#### **WHFR Quarterly Issues and Programs List**

#### October - December 2021

In accordance with the Federal Communications Commission's rules, the following in the opinion of Station WHFR are problems and needs of the community for the period noted above. They are not necessarily listed in order of importance. Each is addressed by significant public affairs or public service programming in responses to these issues. Formats for coverage of the issues include interviews, in-studio guests, call-outs and host commentary. The show designated for public service programming includes: "The WHFR Journal" and "We Are Not Alone. WHFR also addresses the needs of the community through the students' broadcast of Neighborhood News, 5 minutes monthly, which includes stories that relate to public service, local and national news and current events. WHFR requires that four public service announcements, 30 to 60 seconds each are played or read each hour.

We continue to incorporate rotating local announcements to our community of license each hour providing resources for obtaining details and support in this time of the COVID-19 pandemic, information by the college for students in need to get access to the most current updates about campus operations as well as resources for individual support (local food pantry, counseling, etc.) and support from the City of Dearborn for those who live and work in our community.
