FCC Report 3 Quarter / July – August 31, 2016 / L. Campos

Positively Tampa Bay: The interview segment airs weekdays on ABC Action News 9am – 10am show. The segment called “Positively Tampa Bay” air 5 days a week, Tuesdays thru Saturdays in the morning news. It showcases community service projects, charity groups/non-profits and their services, and the efforts of local residents to make a positive impact in our community. The interview segments are typically 3 ½ minutes in length, hosted & produced by WFTS TV Director of Community Affairs Lissette Campos. During the third quarter of 2016, we aired approximately 60 PTB segments. Below are highlights.

Christmas in July w/ Salvation Army & PTB: July 11 – 17, 2016 – Issues Addressed: 14, 15, 20, 40

This campaign across all media platforms supported the Angel Tree programs of local Salvation Army area commands. We partnered with the Tampa Bay Storm and Tampa Bay Rays to host 2 big toy drives for Salvation Army units in their county. Both sports teams offered up to 2 free game tickets to viewers donating a new, unwrapped toy for Angel Tree at the Storm game in Tampa July 16 or the Rays game in St. Pete July 17. In all, viewers donated approximately 550 toys for the Hillsborough unit of Salvation Army, St. Petersburg Area unit and the Clearwater/Upper Pinellas County unit! In addition, the foundation at JP Morgan Chase donated \$8,500 in cash to Salvation Army of Hillsborough.

Here's a break down of daily Positively Tampa Bay segments showcasing different aspects of the campaign:

- July 11 – J P Morgan Chase philanthropy – donation of \$2,000 in toys and \$8,500 in cash
- July 12 – Tampa Bay Storm players involved in Angel Tree charity work
- July 13 – Salvation Army Units explain need
- July 14 – Tampa Bay Rays’ longstanding partnership with Salvation Army Unit in St. Petersburg
- July 15 – Overview of Angel Tree Program – the Hillsborough and both Pinellas units will serve an estimated 4,200 kids this December – 200 more children because of this campaign.
- July 16 - Community Event 4pm - 5:30pm - with Tampa Bay Storm (Arena Football League) & JP Morgan Chase at Amalie Arena in Tampa
- July 17 - Community Event Noon - 1:30pm - with Tampa Bay Rays (Major League Baseball) at Tropicana Field in St. Pete

Taking Action For Your Future Campaign & PTB: August 15 – September 9, 2016 – Issues Addressed: 2, 9, 61

We partnered with the Pinellas Education Foundation and Career Source Tampa Bay to provide our viewers with free access to the “Future Plans” online career survey and 1 on 1 review of each participant’s results at any local Career Source Tampa Bay Office. It allowed us to address under employment, un employment and the issue of mounting student loan debt. We picked the Future Plans survey after it garnered national attention in May - becoming 1 of only 5 finalists in an educational APP challenge issued by the US Department of Education. More than 230 viewers registered for the 2 hour Future Plans survey. Of those participants, 90% said in the post survey of Future Plans that it was a “beneficial”

experience; 70% said it made them “more aware of in demand careers”; and 83 % said they were more likely to change education and career paths to “in demand jobs” they were matched with. The component that interested our viewers most was how their survey results were matched to in-demand jobs - updated stats which came from the Florida Department of Labor. With such a large population of veterans trying to reintegrate into our local workforce, this was of high interest to them.

Taking Action Against Domestic Violence Campaign: September 19 – Oct. 30, 2016 - Issues Addressed: 20, 21, 22, 39, 40, 46

ABC Action News' 8th annual domestic violence awareness campaign was focused on our state certified dv centers and how they rely on the support of local residents. By showcasing "everyday heroes" who donated their time and talents to help individual survivors or the DV centers, we hope to accomplish two things. First, we hope to engage more bystanders to become part of the movement against DV. That can take many forms: including volunteering of their time, making a financial donation, donating their professional services. Secondly, we address the misconception that these local DV centers are just emergency shelters. The majority of their services happen outside the shelter! The centers provide prevention curriculum to local schools, counseling services, job training, legal referrals. One center, The Spring of Tampa Bay in Hillsborough county, even has a certified elementary school on its secured property.
