FCC Report 2nd Quarter April – June 2015

Positively Tampa Bay: The interview segment airs weekdays on ABC Action News 9am – 10am show. The segment, called “Positively Tampa Bay”, airs Tuesdays thru Fridays and showcases community service projects, charity groups/non-profits and their services, and the efforts of local residents to make a positive impact in our community. The interview segments are typically 3 ½ minutes in length, hosted & produced by WFTS TV Director of Community Affairs Lissette Campos. During the second quarter of 2015, we produced approximately 43 PTB segments.

Highlights included:

Men Mentoring – Saluting Tampa Bay Area Dads : Week of June 15 – 19, we produced a series on Dads that aired each day leading up to Fathers’ Day on Sunday, June 21st. All segments of Positively Tampa Bay that week focused on local men engaged in mentoring boys & young men; helping other men in our community; and serving as role models. Representative of our community, the series included Anglo, African-American and Hispanic men.

PTB June 16 - Aaron Welsh Jr. & Aaron Welsh III – This father & son duo from Bradenton, FL started their own shellfish farming business. Dad Aaron gave up his retirement and applied his PhD knowledge to opening the business with his son 18 months ago. Son Aaron, traded in his law career and degree, to go into business with his father. They simplified their lives, prioritized in order to make this dream happen. They were motivated by the need to spend more time together as a family and their love of marine-life and the environment. Their clams are not only a source of seafood for local restaurants, the farm near the Sunshine Skyway bridge is helping to clean the bay. Issues Addressed: 16, 26, 43

PTB June 17 - Richard Gonzmart is a 4th generation owner of the Tampa Bay area’s famous Columbia Restaurant. The historic restaurant was opened in 1905 and is registered as Florida’s first restaurant. Gonzmart has used his wealth and public platform to raise awareness of prostate cancer – affecting one in every 6 men in the U.S. He’s focused on statistics showing that African American and Hispanic men have the lowest survival rates because they do not participate in early detection/pre screenings. Gonzmart’s annual Father’s Day Walk attracts more than 500 local dads and their families. The walks in 2014 & 2015 raised approx. \$150,000 for Advanced Prostate Cancer Research Study at Moffitt Cancer Center in Tampa, FL. Issues Addressed: 5, 26, 45

PTB June 18 - Mark Merrill is the CEO of All Pro Dads mentorship program. Florida has 254 chapters and more than half of those are in the Tampa Bay area. Nationwide, All Pro Dads now has 1,200 plus chapters. The youth program creates mentoring and

bonding opportunities for men with their children and each other. Activities include school projects, events tied to local sports teams and large community events. Issues Addressed: 10, 20, 29,39

PTB June 19 - George Tinsley Jr shares his rags to riches story with young men all over the country. The resident of Winter Haven owns more than 60 food industry franchises in Florida, with a dominant presence in airport concession stands. The African American was abandoned with an elderly neighbor at 8 months old and succeeded through hard work, perseverance and education. He gives back with involvement in mentoring programs – including 100 Black Men, the local Chapter of the NAACP, etc. He personally hosts job shadowing programs within his Tampa businesses and is a mentor/speaker at “Saturday Morning Breakfast Club”. Issues Addressed: 26, 36, 41

Law Enforcement/First Responders: In light of recent incidents, elsewhere in the nation, involving police misconduct & racial tensions between community and police, we produced several PTB segments this month saluting local first responders who ARE making a positive impact in our community... who ARE a source of pride and unity. May is National Law Enforcement Appreciation Month, so they aired in May. The segments included male and female, white and black law enforcement/first responders.

PTB May 19 – Officer Richard Curry was named 2015 Officer of the Year by the University of South Florida Police Department. The officer helped save a woman and her disabled daughter from drowning during a freak car accident on campus. Driving rain caused her to veer off the road and into a flooded ditch. Water trapped them inside the vehicle and reached neck level when Curry kept them from panicking and extracted from the vehicle. Curry he’s wanted to be in law enforcement since he was 9 years old. Curry is also a member of the Florida Army National Guard. Issues Addressed: 6, 26

PTB May 20 – ABC Action News selected Plant City Police Officers James Burchett and Jeffrey Hilsman as our Taking Action Against Domestic Violence Officers of the Year. The two officers risked their own lives in a house fire to save a mother and her two teenaged daughters. They were being held hostage by the mother’s former boyfriend, who was angry after their recent break up. The broke the windows, ran towards the flames and smoke during the stand-off. Issues Addressed: 6, 22, 26

PTB June 30 - SunStar Paramedics – Tsambika “Sam” Aysh is an Emergency Medical Technical, aka EMT, for Sunstar Paramedics serving Pinellas County. She’s been an EMT for more than six years and was recently named Pinellas County EMT of the Year by county commissioners. Aysh was faced with a tragic situation – an ambulance call where a grandmother had died in the presence of her 12 year old grandson. The boy was understandably distraught. Aysh and her partner not only stayed on-scene the

extra time needed to comfort the boy, the very next day they returned with a birthday gift. It was the boy's 13th birthday. Issues Addressed: 6, 26

Phone Banks: Our Phone Banks are another way we serve the community. Community Affairs Department produced two phone banks this 2nd quarter. We recruit experts to rotate on our phone bank of 10 – 12 telephones. Viewers call in with questions and can ask as many questions as they want. There's no limit and caller can remain anonymous. The phone banks are usually in the 9am – 10am ABC Action News show and hosted by Lissette Campos, Director of Community Affairs.

Monday, May 4th – Phone Bank on Skin Cancer Awareness – Nationwide the first Monday in May is designated Melanoma Monday. Health professionals raise awareness of skin cancer and the importance of early detection. Our phone bank included experts from local hospital system, as well as specialists from the University of South Florida Department of Dermatology and Cutaneous Surgery. We also inform viewers of local skin cancer screening events that are open to the general public at no cost. In most of these cases, the health professionals performing the screenings are donating their services/community service hours. Issues Addressed: 5, 40

Friday, May 29 – Phone Bank on Hurricane/Storm Preparedness – Atlantic Hurricane Season is June 1 – November 30th. We recruited volunteers from the American Red Cross West & Central Florida Region to answer questions from viewers about storm readiness – including water storage, insurance questions, evacuation zones, local shelters, kennels for family pets, etc. Issues Addressed: 6, 37

4/1/2015... E-Cigarettes Included in CDC PSAs... 5 pm... live Vo/sot... 1:00

For the first time, e-cigarettes are included in the CDC's "My Story" series of PSA's included on the Center for Disease Control's website and in public service announcements distributed to radio stations nationwide. The move comes at a time when Congress is considering new regulations of e-cigarettes.

4/2/2015... Convicted Identity Thief Hijacks Charity... 6pm... live Package... 1:40

A woman with prior convictions of identity theft uses Florida Secretary of State incorporation documents to take ownership of a charitable organization, then collects donations in the name of that charity. None of the money collected went to the real charity. This story exposed a flaw in the state's corporation registration system.

4/7/2015... Photos Found in Ward's Dresser... 6pm... live package.... 1:35

Professional guardian fails to protect the assets and privacy of her court-appointed wards by leaving priceless family photos behind at assisted living facility without contacting family members. Our report helped get the photos into the hands of the loved ones to whom they belonged.

4/9/2015... Dunedin Code violations... 6pm ... live package... 1:35

Dunedin city resident turned to the I-Team after the city imposed hundreds of thousands of dollars of code violation liens on him without his knowledge and without fining neighbors with similar violations. Our report helped him negotiate these fines down to a more reasonable level.

4/13/2015... Veteran Put on Hold on Suicide Hotline... 6pm... live package... 1:30

Veteran was put on hold multiple times while trying to contact a counselor at the VA suicide hotline. It was part of a problem first exposed by a Scripps national investigation in February 2015, which revealed the call volume to the VA suicide hotline was too large for the current number of counselors to handle, therefore calls get rolled over to other call centers and often are not answered at all.

4/14/2015... Wal-Mart Closure Mystery... 6pm... Live VO... 1:00

Questions surround the sudden closure of a local Wal-Mart store. The I-Team learns it was one of five stores closed simultaneously nationwide as a result of "plumbing problems". We discovered no plumbing permits had been pulled for work in any of the affected locations.

4/15/2015... Prisoner Ball Injury at School... 5pm... live package... 1:30

A child is injured when he fell on the pavement playing a PE activity called "prisoner ball". The boy and his mother spoke out about what they considered a dangerous and inappropriate school activity.

4/16/2015... Wal-Mart Closure Possibly Union Related... 5pm... live package... 1:30

The I-Team learns one of the five stores that were closed was the site of labor issues in the past, including a strike on black Friday last November. Wal-Mart also sought injunctions preventing union organizers from entering their stores in three of the four states where stores were closed.

4/20/2015 ... Wal-Mart Workers Demonstration and Charge... 5pm... live VO... 1:00

We covered a worker protest organized by the union staged at the site of the Pico Rivera Wal-Mart, which was one of five locations mysteriously closed several days earlier.

4/21/2015... Sen. Nelson Calls for Hotline Investigation... 6pm... live VO-SOT... 1:15

After seeing our story about a suicidal veteran being put on VA by the suicide hotline, Sen. Bill Nelson puts the VA on notice the he wants answers about what went wrong and expects the problem to be fixed quickly.

4/27/2015... Cameras in the OR Proposed Law... 6pm... live package...1:40

The Wisconsin legislature debates a new law with a Florida connection. The law would allow patients to request that surgical procedures be videotaped. It was championed by the father and brother of a Florida woman who was administered too much anesthesia during a procedure and subsequently died.

4/28/2015... Students Smoking Pot Before Class... 11pm... package...2:42

After receiving photos and a complaint from parents about drug use at a local high school, the I-Team went to check it out ourselves. We found startling evidence of rampant drug use before school, accompanied by a lack of supervision by staff and law enforcement. We took our findings to the school board and superintendent, resulting in increased patrols at the school.

5/4/2015... Texas Shooting Tampa Angle... 5pm... package... 1:48

A Texas anti-Islam rally that resulted in a fatal shooting by protesters was sponsored by the same group that purchased controversial ads on public buses several months earlier in Tampa. The I-Team looks at the group and its leader.
