The average price of gas is now a little over a dollar a gallon more than at this time last year. Oil prices have rebounded with the economy, pushing gas prices higher since the summer.</p> <p>Macy's has announced plans to close six more stores in 2022 as it continues to ramp up online sales. The latest stores to close are in Alabama, California, Colorado, Missouri, Texas and Florida. The retailer has left open the possibility of announcing additional closings later this year.</p> <p>It seems the price of everything is going up because of inflation, and car insurance is no exception. A new report from ValuePenguin predicts that auto insurance rates will rise by six-tenths of a percent this year after going down a bit last year. The rate hikes are concentrated in 22 states.</p>

As many as 20 people may be missing and officials are working to identify them. In the video posted on Twitter, a large portion of a cliff can be seen crashing into the water at a popular tourist attraction along the Rio Grande River, directly on top of several boats, Lord we pray for healing for all who were injured and your comfort on the grieving families.</p> <p>At least 19 people, including nine children, have died after a fire in a New York apartment building. 63 people were injured with 32 of them being sent to hospitals, several of whom are in a critical condition. A malfunctioning electric heater is suspected as the cause. Lord we again pray for healing for all the injured people and your comfort on the families who grieve.</p>

It was after the filming of one of these regular rounds that Alfie was spotted by his sister's husband as Millie was helping clean up the streets. Delighted, Alfie has reunited with brother Dave, who's 84, and 71-year-old sister Anne for the first time in more than two decades. He said- and to think it's all because he taught his dog how to put litter in the trash!</p>

				<p>the politicians are planning.</p> <p>When Kent Albright, a Baptist pastor from the United States, arrived as a missionary to Spain in 1996, he was unprepared for the insults and threats, or the fines from the police for handing out Protestant leaflets on the streets of Salamanca. Social animosity was big — they had never seen a Protestant in their life. One woman even whispered to him- Be thankful we don't throw stones at you. The Baptist preacher couldn't have imagined that 25 years later, he would be pastoring an evangelical congregation of 120 and count about two dozen other thriving Protestant churches in the northwestern city. Most of the worshipers are not Spanish-born — they're immigrants from Latin America, including about 80% of Albright's congregation.</p>

Research shows the monthly cost of buying a starter home was more affordable than renting a similar-sized unit in 26 of the 50 largest metros.</p> <p>The Conference Board Consumer Confidence Index fell slightly in February, following another decrease in January. The Index now stands at 110.5 , down from 111.1 in January. The Index shows consumers are most concerned about economic conditions six months from now.</p> <p>The government is raising the Social Security full retirement age again. The full retirement age – the age at which individuals are eligible to claim their full Social Security benefit – rose to 67 this year for those who were born in 1960. Officials say it will be a permanent change.</p>

The founder of New Life Radio Satellite in Ukraine said, "Christians are ... hoping that the Russians don't come too far because churches will definitely be shut down in the areas that they take over because ... that's their practice and that's their history." Lord we pray for protection for Christians in Ukraine.</p> <p>Another winter storm is moving across the country. Winter storm warnings are in place for northeastern Texas to parts of southwestern Illinois. The ice component of the major winter storm is expected to impact an area covering more than 1,800 miles. Travel on the roads is hazardous and hundreds of airline flights have been cancelled. Lord we pray for protection for everyone in the path of this storm.</p>

He went on to say, "Prolonged conflict is in nobody's interests and will only prolong the suffering of the most vulnerable," WHO has verified 43 attacks on health care facilities, which have killed a dozen people and injured 34 others. Attacks on hospitals can rise to the level of war crimes. Lord we pray that there will soon be a cease fire and that the talks will bring about peace.</p> <p>Some 1.5 million children have fled from Ukraine since the Russian invasion began on February 24. Others stay put in western Ukraine. These kids have an equally-difficult road ahead of them. There are groups trying to help students process the trauma of war. "Their little brains can't understand what war is. They've never faced it; and some have never seen movies about it," Lord we pray you comfort the traumatized children and give them hope for the future.</p>

That night, she left behind all she owned and drove west in two cars with her grandmother, parents, brother, sister-in-law, 3-year-old nephew and two friends, 24 hours without sleeping, to northwest Ukraine. She started offering medical consultations online or over the phone, free of charge. Now she has found another way to help. Starting at 7 a.m., she spends 14 hours a day at a cold warehouse where she sorts, counts and packs up food and medical supplies donated by volunteer groups outside the country. The boxes are loaded onto trucks that take them deeper into Ukraine. As a neurologist, she knows this war will lead to many cases of PTSD and depression. Two surgeons she knew were killed while performing surgery when a bomb landed in the operating room. She says it felt like 10 years since the attack began. But they will survive and build a new country very soon.</p>
