The jury found, unanimously, that Chauvin is guilty of second degree murder, third degree murder and second degree murder. In many cities they were preparing for the worst and a series of demonstrations that could turn violent. A day later, the nation's attorney general announced that the Department of Justice was launching an investigation to determine whether there is a "pattern or practice of discriminatory policing" at the Minneapolis Police Department. They say they are alarmed by the number of migrants detained while crossing the border illegally. Just days ago, we witnessed a tragedy on the high seas, when a shipwreck occurred where 3 Mexicans lost their lives in their attempt to reach this country by sea. Meanwhile, it was announced that Vice President Kamala Harris will tentatively travel to Mexico on June 8.

Since January 20 of this year, the situation at the border has radically changed. For months, for some even years, the wait in Mexico ended and for others, encouraged by organized crime from their countries of origin, the most dangerous adventure of their lives began.

Thousands of mothers and fathers also began to endanger the lives of their children by sending them "alone" to the border. Meanwhile, Democratic representatives Adriano Espaillat, Verónica Escobar and Sylvia García presented the bill to improve national security, which seeks a solution to this humanitarian crisis on the border with Mexico.

The law would establish a commission within the Department of Homeland Security composed of representatives from the border states and also proposes to establish the office of the Ombudsman [Ombdusman] for border affairs and migration.

We discussed this with Fernando García who is the Executive Director of the Border Network for Human Rights from El Paso, Texas.

On Monday, June 7, the visit of Vice President Kamala Harris to Guatemala officially began. From very early on, she visited the National Palace of Culture to meet with President Alejandro Giammattei, and later in the evening she traveled to Mexico City to meet with President Lopez Obrador at the National Palace on Tuesday. The government of Mexico said that members of the Mexican national intelligence center (CNI), as well as the Secretariats of National Defense and the Navy, held various coordination meetings this week with the deputy director of the CIA.

Harris returned to the capital of the country with which an agreement is expected to put a stop to the mass migration of

thousands of people who risk everything because they leave "nothing" in their countries of origin.

From October 2020 to April 2021, 749 thousand 713 migrants crossed the border between Mexico and the United States. The desperation for a better life can do more for these people who risk everything to get to the other side. Thousands of people leave their countries throughout the Central American region and are going through an ordeal to achieve "the American dream." Since 2019, around 400,000 Guatemalans have been detained on the border between the United States and Mexico.

The Biden administration has promised 310 million in humanitarian aid for the region and has a plan of 4 billion to boost the development of Central America. However, Vice President Kamala Harris on her trip to Guatemala City and Mexico City was clear: "For the people of this region, what are you thinking of doing that dangerous walk? Don't come! Don't come!" she told them she.

This week, in addition to Vice President Harris' visit to Guatemala and Mexico, another news item that made headlines was the unanimous decision of the Supreme Court that said this Monday that immigrants who entered the United States illegally cannot apply for permanent residence because they enjoy temporary protected status or TPS. The decision is a setback for thousands who are temporarily protected from deportation, some until October. We asked Federal Senator for Virginia Tim Kaine about it.

Meanwhile, one of the most outrageous issues during the Trump era was the separation of families at the border. The White House Family Reunification Task Force gave new numbers, our White House correspondent Rafael Sanchez-Cruz had the report.

This week also finally the long-awaited visit of Harris to Guatemala and Mexico that occurred during 48 hours met with President Alejandro Giammattei and the Nobel Peace Prize in 1992, the indigenous leader Rigoberta Menchú, the vice president arrived in Mexico on Monday, and the next day he met with President López Obrador. We made contact in Mexico City with Duncan Wood who is vice president of strategy and new initiatives and senior advisor of the Mexico Institute of the Wilson Center.

According to monthly figures from the customs and border protection office, the number of migrants arriving in the United States has risen since Joe Biden took office in May, more than 180,000 migrants were detained at the border, of which, 112,000 were immediately expelled. Furthermore, more than 18,800 unaccompanied migrant children crossed the border in March.

In addition, this week the summer officially began and with it the high temperatures that it's first victims: Migrants. Both in California, Texas and Arizona, women and children are helped by the border patrol who assures that the rescues have increased. Meanwhile, Florida Governor Ron Di Santis authorizes the dispatch of agents to support the Texas Governor in his desire to detain migrants.

We discussed these issues and much more with Senator Marco Rubio, a senior member of the subcommittee on Western Hemisphere, Transnational Crime, Civil Security, Democracy, Human Rights, and Global Women's Issues.

One of the agents, according to the video released on social networks, subdued her and put one of her knees on her back and neck, the autopsy concluded that Salazar died of a broken neck. The exam found "a fracture of part of the upper spine caused by the breakage of the first and second vertebrae," as reported by the Washington Post.
