Georgia Public Telecommunications Commission (Combined Report)

This report covers the following fourteen noncommercial educational radio and eight noncommercial educational television stations licensed to Georgia Public Telecommunications Commission ("GPTC")¹ as well as the headquarters of the GPTC in Atlanta: Stations WABR (FM), Tifton; WACG (FM), Augusta; WJSP (FM), Warm Springs; WSVH (FM), Savannah; WUGA (FM), Athens; WUNV (FM), Albany; WUWG (FM), Carrollton; WWET (FM), Valdosta; WXVS (FM), Waycross; WJWV (FM), Ft. Gaines; WPPR (FM), Demorest; WNGU (FM), Dahlonega; WWIO (FM), Brunswick; WGPB (FM), Rome; WABW-TV, Pelham; WACS-TV, Dawson; WCES-TV, Wrens; WNGH-TV, Chatsworth; WGTV, Athens; WJSP-TV, Columbus; WVAN-TV, Savannah; and WXGA-TV, Waycross. This report also covers two noncommercial educational radio stations that GPTC operates pursuant to management agreements: Stations WNGH (FM), Chatsworth and WATY (FM), Folkston.² None of these stations has five or more employees, and therefore, GPTC has prepared a combined report for all these stations.

GPTC operates its radio and television stations as state public broadcast networks, with all the television programs originating in Atlanta and simulcast by all of the stations in the network. Most of the radio stations are operated in a similar manner, although some originate some programming locally. Given this structure, the bulk of GPTC's employees are located at its Atlanta headquarters. The employees at the individual stations are primarily technical personnel assigned to assure the proper operation of the stations.

While GPTC has employees throughout the state, it operates as a single agency for recruitment purposes and employs the same recruitment sources and employment initiatives for all of its job openings. GPTC is also an agency of the state of Georgia and its recruitment and employment practices are subject to the requirements of the State Personnel Administration, Georgia's equivalent of the federal civil service system.

¹ GPTC also holds the license to one other noncommercial educational television station, WMUM-TV, Cochran, and one other noncommercial educational radio station, WMUM-FM, Cochran, which combined have five or more full-time employees. Therefore, GPTC has prepared a separate EEO Public Inspection File Report for WMUM-FM and WMUM-TV.

² These two stations are licensed to the Foundation for Public Broadcasting in Georgia, Inc., the nonprofit corporation that supports the GPTC.

5. Provide a list and brief description of initiatives undertaken to satisfy the requirement to complete four “menu options” within a two-year period.
 - (v) Establishment of an internship program designed to assist members of the community to acquire skills needed for broadcast employment.

Georgia Public Broadcasting's internship program continues to expand with new opportunities and established guidelines and criteria to promote a more diverse internship program. Currently GPB has expanded its program to include the following operational areas; Finance, Procurement, Education, Marketing and Creative Services. The organization continues to look for ways to partner with members of the local and national community to attract students that are acquiring skills needed for administrative and broadcast level employment. GPB's internship program benefits undergraduate and graduate students, as well as high school students seeking experience and hoping to explore career opportunities or acquire college credit. Internship opportunities have also included the following areas: Radio, Multi-Media Web Development, Public Relations, Member and Audience Services and Television Production. Georgia Public Broadcasting also actively extends ongoing opportunities for Volunteers through the efforts of the organization's Volunteer Coordinator for events and fund-raising campaigns. A more detailed description is outlined below.

Radio Internships: This program gives selected students the opportunity to be trained in broadcast journalism and as music show hosts. It also provides an opportunity for broadcast, journalism and music students to participate in radio production functions. The radio internship can encompass three areas: music production, news production, and news reporting. The Radio Internship program has created many opportunities for students not only in Atlanta but also the Savannah, Macon, and Rome, Georgia operational areas.

Multi-Media Web Development Internships: This program has grown and created opportunities for students to learn Media, Flash, Dream Weaver and other multi-media technology. With the continued work in this area, since 2005 an apprentice/intern program was developed. Student were provided with a wide range of experience and provided continued support as needed to the GPB web team in all operational areas. The work performed impacted the television production and education areas of the organization.

Television Production Internships: This program was driven by students pursuing degrees or interest in television production. The program provides experience in the many tasks required to produce studio and documentary programs for public television audiences. This type of opportunity can include research, field and studio production and editing.

Lawmakers Internships: GPB recruits seven interns to cover the activities of the Georgia General Assembly legislative session. This program offers compensated internships for college or graduate students interested in broadcasting, journalism, political science or video production. These internships provide opportunities to research, write, produce and edit stories, as well as gain experience on technical equipment used in production of the series (i.e., Panasonic News Byte editing system, robotic cameras, Chyron character generator and teleprompter). There are approximately 50 work days for Lawmakers

interns.

Emma Bowen Foundation Program: GPB recruited two interns to participate in a 3 year Program sponsored by the Corporation of Public Broadcastings called the “Emma Bowen Foundation”. This program consists of a year round internship during the Winter, Spring, Summer and Fall Semesters where students develop diverse knowledge while working in a variety of areas within Georgia Public Broadcasting. This program began in 2007 and will end in 2009. The foundation allows GPB to participate in a scholarship funding program that is designed to assist students interested in pursuing a career in broadcasting.

Apprentice and Volunteer Programs: This program continues to create meaningful experiences and training opportunities for students and citizens within the community.

- The Apprentice Program ended in 2008 and used public and private sector students throughout the state to capture video footage for use on the GPB Education television network and website and for GPB partner organizations. Students were selected from journalism, film, communications and broadcast programs in colleges, universities and technical colleges around the state.
- The Volunteer Program gives opportunities to students and citizens within the community. The areas for volunteering range from shadowing with producers, scheduling managers, studio production/technical teams to a variety of events and activities at GPB to include fundraising (pledge) and television production.
- The International Student Program gave opportunities for partnerships with organizations that sponsor students that travel abroad with an interest in the broadcast industry. GPB will examine opportunities as they arise to sponsor other students for this program.

(vii) Participation in scholarship programs designed to assist students interested in pursuing a career in broadcasting.

Emma Bowen Foundation Program: GPB has participated in a 3 year scholarship program that offers students opportunities to learn many aspects of corporate operations and develop company-specific skills. Students participate in an annual student conference, a community service program and a mentoring program to further enhance the student’s knowledge and experience. While this program has been included in our internship program, it is the only program that provides funds/scholarship monies to the participating students. This Program is sponsored by the Corporation of Public Broadcastings. The students placed with Georgia Public Broadcasting have developed diverse knowledge while working in a variety of areas that are designed to assist them in their pursuit of careers in broadcasting.

(viii) Establishment of training programs designed to enable station personnel to acquire skills that could qualify them for a higher-level position.

Through the Human Resources Office, Georgia Public Broadcasting continues to develop, coordinate, and provide ongoing in-house training as well as training that is outsourced to public and private vendors, to provide employees with additional skills to perform job responsibilities and to obtain higher-level responsibilities or positions. Some areas of training include:

- **Mediation Training** for key management leaders. This training aides in handling internal conflicts and resolving issue that may arise.

- **Career Track Training** for employees on any level, Management training is provided to assist in the areas of Communications and Managing pressure in the workplace.
- **E-Performance Training** for Human Resources staff to plan the implementation of a new performance appraisal systems for all employees in 2010.
- **Microsoft Suite** (Word, Excel, Power Point and Access);
- **Visio Professional 2003** software training administered to division administrative assistants to train staff to create organizational charts;
- **Microsoft Project 2000** for administrative and professional employees;
- **File Management Training** for clerical personnel responsible for archiving and maintaining confidential documents;
- **Annual Briefing for Administrative Professionals** for clerical assistants and supervisors that provides professional development opportunities for networking, enhancing teamwork and sharing information among colleagues;
- **Leadership and Management Training Courses** for executive, upper level management, supervisory and new supervisors to provide training that demonstrates the necessary communication skills required to build rapport, provide feedback and work well with coworkers, supervisors, customers and vendors. These courses have been provided through the State Personnel Administration, Georgia Leadership Institute and the Carl Vinson Institute.
- **Stephen Covey Leadership training** and other self development training courses are also provided for management and employees to enhance and motivate the overall development of leaders, supervisors and staff that promote and encourage better productivity in work and family life. **Fundamentals of the Georgia Performance Management Process for Supervisors and Upper Level Management** to train supervisory staff to evaluate employees fairly and to document the process;
- **CPR and Automated External Defibrillators (AED) Training** sponsored by the American Heart Association and American Red Cross to train and certify staff that work off-site and outdoors such as production crews;
- **Telework and Work Away Training** where employees are selected as coordinators to track and coordinate telework and alternate work site agreements for employees that work condensed work weeks; employees are also training in policy and procedures when participating in a telework agreement;
- **FLSA Training** for personnel workers to keep abreast of laws and standards for employees and work schedule requirements;
- **Graphic Design and Editing training** in the areas of broadcast engineering and production. This includes training in Adobe PhotoShop and Illustrator, digital training classes for staff involved in education, web team, maintenance and satellite engineering, Avid Editing, trouble shooting, and Avid Media Composer;
- **Human Resources Conference and Training** for personnel staff to keep abreast of changes within the human resources area including law and succession planning.
- **Employees Retirement and Teachers Retirement System training** for personnel staff to keep abreast of retirement application and leave certifications required.
- **HCM Upgrade Delta/People Soft Training** for personnel staff to learn new databases and software;
- **Risk Management Workshop** for HR and Procurement staff that focus on worker's compensation, liability and property matter;
- **Grammar Basics Training** for staff required to do considerable writing for reports and/or presentations;
- **PM Tool's software training** for new supervisors and managers to learn the navigation of the performance evaluation software to evaluate staff;
- **Human Resources Training course** provided to personnel staff to review policies, procedures and develop strategies to provide better service and information to employees;

- Secure Perfect, Wave Reader Security Systems software training provided to specific staff that designs, manages and implements the use of a security database including badges and the tracking and monitoring of access rights and privileges within the organization;
- Team Building Training proved by Cameron & Associates, GPB's Employee Assistance provider for staff development.
- Manufacturer's electronic equipment training for engineering staff provided by Motorola.
- RAF Safety training for transmitter engineering staff .
- Digital Conversion equipment upgrade and manufacturer's new equipment workflow training for field engineering, maintenance engineering, and master control staff.

(x) Participation in at least four events or programs sponsored by educational institutions relating to career opportunities in broadcasting.

Each year Georgia Public Broadcasting participates in at least four job fair/career day events sponsored by educational institutions designed to promote and encourage career opportunities in broadcasting. Some of these events for the 2008-2009 calendar year include:

- Clark Atlanta University Internship Fair/Career Day, September 16, 2008
- State Personnel Administration Job Fair, January 28, 2009
- Kennesaw State University Career Fair, March 26, 2009
- Congressman David Scott Job Fair, International Convention Center, May 29, 2009

These events motivate and inform students and the surrounding community about the organization and career opportunities available at GPB in the areas of media, journalism, and communications.
