ABC Action News – WFTS produces daily newscasts providing local information of interest to viewers in the Tampa Bay area. Through conversations with community stake holders, WFTS identifies those topics having the greatest impact on the community. WFTS produces 41 hours of local news each week. This includes reports on subjects such as crime, health, government, education, consumer news. Regularly scheduled newscasts air M-F 5:00am-7:00am, 9:00am -10:00am, 3:00pm-4:00pm, 4:00pm – 5:00pm, 5:00pm -6:00 pm, 6:00pm -6:30pm & 11:00pm - 11:35pm. On weekends, the station has regularly scheduled newscasts Sat 7:00am – 8:00am, 9:00am – 10:00am, 6:00pm – 6:30pm, & 11:00 – 11:30pm. The Saturday 6:00 pm newscast may periodically be preempted by ABC sports. On Sunday, local newscasts are 6:00am – 7:00am, 8:00am – 9:00am, 6:00pm – 6:30pm, and 11:00pm – 11:30pm.

I-Team Special Reports – WFTS regularly produces investigative reports that air in the 11pm newscasts. These reports provide in-depth information on topics that are of interest to the Tampa Bay viewing area.
