That's according to new data from the Tennessee Department of Education released Wednesday. As much as 38% of Hamilton County students who failed the test retook it. 14% improved their scores but not enough to move to the next grade. Those students will need to take summer school, summer camp or tutoring. Parents also have the option to file an appeal in some cases.

The petition called for making the Chattanooga School for the Arts and Sciences, a local historic landmark. It was spurred by fears that a new task force created by the county mayor's office could shut the school down. A spokesperson for Hamilton County Schools told us they currently have no plans to close CSAS.

Chattanooga Police say they're still working to find out what led up to the first 911 call at the hospital.

up to the hospital with life-threatening gun shot wounds. Chattanooga police ask anyone with any information regarding this incident to give them a call.

WUUQ FM News 4/19/23 6:00am 1:00 A third party security guard assigned to Brainerd High School was indicted on criminal charges for an incident at the school. 49 year old Josephus Reed Jr. faces charges of aggravated assault and impersonation of a licensed professional. We interviewed the parent of a student who accused Reed of striking her son at the school on January 5th. We later learned that Brainerd High's principal Dr. Crystal Sorrells hired Reed's security company without prior authorization from the school district. She was suspended but returned to her position due to what they called her "exemplary record".

WUUQ FM News 4/19/23 7:00am 1:00 The Illinois man who led Grundy County deputies on a high speed pursuit to Lookout Mountain had warrants for his arrest. The Dade County sheriff's office says Barry May of Waukegan, Illinois crashed his U-Haul van on Highway 136 Sunday night. Deputies then had to rescue him from the crash after he hit a concrete barrier and flipped over. He was taken to the hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

WUUQ FM News 4/19/23 8:00am 1:00 The Sequatchie County Sheriff's office says they had the biggest meth bust in county history this past week and five people were charged. Law enforcement found 23 thousand dollars worth of meth on Old Miller Road on Signal Mountain.

They say a man was acting strangely Tuesday morning and made comments to staff at City Cafe saying "Call the police, I'll shoot them too". The package he left put nearby schools and businesses on a soft lockdown. Law enforcement decided to detonate the bag but there were just personal items inside of it.

WUUQ FM News 4/21/23 7:00am 1:00 In Alabama police have arrested two teenage boys and a third suspect in connection with the mass shooting at a sweet 16 birthday party last weekend that left 4 people dead and dozens injured. Alabama police say 17 year old Ty-Reik McCullough and 16 year old Travis McCullough and 20 year old Wilson Hill Jr are each charged with four counts of reckless murder. Prosecutors say they'll charge the teens as adults.

Tim Kelly wants state lawmakers to take action on gun violence. Kelly along with three other  
mayors in the state sent a letter with changes they'd like to see in Tennessee. They asked for

requiring school threat-assessment teams.

lawmakers who voted to expel 3 democrats 2 weeks ago resigned yesterday. This comes weeks  
after a committee found him guilty of sexually harassing at least one legislative intern.  
Representative Scotty Campbell served as vice chair of the House Republican Caucus. Reports  
cite house speaker Cameron Sexton saying Campbell violated the workplace discrimination and  
harassment policy.

recovering from gun shot wounds this morning after a shooting on Peoples Street Sunday night.  
According to Chattanooga Police that call came in just after 8 pm. A man with bullet wounds

non-life threatening injuries arrived at the hospital saying he was second victim in the shooting.  
CPD is still working out all the details.

had his bond reduced from 250 thousand dollars to 25 thousand dollars not long after getting out  
of jail. Chattanooga police charged Marvin Menifee in connection of the deadly shooting of  
Deountay Brown. Police say he's also connected to the murder of Alred Pitmon back in October  
of 2021. Menifee now faces two murder charges.

WUUQ FM News 4/27/23 6:00am 1:00 A scam alert from the  
Hamilton County Sheriff's office. They want to get the word out that someone is calling people  
in the community saying they have outstanding warrants for their arrest with the county. The  
scammers claim in order to dismiss the warrant you must purchase a pre-loaded debit card and  
pay a removal fee. County officials say they would never solicit money from a citizen this way.

WUUQ FM News 4/28/23 7:00am 1:00 A man and woman in  
Chattanooga face charges after police say an autopsy found fentanyl in their two year old son's  
system. Chattanooga police arrested Taiwan great house and Brittany Bell. CPD says they  
brought the child to the hospital with signs of distress. He died shortly after. Great-house and  
Bell face 4 charges including felony murder and premeditated first degree murder.

WUUQ FM News    5/1/23            6:00am            1:00            After Fentanyl was found in the autopsy of a two year old. Chattanooga police told us negligence was a major factor in the child's death. Taiwan Greathouse and Brittany Bell were arrested and face several charges including felony murder. Their son Montana Greathouse died last month. Chief homicide prosecutor Michael Dowd says the couple quote "knowingly exposed all three of their children to a significantly large amount of drugs" end quote. He feels that does not qualify as negligence.

WUUQ FM News    5/1/23            8:00am            1:00            Hamilton County is working to memorialize victims lost to violence. Thursday the county revealed a memorial remembering those victims. They also noted that more can be done to make the county safer. Mayor Weston Wamp says an increase in homicides and recent shootings are an indicator that the county needs to do more.

WUUQ FM News    5/2/23            7:00am            1:00            Three men including two juveniles are facing multiple charges this morning after police say a man fired a gun at the two in the parking lot of Hamilton Place Mall over the weekend. Chattanooga police say Montrel Price was the gunman. Police located price in the 9000 Block of Lawford Way. He's charged with aggravated assault, felony reckless endangerment, and vandalism. Viewers sent us pictures of the bullet holes in their vehicles left behind. No one was injured. Two other juveniles involved in the shooting were also charged in the incident.

WUUQ FM News    5/4/23            6:00am            1:00            The homicide prosecutor at the Hamilton County DA's office Michael Dowd has resigned. Dowd tells us he was asked to resign over statements he made about the TBI their crime lab and how long it takes to process materials. DA Coty Wamp tells us she asked him to resign saying there were quote "multiple factors" that were considered in this decision.

WUUQ FM News    5/5/23            8:00am            1:00            A scare for Chattanooga children and parents as police rushed to Brainerd High School in large numbers Wednesday after a call of shots fired. The call turned out to be false but that did not stop officers from searching classrooms and hallways for a potential shooter. Dozens of law enforcement vehicles arrived on the Brainerd campus. Our station's affiliated across the state say they say similar responses to other fake calls.

WUUQ FM News    5/8/23            7:00am            1:00            Mayor Tim Kelly's Station Street executive order ended last night which closed businesses at 1am. But the city of rolling out a new 30 day safety plan to keep patrons safe. It includes several stations safe. It

includes several Stations Street business owners chipping in to help pay for off-duty officers to patrol the street. This funding will provide for two off duty officers from 9pm until 3am with an additional 7 off duty officers from 11pm to 3 am.

WUUQ FM News    5/8/23            8:00am            1:00            Chattanooga's Beer Board penalized "American Tow and Recover" after they towed dozens of cars from a Wal-Mart parking lot. They can still tow but they're suspended from the city's call rotation list for the next 30 days. The company admitted to the board they overcharged drivers and the company's attorney says they've refunded victims. American tow's attorney sent us a statement saying they plan to appeal the decision.

WUUQ FM News    5/10/23            6:00am            1:00            A woman turned herself in after Collegedale Police say she stabbed someone Sunday night. Christine Wolfersheim was booked on aggravated domestic assault charges. It happened at a house on Chestnut Creek Road. Investigators say they found the victim on the kitchen floor with knife wounds. The victim is in the hospital recovering. Wolfersheim sits in jail on a 15 thousand dollar bond.

WUUQ FM News    5/15/23            7:00am            1:00            Natalee Holloway went missing back in 2005 during a trip to Aruba. Police there say she was last seen with Vander Sloot, a Dutch National. He will soon be extradited to Birmingham after prosecutors say he demanded 250 thousand dollars from Holloway's mother in exchange for information about her death. Vander Sloot is currently in prison in Peru for a separate murder case.

WUUQ FM News    5/16/23            6:00am            1:00            Two people are in the hospital and two suspects are in custody after a shooting. That is according to the East Ridge Police Department. ERPD says the two suspects left the scene in a car. Police found that car later crashed into a tree. Police arrested the two suspects who had abandoned the car. The two people shot were hit in their legs.

WUUQ FM News    5/16/23            7:00am            1:00            A Chattanooga woman faces several charges after police say she shot a member of her family early yesterday morning. Chattanooga Police have Ashley Taylor in custody. They say she got into an argument with a family member went to get a gun then shot that family member. CPD says the victim's wounds were not life-threatening. Taylor faces domestic assault, reckless endangerment and possession of a gun while intoxicated charges.

WUUQ FM News 5/16/23 8:00am 1:00 Developing out of McMinn County a jury found Christopher Young guilty of first-degree murder for the death of Donna Riggins back in 2020. It all started on Valentine's Day more than three years ago after a relative found Riggins' body in her home on County Road 105. An investigation by the McMinn County Sheriff's Office and the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation eventually led back to Young. A judge sentenced him to life in prison without the possibility of parole.

WUUQ FM News 5/19/23 6:00am 1:00 Tennessee lawmakers continued to push for the unreacted release of the Covenant School shooter's manifesto. On Monday the Covenant School filed a motion to stop the release of those writings. Over the last few weeks both the National Police Association and Tennessee Firearms Association have filed for its release. Tennessee Governor Bill Lee has called a special session of the General Assembly to focus on public safety.

WUUQ FM News 5/22/23 7:00am 1:00 There won't be any fireworks at the Athens Regional Park on July 4th this year and we now know the reason why. A man's pending lawsuit against several city officials appears to have forced the cancellation.
