October 1, 2014 to December 31, 2014

NBC4 attempts to serve the public interest by presenting broadcast material that treats significant issues of the people in central Ohio. The push to improve quality also will mean the showroom debut of Honda's HR-V, a small version of the Marysville-made CR-V crossover, will be delayed. : 35 in length
