WUUQ FM New	7/11/23	6:00am	1:00	Mueller Manufacturing in Chattanooga says they will cut jobs. This follows a machinist union strike in January ending with a 4 year contract. Mueller sent us a statement saying the staff cuts come from less market demand and expectations for lower production in the coming years.
WUUQ FM New	7/18/23	7:00am	1:00	Members of Fire Crews in New Hope, Tennessee have left the department. That includes the chief. Workers there say they've resigned and turned in their gear. They say the city's mayor Mark Myers is denying the department new equipment and worker's compensation.
WUUQ FM New	7/20/23	8:00am	1:00	Governor Bill Lee made the last stop of his "Build With Us Tour" near Apison Pile yesterday afternoon. The tour highlights the governors transportation modernization act which includes 3.4 billion dollars. It introduces a new funding model to bring roads faster and cheaper without raising taxes. Governor Bill Lee said another priority is making sure development of more roads will keep up with the increasing growth throughout the state.
WUUQ FM New	7/21/23	6:00am	1:00	Roper Corporation says new upgrades at their Walker County plant will bring hundreds of jobs to that area. The changes include new assembly line technology and robots on the site. Roper invested 118 million dollars into the new assembly lines, presses and robots. The vice president of manufacturing for GE Appliances says the additions will not take or replace the jobs of workers already on the assembly line.
WUUQ FM New	7/21/23	7:00am	1:00	A retail manufacturing company is in the process of consolidating and now it's Chattanooga plant will be affected. Arcade Beauty says they will close their facility along Amnicola Highway putting 84 workers out of a job. The company filed a warning notice with Tennessee's Department of Labor two weeks ago. The plant is expected to close at the end of August.
WUUQ FM New	7/25/23	8:00am	1:00	It's almost time for students to head back to school and two upcoming holidays are looking to help parents spend less at the register. The first is the annual Back to School sales tax holiday which starts this Friday July 28th. The other is the grocery sales tax holiday. That starts August 1st and will last until October 31st.

WUUQ FM New 7/26/23 6:00am 1:00 Governor Bill Lee's office announced millions of dollars in grants this week to expand broadband access. It includes 185 million dollars statewide. The "Last Mile" portion of the program will include areas in Polk County that need broadband coverage. The state considers parts of that area "underserved".

WUUQ FM New 8/2/23 7:00am 1:00 Trucking giant "Yellow Corp" has ceased all operations and is on the verge of filing bankruptcy according to industry experts. The company has roughly one and a half billion dollars in outstanding debt as of March. Yellow averted a strike with the teamsters union earlier this month after the company failed to contribute to its pension and health insurance plans. Yellow has not released a public statement about the shutdown.

WUUQ FM New 8/3/23 8:00am 1:00 A plan to put new developments on hold in part of Hamilton County is now itself on hold. We told you how commissioner Steve Highlander wanted an 18 month pause on new rezoning along Hunter Road. Highlander told us he and Mayor Weston Wamp have a plan to create a new task force. One to look at traffic concerns in the area and the plans to rezone a subdivision.

Issues Chattanooga 8/6/23 4:45am 15:00 Gary Thurman from Guardian Investment Advisors joined us. He explained how to find the best way to prepare for the future. He described how to use interest in our investment to our advantage once we retire.

WUUQ FM New 8/11/23 6:00am 1:00 Hamilton County's Mayor announced new staff positions for his office this week but some commissioners spoke out against the change. Mayor Weston Wamp says former Chattanooga Police Chief David is now the county's chief operating officer. Finance director Lee Browner is now CFO. He says their positions will be funded through the million dollars of extra revenue included in the county budget for the mayor's office. Some commissioners think the money will not reach the workers on the ground.

WUUQ FM New 8/17/23 7:00am 1:00 U.S. Senator from Tennessee Marsha Blackburn was at UTC yesterday discuss Chattanooga's plans for a quantum network. EPB has said they hope to integrate the new technology into the fiber optic system which could bring faster computing improved cyber security and AI programs to the scenic city.

WUUQ FM New 8/23/23 8:00am 1:00 140 new jobs are coming to Bradley County after the Kroger Grocery chain announced it's building a new

distribution operations facility there. A release from Tennessee's Department of Economic and Community Development says it will be known as a central fill facility the 5th such location in the United States. We're told by a department spokesperson that Kroger anticipates an opening in the fourth quarter of this year.

WUUQ FM New 9/29/23 6:00am 1:00 The City of
Chattanooga now facing a lawsuit over its short term vacation rental policy. Back in May the city approved a new policy that allows properties where a home owner lives full time to be used as an STVR in every commercial zone that has hotels as well as in any residential zone in the existing overlay. A group of property owners say the policy is unconstitutional because it draws a distinction between owner-occupied STVR's and non-owner occupied.

WUUQ FM New 7/21/23 7:00am 1:00 An old school prank in Ooltewah ended in charges for one homeowner. That's after an affidavit we received says the victim of a "ding dong ditch" prank pulled a gun on the kids responsible. Gary Jordan told Hamilton County Deputies he wanted to catch the kids in the act. An affidavit says Jordan claims to have come out from behind a bush and told the kids he had a gun. Jordan denies pointing a gun at the kids. Deputies charged him with 4 aggravated assault charges.

WUUQ FM New 7/24/23 6:00am 1:00 The Hamilton County School Board approved a policy...restricting students use of cellphones last night. The proposal contains 3 primary restrictions. No taking photos or recording videos of any kind on school grounds. No recording fights on school grounds or at school events. No sharing of recordings taken outside of school that cause harm toward students.

WUUQ FM New 7/24/23 8:00am 1:00 A spokesman with the City of Chattanooga tells us. The Historic Zoning Commission moved to designate part of the Chattanooga School for the Arts and Sciences as a historic landmark. At one point thousands of residents signed a petition to preserve the school after a 20-20 proposal recommended the building be closed. Hamilton County schools told us last month they had no plans to shut down the school.

WUUQ FM New 7/27/23 7:00am 1:00 Florida governor and republican presidential candidate Ron Desantis was in involved in a car accident in Chattanooga yesterday. It happened on I-75 south near the highway 153 exit. Desantis had fundraisers scheduled here in our Knoxville and the Nashville area. All the vehicles in the crash were part of his motorcade. The governor was not hurt but one of his staffers was treated for a minor injury.

WUUQ FM New 8/3/23 6:00am 1:00 Students across Grundy County are expected to return to school next Monday. The Grundy County sheriff's office tells us they will have some form of security present at each school in the district. The schools that will not have SRO Certified Officers are Pelham Elementary. They will have off-duty officers who are only post-certified but can still perform all of the same duties as an SRO.

WUUQ FM New 8/8/23 7:00am 1:00 Some students in our area are already back in class while others will start this week. As parents dish out money for school supplies scammers are ready to make a profit. Many of these scams happen online especially on social media. The Better Business Bureau says to pay attention at ads that pop up on your feed. A good deal you see online for a supply you need might not be what it seems.

WUUQ FM New 8/8/23 8:00am 1:00 Congratulations are in order for one Cleveland High School wrestler who became an international champion this week. Friday Piper Fowler took home a gold medal in the 73 kilogram category at the U-17 World Championships in Turkey. The 5 to 2 victory over her opponent from Germany now makes her a world champion.

WUUQ FM New 8/15/23 6:00am 1:00 UTC is mourning the loss of a legendary basketball coach. The university announced former men's coach and long time assistant Henry Dickerson passed away. Dickerson became the first African American coach to lead the men's team. He also served as an associate Coach under Hall of Fame, Mack McCarthy for 8 seasons. Dickerson was head coach for five years. He was 71 years old.

WUUQ FM New 8/16/23 7:00am 1:00 We're now less than a week away from the legislative special session in Nashville. If passed one bill would require schools to train teachers and students on how to respond to an active shooter in addition to fire threats. An initiative from the Senate Republican Caucus would increase the penalty for threatening mass violence from a misdemeanor to a felony. Democrats have shown cautious support as some are worried the session could be used to jam "harmful" legislation through.

WUUQ FM New 8/18/23 8:00am 1:00 After more than 100 years of serving Chattanooga the restaurant Zarzour's is closing. Owner Joe Dixie Fuller tells us the restaurant has run its course. Since 1918 the restaurant has been in service and Fuller just wants to "Thank You".

Issues Chattanooga 8/20/23 4:45am 15:00 Editor of City Scope magazine George Mullinax discussed the "Friday Night Lights" that have started many years ago. It is to promote the athletic department in local schools and encourage students to get involved in school activities.

WUUQ FM New 9/6/23 6:00am 1:00 55 years after serving in Vietnam Army Captain Larry Taylor received the Medal of Honor for his heroism. The nation's highest military award was presented by president Biden at the White House yesterday. Taylor's quick thinking back in 1968 saved four of his fellow soldiers during a raging firefight in Vietnam. During Tuesday's ceremony President Biden said "when duty called, Larry did everything to answer."

WUUQ FM New 9/7/23 7:00am 1:00 The University of Tennessee System will expand eligibility for the UT Promise Scholarship. This means more students will now get the chance to go to college for free as the Tennessee Promise program gets ready to serve a larger number of families. By raising the household income threshold from 60 to 75 thousand so more people are eligible. The UT Promise changes into effect for the fall 2024 semester and comes with an additional 500 dollars to offset costs.

WUUQ FM New 9/7/23 8:00am 1:00 After receiving the Medal of Honor from President Biden Tuesday Chattanooga's own Larry Taylor was formally inducted into the US Army Hall of Heroes at the Pentagon in Washington yesterday. The ceremony included several speeches from the country's highest military leaders and Taylor himself. This upcoming Monday, Medal of Honor Heritage Center and the City of Chattanooga's "Veterans Council" are expected to host a welcome home parade on September 11th in Taylor's honor.

WUUQ FM New 9/11/23 6:00am 1:00 Hamilton County will remember the 9/11/terrorist attacks and welcome home a medal of honor recipient. The city of Chattanooga, the county and the Medal of Honor Heritage Center are set to honor Vietnam veteran Captain Larry Taylor with a parade. He received the highest honor a service member can receive last week from President Biden. Today's parade will take place at 11:30 in downtown Chattanooga in front of the Read House. It will end at a big stage in front of the Medal of Honor Heritage Center.

WUUQ FM New 9/19/23 7:00am 1:00 School resource officers are coming to East Ridge Schools. The East Ridge City Council unanimously approved

a 300 thousand dollar grant funding plan last week. When they move city officers into the schools as SRO's that means the city officers will then need to be filled. They also accepted money for a drone.

WUUQ FM New 9/28/23 8:00am 1:00 A UTC student's work earned him an international award. Juan Pena is on the Robotics Team at UTC. He just got back from turkey with his award winning Robotic Hand. Pena says he developed the prosthetic to improve stroke victims' lives. A glove on the working hand contains sensors. Means movement on that Hand can be mirrored to the non-working Hand.

The victim was later taken to the hospital. Police identified Jason Williams as the suspect. They say there's no threat to the public.
WUUQ FM New	7/4/23	7:00am	1:00	A man accused of setting fire to a Chattanooga house that killed his mother was convicted of the crime over the weekend. A jury found Joshua Wells guilty of first degree murder and aggravated arson according to the Chattanooga. You may recall the 2016 fire on Rubio Street killed Kimberly Wells. The murder conviction carries a life prison sentence.
WUUQ FM New	7/7/23	8:00am	1:00	The Hamilton County sheriff's office now confirms that an inmate was assaulted at Silverdale Detention Center Tuesday. Our crews that were on scene saw a victim put in an ambulance. HCSO now says that person was given medical care but did not want to press charges against the person responsible for the attack.
WUUQ FM New	7/10/23	6:00am	1:00	Chattanooga police say drunk drivers are being taken off the road in high numbers. Police add year to date they've seen 33% increase in proactive DUI enforcement. Plus crimes against persons are down 3% year to date. Crimes against properties are down 34%.
WUUQ FM New	7/10/23	7:00am	1:00	An attorney for the man charged in a UTC's student death last year says his client is being mistreated in jail. Jason Chen faces first degree pre-meditated murder and abuse of a corpse charges in the death of Jasmin Pace. Chen's attorney told us he's dealing with disgusting conditions at Silverdale and has been denied necessities. We reached out to the sheriff's office about those condition's and accusations but have not heard back.
WUUQ FM New	7/10/23	8:00am	1:00	A woman police say impersonated an Erlanger nurse and removed I-V's from elderly patients was in court yesterday morning. The suspect, Lydia Brock faces 9 charges in the case from late last month. A Hamilton County judge pushed Brock's case to a later date. For now she will not be allowed to have any contact with anyone at Erlanger. She's also not allowed onto the facility.

A Soddy Daisy man faces charges after a search found almost a million dollars worth of drugs at his home. It included eight pounds of fentanyl, 10 pounds of meth and two pounds of pot. Deputies also found 12 guns. Deputies say Joshua Mills tried to run when they showed up at his home last Thursday. He now faces charges for drug possession, weapons and theft.

WUUQ FM New 7/12/23 6:00am 1:00 A 911 call led to a Pikeville man getting charged with murder yesterday morning. That's according to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigations. It happened around 8 am after someone called to report a possible homicide. The TBI says they found 24 year old "Dara Jade Butler" deceased inside a home on Cherry Road. Investigators later identified 38 year old "Clayton Matthew Watson" as the man responsible for the death. Authorities say Watson is charged with first degree murder and was booked into the White County Jail.

WUUQ FM New 7/12/23 8:00am 1:00 A Bradley County inmate has died in police custody. That's according to the Bradley County Sheriff's Office. Deputies say the inmate was found unresponsive last night at the jail complex and was later transported to Tennova Hospital where they were pronounced dead. Local authorities have turned the case over to the TBI.

WUUQ FM New 7/13/23 7:00am 1:00 We now know the identity of the Bradley County inmate who died in police custody late Monday night. The county's sheriff's office says Eric Means from McDonald, Tennessee was found unresponsive at the jail complex. He was transported to Tennova Hospital and later pronounced dead. BCSO has turned over the case to the TBI.

WUUQ FM New 7/17/23 6:00am 1:00 A soccer coach accused of drugging and raping boys has admitted he entered the U.S. illegally. According to the Franklin Police Department dozens of disturbing between the ages of 9 and 17 were reportedly found on Camilo Campos' phone. The crimes came to light when a restaurant worker found Campo's cellphone after he left it behind. The department of Homeland Security is now involved in the case.

WUUQ FM New 7/17/23 7:00am 1:00 A local animal hospital responded to allegations of animal neglect and unsanitary conditions. Former workers had told us staff at Brainerd Hills Veterinary animals and reused dirty syringes. Attorneys tell us the unsealed syringes were not used for injections rather for oral medicine or water for the animals. They tell us those syringes are washed out and dirty syringes are never used on animals.

WUUQ FM New 7/17/23 8:00am 1:00 This weekend will mark a somber anniversary in Chattanooga. Sunday marks the 8th anniversary since the terrorist attack that killed four marines and a navy sailor. Muhammad Abul-Azeez arrived at the military recruiting center on Lee Highway firing hundreds of rounds. Somehow only one person was shot in the leg. Abdul-Azeez then left Lee Highway crashed into the Naval Occupational Support Center on Amnicola Highway and unleashed a barrage of fire killing the men now known as the "Fallen 5." In the years since Chattanooga has honored the fallen and their families with several permanent memorials.

WUUQ FM New 7/17/23 8:00am 1:00 A Chattanooga based dermatologist has agreed to pay millions of dollars to the federal government to settle fraud claims. The DOJ says Dr. John Chung will pay 6.6 million dollars for submitting false claims to federal healthcare programs. The department says the doctor billed patients for procedures he said he performed but were actually performed by someone else.

WUUQ FM New 7/17/23 6:00am 1:00 The man accused of killing Chattanooga College student Jasmin Pace was in court yesterday and he wants a new preliminary hearing. He'll have to wait until next week for a decision. Jason Chen's attorney wants to vacate the murder indictment against him and hold that new hearing. The judge is expected to hear the defense's motion on July 25th.

WUUQ FM New 7/24/23 7:00am 1:00 Chattanooga police say they're still seeing Kia and Hyundais stolen from around the city and say videos posted online continue to make it easy for thieves to drive off in the cars. Police said that as of July 18th the city has seen an increase of 77% of Kias and Hyundais stolen. This year its at 122.

WUUQ FM New 7/24/23 8:00am 1:00 Chattanooga Police make an arrest in connection to a car theft that left one woman injured. Officers say Tredarius Hubbard along with an identified teenage boy face charges after one of them stole a vehicle from a woman. The woman tried to stop him but the teen hit her with the car and then led police on a chase from Hickory Valley Road. The teen then ditched the car and got into another one driven by Hubbard. The two were later arrested at an apartment complex in East Ridge.

WUUQ FM New 7/25/23 6:00am 1:00 A deadly police standoff in Ringgold Friday evening left 2 people dead. A deputy in Catoosa County injured. This happened just off of Highway 41. Sheriff Gary Sisk tells us that a call about someone with a gun came in around 5:40 pm. Deputies arrived to find a man in the road dead and then started getting shot at themselves. Deputies then made their way inside a home where the suspect was.

WUUQ FM New 7/26/23 7:00am 1:00 A drive by shooting in Alton Park killed a teenage boy last night. That's according to the Chattanooga Police Department. Police responded to the on the 200 block of water street just before 9 pm. Officers were told that a teen boy was shot after a suspicious vehicle drove by that area and opened fire. Life saving efforts were performed on the 17 year old but he died on scene.

WUUQ FM New 7/27/23 8:00am 1:00 The Tennessee Highway patrol is recruiting and has a new offer to bring in new troopers. As of this month new recruits have a starting pay of 65 thousand dollars and can earn up to 100 thousand after 10 years of service. The deadline to apply is July 31st. Training classes start in November.

WUUQ FM New 8/1/23 6:00am 1:00 Two people are injured after a shooting at overnight drive. Chattanooga police say it happened around 3 yesterday afternoon in the parking lot a local Carmax. They say a 20 year old woman and a 25 year old man were driving when shots were fired at them. The man was hit by gunfire twice and shrapnel and debris injured the woman. Police believe the shooting suspect fled the scene heading southbound on I-75.

WUUQ FM New 8/2/23 7:00am 1:00 A 24 year old man was taken to the hospital after a shooting on Fagan Street yesterday. According to Chattanooga police when they arrived on scene they found the man suffering from a gunshot wound to the stomach. They say he was shot by someone driving through the area. There's no word on his current condition.

WUUQ FM New 8/3/23 8:00am 1:00 Tennessee State Health Inspectors gave the Marion County Jail a failing grade. That inspection happened back on July 18th. Their report says the female inmate area did not have enough space and there was not enough showers or toilet for the amount of female inmates held there. They also found black growth in that bathroom area. Inspectors also revealed the disciplinary board at the jail does not meet state standards.

WUUQ FM New 8/8/23 6:00am 1:00 The TBI is expected to send a team to Caolmont to investigate a possible third case of arson in the destruction of a historical family restaurant and general store. Sam't Place on Highway 56 was completely destroyed by fire when the can came in around 5 Saturday morning. First responders say no one was hurt. The building had no power and was unoccupied after a previous fire suspected as arson.

WUUQ FM New 8/9/23 7:00am 1:00 A man in Chattanooga faces 14 charges including attempted murder after police say he threw powdered fentanyl into the face of 2 officers on Friday. Chattanooga housing authority officers arrested Rodney Bates on Friday. An affidavit says 2 officers tried to stop a black jeep Cherokee for a window tint violation. After finding a backpack full of blue fentanyl pills officers placed Bates in the back of a patrol car. Bates then somehow climbed over the back seat and threw the powder into their faces.

WUUQ FM New 8/9/23 8:00am 1:00 An inmate at the Hamilton County jail faces more charges after police say he made several threats using a phone at the jail. Authorities say Robert Millsaps made 20 different calls which included a county judge the Federal Courthouse and a bonding company. Three calls reportedly included terroristic threats where Millsaps said he would bomb a home and various courtrooms. Investigators say he's a member of the "Aryan Nation" white supremacist gang.

WUUQ FM New 8/10/23 6:00am 1:00 Chattanooga Police continue their search for a suspect they say stabbed a woman several times yesterday morning. They say it happened after an argument with an unknown male. CPD says the woman drove away and made it to an apartment complex on Oakwood Drive before passing out and crashing the vehicle. First responders took her to the hospital with life threatening injuries.
