Discussed their upcoming Fields Of Faith event. Talked about the roll FCA plays in kids lives, giving them direction, talked about the roll athletics plays in students lives, discussed the improved academics and how it lessens the likelyhood of a kid getting in trouble with the law and increases the likelyhood that they will go on to higher education. Redeemed Church has been a pillar of the community for 20 years and is relaunching in a new location. As part of their relaunch they are sponsoring a Stuff The Bus campaign for Christmas Cheer of Alamance County. Christmas Cheer provides Christmas presents for kids in families facing dire economic circumstances and is driven by the community. **POV, FY** 

**10/21/22 8a-8:30a** Kurt Ward, India Kingery, and Scott Reavis talked with Chris Allen about the upcoming Mt. Zion Baptist Association Annual Meeting. Chris is a former cocain addict who once faced a \$300 a day addiction. Chris talked about his road to recovery and the impossability of doing it on your own. Chris was also literally lost when he was lost at sea on a raft for three days before being rescued by the Coast Guard. Disussed programs in place for addiction, including Living Free Ministries which is a local Alamance County based non profit. Discussed what leads to addictions and the path to recovery. **CD. AR** 

**10/25/22 8a-8:30a** Kurt Ward, India Kingery, and Scott Reavis talked with Christian Scott, an Elon University alum, about an upcoming black gospel concert at St. Mark's Church during Elon's homecoming weekend. Discussed the heritage of Black Gospel music in the south and specifically in Alamance County. Discussed it's impact on the community. **ART, EQ, FY** 

**10/28/22 7a-9a** Kurt Ward, India Kingery, and Scott Reavis talked with Jay and Christy Doss from Living Free Ministries about their upcoming Festival On The Farm. Living Free Ministries helps those struggling with life controling issues, including addictions. It is a non profit based in Alamance County and each year leads hundreds of men and women on their path to recovery. Those in the program enter at a minimum of 24 hour of sobriety and when they leave the program are 100% sober and are placed in jobs with a support system that helps them maintain their sobriety. The Interstate 40/85 corridor runs directly thru Alamance County which means drug trafficing and human trafficing are both problems faced locally in the community. The fallout of these problems is residents facing addiction primarily to methanphetamines but in a growing issue Alamance County is seeing more and more fentanyl and heroin overdoses. Living Free is helping to combat this problem in the community. **CD, AR, MH** 

**11/4/22 7a-9a** Kurt Ward, India Kingery, and Scott Reavis talked with Charlotte Smith, professional basketball player in the WNBA and now head coach for the Elon University women's basketball team. Discussed the

need to use possitions of influence to make a difference in the community, the importance of mentors- both having a mentor and being a mentor, and surrounding yourself with positive influences. **ED. SA. FY** 

11/9/22 8a-8:30a Kurt Ward, India Kingery, and Scott Reavis talked with Wayne Brewer about the upcoming Veteran's Day Parade in Graham. Wayne is a Vietnam Veteran and one of the primary organizers of the parade. The Veteran's Day Parade is an opportunity to celebrate our vets and recognize them for their services and sacfrifice. Talked about PTSD among veterans. Waye Brewer has battled PTSD since his return to civilian life and taked firsthand about the effects and how to combat it. Talked about veteran services available in Alamance County, incuding the AlcoVets which privides financial assistance as well as temporary housing for veterans. Talked about the building of the Chestnutt Ridge Veteran's retreate in Alamance County with will provide mental health care for veterans. MI, ED, MH

**11/15/22 8a-8:30a** Kurt Ward, India Kingery, and Scott Reavis talked with Julie Essary and Carrie Sockwell from the Alamance County Service League. The service league connects women women who wish to volunteer with various needs in the community, basically providing a pool of volunteer workers for area non profits. Discussed the need for volunteering in the community, the benefits in the community as well as the benefits to ones own mental health by volunteering. Discussed the various need of the community and how no matter what your passion is you can find a non profit that will benefit from your input. **VOL**

Second Chance currently works in Hati and the Dominican Republic and they provide relief to the poorest of the poort countries in the world. Discussed the needs of third world countries, talked about what assistance is provided by the United States and the United Nations and how governments are often limited in what they can do but non profit organizations like Second Chance Global can step in and fill needs that governments can't. Often third world countries will refuse help from other governments but will allow non profit groups in to their countries to work. Instead of buying a gift for someone Alamance County residents are given an opportunity to buy a meal for someone in a third world country or even to buy a hot meal for a local student through one of the Weekend Backpack programs in Alamance County. Weekend Backpack programs provide food for students in the community who are on free or reduced lunch programs. Often these students only meals come from their school lunch and on weekends and during the summer time they will go hungry. The Backpack Program sends these students home with a backpack of food each Friday to feed them through the weekend. The alternative Christmas Market is an opportinity for Alamance County residents to help with both international and local missions and outreach. **POV** 

**11/29/22 8a-8:30a** Kurt Ward, India Kingery, and Scott Reavis talked with Chief Brian Long and PIO Emily Adkins from the Burlington Police Department about hiring for all positions. Discussed new benefits package and the need for competetive pay for officers. Discussed the Burlington Police Department as a dropoff location for letters to Santa. Kids can write letters to Santa Claus and "mail" them at police headquarters. Santa will answer their letters before Christmas. **LE, FY, PS**

Feed The Hunger is an international program that not only helps ecconomically depressed countries meet the dietary needs of their citizens, it also steps in after major disastors. **12/16/22 8a-8:30a** Kurt Ward, India Kingery, and Scott Reavis talked with Eric Dudley, youth pastor for First Baptist Church of Gibsonville and basketball coach at Burlington Christian Academy. Discussed the impact of athletics on students lives, the positive impact on their academics, the increased likelyhood of attending higher education, and the decreased likelyhood of altercations with the law. Talked about using sports as a way of teaching life lessons, disipline, and good habits. **SA, FY, ED**
