Sample News stories covered:

10/6 General Motors announced another recall over the weekend for more than 60-thousand vehicles. The largest recall outlined on Saturday affects Pontiac G8s from the 2008 through the 2009 model years. GM says the ignition switch key may shift from the "run" position when touched by the driver's knee. The company is aware of one crash related to the problem, but no injuries.

10/14 Community leaders in Genesee County will hold a town hall meeting on Oct.15th for the public to discuss a controversial pipeline project proposed for the southern part of the county. State Rep. Joseph Graves is holding the town hall to share what the pipeline company told him at a meeting last week. The hour long question and answer session will take place at Holly High School auditorium.

- 10/20 Students looking to go to college at Eastern Michigan University could have the possibility of finding more financial aid next year. The school announced that it will increase the amount of financial aid available to students by nearly \$4 million dollars. Of the \$48 million dollars available to students, \$33.5 million will be used for undergraduate scholarships, awards and grants.
- 11/3 The efforts of Detroit officials and public safety workers and volunteers helped limit the number of arsons during the three-day Halloween period. The city had 97 reported fires between Wednesday and Friday. It was the fourth year in a row that the Angels' Night period had fewer than 100 fires. In 1984, Detroit had more than 800 fires during the period.
- 11/14 The Michigan Senate finally approved a long-term plan designed to raise more than \$1 billion dollars a year in new revenue to fix the state's roads. It has now gone to the House for further consideration with only nine scheduled session days remaining this year. The proposed gas tax would effectively rise to 25 cents in April, 31 cents in 2016, 36 cents in 2017 and 41 cents in 2018.
- 11/26 Utility crews across the state are working to restore power to the quarter of a million homes and businesses in the dark after high winds Monday. DTE Energy Co. said tens of thousands of its customers were still without power on Tuesday. In Flint, 20 vehicles piled up early Tuesday, closing an I-475 and I-69 ramp.
- 12/4 Under pressure from federal regulators, Honda is expanding a recall of driver's side air bags to all 50 states. The air bags, made by Takata Corp., can deploy with too much force, sending metal shrapnel into the passenger compartment. Takata insists that current recalls in high-humidity areas only are enough. But the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration wants the recalls expanded nationwide after some incidents outside the high-humidity zones.
- 12/18 A Consumers Energy wind park is now up and running and serving electric customers in Michigan's Thumb. The Cross Winds Energy Park includes 62 wind turbines and can generate 111 megawatts. Consumers Energy says the park's completion means it has met Michigan's pending standard of 10 percent renewable energy production ahead of the requirement deadline in 2015.
- 12/30 Fiat Chrysler is recalling tens of thousands of model year 2006 and 2007pickups because of an ignition switch problem. It could prevent the cars from starting, or cause them to move when the ignition key is turned. Chrysler says the problem has claimed one life. The vehicles include: the Dodge Dakota, Dodge Ram 1500, 2500, 3500 and Mitsubishi Raider pickups.
