WUUQ FM News	10/2/23	7:00am	1:00	Chattanooga's Volkswagen Plant was impacted by what they called a "Global I-T Malfunction". Representatives say things are back to normal. We know that plants across the globe were affected. The company did not say what exactly caused the outage.
WUUQ FM News	10/20/23	6:00am	1:00	Production is underway at a new solar plant in Dalton. The expansion by Q-Cells created more than 500 jobs in that area. The company says they can now generate more than 5 gigawatts of solar power. That is almost 40% of the U.S. solar panel capacity. Q-Cells opened their first plant in Georgia back in 2019.
WUUQ FM News	10/31/23	8:00am	1:00	Publix faces a new lawsuit. It alleges the company failed to pay overtime to some of its employees. The lawsuit claims a handful of assistant department managers at Publix stores in Tennessee, Georgia and Florida failed to receive hundreds of hour of overtime pay. They say stores compelled and expected them to perform duties off the clock. The law group representing the managers filed the suit Friday.
WUUQ FM News	11/14/23	7:00am	1:00	We now know more about an accident in Chatsworth that killed a Sprin-turf employee. OSHA released a preliminary report that says Jerry Norris got caught in a roll-up machine. Another employee leaned down near the machine and caused a sensor to activate, according to a report. OSHA says that Sprin-turf did not develop a procedure to control potentially hazardous conditions.
WUUQ FM News	11/16/23	6:00am	1:00	The Chattanooga City Council voted to remove the light pillars on the pier by the Riverfront. The decision passed unanimously at last night's meeting. The lights are part of an art project and cost the city thousands to put up. Recently a windstorm knock one of the lights down. The possibility of that happening again and hurting someone is the reason city officials approved moving the lights.
WUUQ FM News	11/17/23	8:00am	1:00	OSHA fined a Chatsworth business more than 200 thousand dollars saying the company is responsible for an employee's death earlier this year. That employee, Jerry Norris was crushed by a rollup machine at Sprin-Turf on Industrial Boulevard. OSHA says the business did not have a procedure to control the hazardous area. The agency issued citations to Sprin-Turf earlier this month.

WUUQ FM News 12/5/23 7:00am 1:00 Middle Tennessee could soon see its first "In-N-Out" burger. The company filed a request with Nashville's Metro Planning Department this week. The requested location is more than 3 thousand square feet according to WZTV in Nashville. Earlier this year "In-N-Out" announced plans to place a corporate hub in Franklin. The company says this move will create more than 200 jobs.

WUUQ FM News 12/11/23 6:00am 1:00 Hundreds of Volkswagen employees in Chattanooga have moved to authorize a vote to join the "United Auto Workers" union. This is not the first time there has been a push for unionization at the plant. There were previous votes in 2014 and 2019. The vote 2014 vote failed by 87 votes. The one in 2019 it failed again by just 58 votes. We've reached out to Volkswagen of Chattanooga for comment.

WUUQ FM News 12/14/23 8:00am 1:00 Members of the community are invited to join a ground-breaking ceremony for the construction of the new Waymark Hotel. It's part of a collection of Luxury Hotels by Hilton. The development will be built on the site of the old Chattanooga Bank Building. The 10 story building is more than 100 thousand square feet.

WUUQ FM News 12/20/23 7:00am 1:00 The president of the United Auto Workers joined Volkswagen Chattanooga employees in front of the plant yesterday. Employees there continue to push for union representation. Volkswagen Chattanooga denies accusations that the company engages in unfair labor practices. The UAW tried to set up shop at Volkswagen Chattanooga 2 times before in 2014 and 2019. Both attempts failed.

WUUQ FM News 12/22/23 6:00am 1:00 Signal Mountain police are looking for a Miami man they say committed bank fraud and identity theft. Police have a felony warrant out for Michael Knight according to a Facebook post. That post says a Signal Mountain detective has been working with the Miami-Dade sheriff's department and the regional organized crime information center. They're trying identify the license plate Knight used while stealing from an ATM.

These meeting have been going on since August with parents and residents sharing their concerns. A big concern is the possible consolidation of elementary schools in Red Bank into one larger school on the Dupont Elementary site. Another concern is the potential closure of Clifton Hills Elementary School.

WUUQ FM News 11/30/23 6:00am 1:00 Tennessee Governor Bill Lee has proposed a bill to expand the state's school voucher program. The plan set to be called "The Education Freedom Scholarship Act" would give at least a 10 thousand students 7 thousand dollars in scholarships a piece to attend a private school of their choice. Homeschool students who also attend a religiously affiliated school also called category four are also eligible for scholarships.

WUUQ FM News 12/1/23 7:00am 1:00 Chattanooga and Hamilton County honored two of its former executives. They unveiled two plaques in honor of Dalton Roberts and Claude Ramsey yesterday. Current and former city and county leaders spoke at yesterday's ceremony. Robert's plaque will end up at the Tennessee Riverpark and Ramsey's will be on "Claude Ramsey's Parkway" next to the Enterprise South Industrial Park.

Speaker Sexton confirmed to us students in one county will be able to use the voucher for a private school in another county.

WUUQ FM News 12/7/23 7:00am 1:00 A lawsuit against Bradley County Schools has been dismissed. That suit involved a student at Waterville Elementary as they battled cancer. The student's family originally said the district denied homebound instruction to the student and required the student to return to in-person learning or

withdraw. The parents said the child's fragile immune system made it dangerous for her to be around other students.

WUUQ FM News 12/8/23 6:00am 1:00 Today is Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day. On December 7th 1941 24 hundred service members and civilians lost their lives in the 2 hour air raid by Japanese forces on the U.S. Naval Base in Hawaii. The attack shook America's confidence and pulled the country into World War II. Today marks 82 years since the attack.

WUUQ FM News 12/15/23 8:00am 1:00 Georgia's Department of Education is not using a letter system to grade the performance of its schools. The state published the component parts of that grade instead. Those parts include content mastery, progression and on-time graduation. This new system will also give different measurements for different grade levels. Those are divided into Pre-K through fifth grades nine through 12. State superintendent Richard Woods says it is unfair to measure schools with just a letter grade. Critics say the change could make it harder to measure a school's progress.

WUUQ FM News 12/19/23 7:00am 1:00 Two Bradley Central football players had their early signing day Friday. Boo Carter and Marcus Goree Jr. will be Tennessee Vols next fall. They will start school as mid-year enrollees which mean they will be able to practice with the team sooner. The two Bradley Central stars helped lead the Bears to a 13 and 1 record this fall.

They found a man with a non-serious gunshot wound. First responders took him to a local hospital. Police believe the victim and a suspect got into an argument inside an apartment and that's when the suspect went for a gun. Police say they are looking for that suspect.
WUUQ FM News	10/3/23	6:00am	1:00	Chattanooga police confirm they have a suspect in custody in connection to the shooting that killed Baylor alumni Christopher Wright. Officers says Darryl Roberts is currently being held in the Hamilton County Jail and Detention Center. Wright and Roberts got into an argument on Market Street Thursday night. At some point Roberts pulled out a gun and shot Wright. Officers are not sure if the two know each other.
WUUQ FM News	10/3/23	7:00am	1:00	HCSO tells us they're investigating a shooting that caused damage to multiple homes and vehicles. Deputies say they responded to a shots fired call at a short term rental property on Brently Estates Drive Friday night. Shortly after arriving deputies say an argument led to a fight and then shots were fired. While on scene HCSO says they found around 60 shell casings on the one block. Surveillance footage reveals 2 different vehicles may have been involved.
WUUQ FM News	10/5/23	8:00am	1:00	A suspect sits behind bars this morning after police linked him to shooting in Chattanooga last Thursday. An arrest report says William Hale shot Chad Knox after an argument. Knox told police the attack happened inside his home on Norman Lane and said he fought to take the gun from the suspect after he shot him in the leg. Hale faces an attempted murder charge.
WUUQ FM News	10/9/23	6:00am	1:00	The TBI is now investigating after a Hamilton County inmate died. The sheriff's office says an inmate was assaulted last Tuesday night. They add it appeared to be a deliberate and planned attack. The

inmate went to the hospital but passed away yesterday. The name of the inmate who died has not been released and no one has been charged.

WUUQ FM News 10/10/23 7:00am 1:00 We're working to learn why investigators were seen surrounding a duplex in Walker County overnight. It happened on Bragg Circle in Rossville. Walker County deputies were joined by investigators from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation. From 10 pm until one in the morning crime scene investigators searched the scene taking pictures and evidence from the house. Just after 12:30 they were seen pulling what looked to be a body bag out the house. The agencies wouldn't discuss it with us.

WUUQ FM News 10/10/23 8:00am 1:00 An investigation is underway after officials found a body in the parking lot of a Marion County restaurant early Sunday morning. The Tennessee Bureau of investigation told us her body will now undergo an autopsy. The TBI did not specify the name of the restaurant.

WUUQ FM News 10/11/23 6:00am 1:00 The Walker County Sheriff's Office says on Sunday night deputies were attempting to arrest James Cook who had an outstanding warrant. He locked himself in a room and when they forced the door open deputies say he shot at them hitting and wounding one deputy. Deputies then returned fire shooting Cook who was pronounced dead on the scene. The GBI says its medical examiner will perform an autopsy on Cook and they will continue an independent investigation. The injured deputy is expected to make a full recovery.

WUUQ FM News 10/12/23 7:00am 1:00 Hamilton County Sheriff Austin Garrett said he plans to assign more deputies to patrol the central business district. Those deputies will partner with Chattanooga police officers already in that area. The county mayor and DA said the death of Christopher Wright led them to make the change. They say staffing problems were also a factor. Recent numbers from CPD show Chattanooga has seen one more homicide this year compared to last year. But the department says crime overall is trending down.

WUUQ FM News 10/12/23 8:00am 1:00 A Hixson business owner faces several child abuse charges. Deputies say they arrested 42 year old Seth Cordell earlier this moth. The county clerk says he is the owner of S and C. Electric Company on Crescent Club Drive. An indictment says the victim was a minor and the abuse happened at least three separate times. Cordell's bond was set at 150 thousand dollars.

plays high school football faces battery charges in Whitfield County. That's after authorities say he hit another boy in the face with a gun. Deputies with the Whitfield County Sheriff's Office arrested "in Combs" last week. An arrest report says Combs hit the victim in the face with the gun after that victim and two others got mud on Combs's hoodie. The school suspended him for one football game according to a statement sent to us.

WUUQ FM News 11/9/23 7:00am 1:00 A mother of one of
the mass shooting victims from the Covenant School in Nashville is speaking today in the Chattanooga area. Katy Dieckhaus whose daughter Evelyn was tragically killed March 27th is a member of "Voices for a Safer Tennessee". The non-partisan group formed after the shooting lobbying for legislative action on gun safety in the state. Six people including 3 children were killed that day by a mass shooter. Dieckhaus is expected to speak at the "Church of the Good Shepherd" on Lookout Mountain at one p.m.

WUUQ FM News 11/10/23 6:00am 1:00 Two people from
Dalton are dead after a person accused of human trafficking smashed into their SUV. This happened in Texas according to a spokesperson with the Texas Department of Public Safety. That spokesman says a driver passed an 18 wheeler on the wrong side during a chase with police. That car then collided head on with the couple from Dalton who died after their SUV burst into flames. 5 other people including the suspected smuggler also died.

executive director of the Better Business Bureau described some of the holiday scams that have
started. She discussed the people they try to scam and the information they need to claim our
identity.

WUUQ FM News 11/20/23 8:00am 1:00 Chattanooga police
are looking for a suspect this morning who robbed a store in Hamilton Place Mall yesterday. It
happened at the Champion Store just before noon. Upon arrival an employee told police she was
robbed by an unknown male suspect. She said the man approached the counter and demanded
cash from the register. The employee complied with the suspects demands. The suspect then
took the money and left the store.

WUUQ FM News 11/20/23 6:00am 1:00 A Chattanooga man is
behind bars this morning after deputies seized weapons and a large amount of drugs. The
Hamilton County Sheriffs Office says it happened at home on Bradt Street. Deputies say they
found Brandon Ebherhardt trying to flush drugs down the toilet but arrested him before he could
finish. 28 thousand dollars worth of narcotics were found which includes 240 grams of fentanyl.

WUUQ FM News 11/21/23 7:00am 1:00 The last of the 4
inmates who escaped from a Georgia jail last month has been captured. According to the Bibb
County Sheriff's office Joey "Fourn-Yay" was captured near stockbridge just before noon
Sunday. Fourn-Yay will return to the Bibb County law enforcement center. He's accused of
murdering his ex-girlfriend last year. "Fourn-Yay" along with 3 other inmates escaped through a
damaged window in an interview room on October 16th.

WUUQ FM News 11/22/23 8:00am 1:00 Chattanooga police
say a person was killed in a shooting on Wilson Street. Officers tell us the victim died before
they got there. CPD says it happened around 8:30 yesterday morning in the Avondale
neighborhood. The department says they're investigating this as a homicide but they have not
released information about a potential suspect.

WUUQ FM News 11/23/23 6:00am 1:00 Police in East Ridge
are investigating a shooting that turned deadly. Officers say they responded to reports of a
person shot on Connell Street. Upon arrival they found a teen with a gunshot wound to the leg.
He was then transported to the hospital where he was pronounced dead. An investigation
remains underway.

WUUQ FM News 12/1/23 7:00am 1:00 Chattanooga police say one man is dead after a stabbing in Chattanooga. CPD says it happened on Garfield Street last night. That man died after being transported to the hospital according to CPD. No arrests have been made.

WUUQ FM News 12/1/23 6:00am 1:00 A Tennessee couple faces charges after police say they exposed a 1 year old child to drugs. Police arrested Regan Guffey and her boyfriend Justin Brumley in Nashville. Officers found them at an Air BNB. As arrest report says detectives found an array of drugs and guns inside their room all within reach of the child. Officers also found more than 400 dollars in cash.

WUUQ FM News 12/5/23 8:00am 1:00 One man faces charges after a chase with the Hamilton County Sheriff's office. Deputies tried to pull "Lance Rogers" over in Hixson Sunday morning around 3 o'clock. This after those deputies noticed his license plate did not match his car. Rogers ran from deputies in his car and then on foot. He ran into a creek where deputies finally caught up with him. Rogers also dropped a gun from his car as he ran. A report says he was involved in a car theft several days ago.

WUUQ FM News 12/5/23 7:00am 1:00 Chattanooga police say officers have arrested one man in connection with that stabbing last weekend on Garfield Street. The victim, Rosalio Gomez-Gutierrez died on Sunday. Police say they located the suspect in Michigan. He will now be extradited back to Hamilton County according to CPD.

WUUQ FM News 12/7/23 6:00am 1:00 A man accused of causing a deadly pedestrian crash in Chattanooga received his bond yesterday one million dollars. Police say Randy Vega killed 2 people and hurt one other when he drove onto the sidewalk and hit a business on Frazier Avenue. They also say he was intoxicated when it happened. If he pays that he'll remain on house arrest with an ankle monitor. Vega is set to appear in court again in January.

WUUQ FM News 12/8/23 7:00am 1:00 This morning the Hamilton County Sheriff's office continues their search for a teenager they say is behind several school lockdowns. Officials also told us the male teen may have been armed. The search began yesterday morning in the Birchwood Pike area of Harrison. The sheriff's office says the boy could try to harm himself with the weapon as well. We were told the search put 4 schools on secure status on Wednesday.

WUUQ FM News 12/8/23 8:00am 1:00 A controversial Chattanooga bar is heading back to the Chattanooga Beer Board this morning after months of complaints from residents in the area. They say noise coming from the bar lasts well into the early hours of the morning. Chattanooga police say they've received more than 20 complaints about the exile bar this year and they were cited twice in October.

WUUQ FM News 12/11/23 6:00am 1:00 The Hamilton County Sheriff's Office says their search for a missing teen is over. They say the young man died before they could find him near Harrison Bay Road. Several schools were placed on secure status as deputies searched the area. The Hamilton County Medical Examiner's Office is now working to determine how the teen died. The sheriff's office has offered their condolences to his family.

WUUQ FM News 12/12/23 7:00am 1:00 Chattanooga police have arrested a suspect believed to have shot a man on Market Street Friday night. CPD arrested 64 year Old Betty Blake for attempted first degree murder. She's accused of shooting a man in the back while he waited at Market Street bus stop. CPD tells us she's also facing assault charges after they say she brandished a firearm inside of Partridge Medical Center.

WUUQ FM News 12/13/23 6:00am 1:00 A former daycare worker in Bradley County faces charges after he allegedly kicked his son in the face. Deputies arrested Jeffrey Shook last Thursday.
