Sample News stories on covered on 10/1/2013:

- 1) Will the cross stay or will it go? A national organization has asked the city of Frankenmuth to take down a 55-foot cross erected in the late 1970s in a public park. Washington D.C.-based Americans United for Separation of Church and State first sent a letter seeking the cross' removal to the city in July. A response is expected by the end of this week. The organization says the cross violates the U.S. Constitution. The Frankenmuth Parks and Recreation website states the white cross "is a tribute to the religious background of the Frankenmuth community."
- 2) Flint's lockup open once again, after being closed back in 2008. The Genesee County Sheriff's Department is running the holding facility, which is housed inside the Flint Police Department. The state of Michigan is paying for the more than \$2 million one-year contract.
- 3)Monday marked the first day of the federal government's new fiscal year, but financial analysts say we are headed toward what's being called a fiscal cliff. Congress and the president must reach a budget deal by December 31. That is the day that several tax cuts will expire, and big cuts in federal spending will take hold. According to the non-partisan Tax Policy Center, the U.S. is on the threshold of one of the largest tax increases in history, a tax hike that could average \$3,500 for every American household.
- 4)Union leaders want striking Detroit Water and Sewerage workers to comply with a judge's order and get back to work. Despite the request, the Michigan AFSCME Council 25 President said Monday that the union understands "the frustration felt by the hard working men and women in the water department." A few dozen workers went on strike Sunday in protest of plans by the city to lay off many of them and privatize some of the work.
- 5)The cleanup effort is underway in Shiawassee County's Byron, after fire ripped through its downtown historical district. Janelle's Restaurant and Tower Hardware are a complete loss. Fire investigators believe the fire started in an apartment up above the eatery on South Saginaw.

6)scary moment on American airlines flights Monday when Seats on two American Airlines jetliners came loose in rare occurrences that prompted the company to inspect eight Boeing planes. There were no reports of injuries to passengers on either 757 aircraft. American said that an internal investigation indicated there could be "a possible issue" with a certain model of seats and "how they fit" into tracking used to secure them.

7)Get your wallets out... again... The Lansing Board of Water and Light approved an increase in electric and steam rates last year which went into effect Monday. Residential and commercial electric rates have increased by 3 and 3.25 percent and steam rates are facing a 2 percent increase. You can expect to see an average increase of \$2.67 in your bill.

8)Lansing has made the list of the best small metro college areas on the The American Institute for Economic Research ranking. The group takes into account such things as the number of students in the population, the cost of rent, the numbers of cultural and entertainment venues in the area and professional opportunities. Ann Arbor got the number one spot.

9)Honda is recalling more than half a million of its popular Accord vehicles because of a potential fire risk in their engines. Honda said Accord V6's from model years 2003-2007 are covered under the recall. The power steering hoses in these cars are at risk of leaking, creating smoke and potentially sparking engine fires, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. So far, no crashes or injuries have been reported.
