major milestone as Jeffries will become the first-ever Black party leader in Congressional history. Jeffries has been active in NAN since the late 1990s and has built a relationship of mutual trust and collaboration with the organization. Since his election to Congress in 2012, he has used his position to push for legislation to advance racial justice and socioeconomic equity, sponsoring numerous bills, particularly around police and criminal justice reform. In May 2021, he was one of several New York City officials who joined Rev. Sharpton at the House of Justice in kneeling for 9 minutes and 29 seconds to commemorate the one-year anniversary of the murder of George Floyd.

Reverend Sharpton traveled to Orlando, Florida this week where he delivered the keynote address at the **Conference of National Black Churches**, led by **Dr. W. Franklyn Richardson**, who serves as chairman of NAN's board of directors and the pastor of Grace Baptist Church in Mount Vernon, New York.

1. Reverend Sharpton Gathers New York's Black Leadership for Historic Meeting A historic gathering of New York's top Black leaders took place on Thursday at National Action Network's House of Justice in Harlem.

The agenda? Public safety.

"Never before in the history of this state have we seen so many of our top officials come from the black community," said **Reverend Sharpton**, who convened the mayor and the elected officials. Among the attendees were **New York City Mayor Eric Adams**, **Attorney General Leticia James**, **New York Senate Majority Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins**, and **New York Assembly Speaker Carl Heastie and others. Manhattan District Attorney Alvin Bragg** joined the meeting virtually.

"2023 will be the year we show this nation how to govern," said Reverend Sharpton.

Mayor Adams said that such a conversation about justice and safety is long overdue.

"We're clear on the systemic poverty, the system racism, that has been in place and denied people the opportunities to leave poverty," said Mayor Adams. "That's what this conversation was about today."

Mayor Adams later tweeted a photo of all of the leaders assembled on the stage at the House of Justice, a historic first in New York City.

"I cannot thank @TheRevAl enough for bringing me and my fellow leaders together for a conversation about justice and safety," he wrote in the tweet. "This picture is what our ancestors prayed for, and we are going to live up to that legacy."
