Gestring spoke of her priorities which include the University Center-Sioux Falls and student accessibility. Enrollment for the fall semester recorded the largest entering class in USD history with an undergraduate enrollment increase of 6.4% from last year. Retention also increased to 77.3%, up almost 5% from 2017. Gestring believes one key to this success has been offering the same in-state tuition rates to incoming students from Iowa and Nebraska. The USD head feels this is an important collaboration to continue to reach workforce goals in South Dakota, adding data indicates some 30% of non-resident students attending a state university stay in South Dakota. Gestring also pointed out that USD has a vested interest in the success of the University Center-Sioux Falls, stating the new facility can be a critical means for USD to reach a population of place-bound or undecided students.

According to Yankton Public Works the southern portion of Walnut Street between Second and Third streets is nearing completion and the south block will be the first portion to be open to traffic. Authorities state the Harvest Halloween event which takes place in that area should not be adversely affected but could factor in to when the street will be fully opened to traffic. Since the street is closed for the Halloween event the street opening may be delayed until after that. The north side of the project — between Third and Fourth streets — will also be seeing some heavy work in the coming two weeks. Yankton Public Works Director Adam Haberman states even though weather delays hindered work on the project at times, he is thankful for everyone's patience. Haberman adds it could be a few weeks before major completion on the project is achieved and that the majority of the landscaping will also be finished by the end of this construction season.

An October test of Hartington's drinking water showed that E. coli bacteria had been detected in the water distribution system. Local residents are now being advised to boil water before drinking it, cooking with it, or brushing teeth with it. The City of Hartington's water supply failed a recent National Primary Drinking Water Regulations test. The city is continuing to test the water, city officials said, and is in the process of trying to get the problem fixed.

City Manager Amy Leon (Leone) said that most people have a good view of the city and its services. She added that the City received really positive results with most of the categories listed as well-above average or in the excellent range. Surveys were sent out to 1,200 random households in the city and residents were encouraged to take the survey online if they didn't receive a hard copy. Leon said 458 paper and 76 online surveys were completed for a total of 534 completed surveys. According to the survey residents believe water rates in the City are too high. Water rates have risen dramatically over the last couple of years due to the construction of a major addition to the 1972 water treatment facility. An area that has seen a number of positive comments after its implementation is single-stream recycling, which was implemented in 2017. The semi-automation project was added to the City's refuse collection as well as the uniform roll carts, which, according to City officials, has been a big success story.

Today is the final day that residents can register to vote ahead of the election. Today also marks the opening of absentee balloting which is taking place at the finance office in City Hall from 8am to 5pm each day. Yankton City Manager Amy Leon (LEONE) issued a reminder that there is a very specific group of area residents that can vote and who will be directly impacted by the decision. Leon reminds Yankton residents that those living within corporate city limits who are registered to vote can vote in this election, and that it is not a county-wide or general election. She said that the rise in property taxes will apply to all of those entities within the Yankton city limits that already pay property taxes. Property owners outside of the city limits will not see any changes. There will be two polling places for the upcoming election – they include City Hall and Fire Station No. 2 located on 23 rd Street – and these locations will be open from 7 a.m.-7 p.m.

The City of Yankton announced in January of 2017 that it would be exploring the prospect of replacing the then 70-year-old Fantle Memorial Park Pool. In the spring of 2017 the project was taken on full force by the Dive In Yankton group, a grassroots movement to bring a new facility to Yankton. By the end

					of the year, the public had voted on a design that would include a competition pool, lazy-river, zero-depth entry pool, and a splash pad. Dive In Yankton began fundraising for the project and have raised \$1 million, while the City of Yankton contributed \$2 million to the center. With an estimated price tag of around \$15 million, the city proposed a \$12 million property bond to pay for the remainder. A major development occurred on November 20 th when Yankton native Mike Huether and his wife Cindy pledged \$1 million towards the project, bringing the total money raised for the project to \$4 million. Voting will take place Tuesday, December 11 th , from 7am to 7pm at two locations in the city – City Hall at 416 Walnut Street, and the North Fire Station #2 – located at 201 West 23 rd Street.

During the search, investigators discovered 47 guns, one pound of methamphetamine, one pound of marijuana, and drug paraphernalia. Shaun Turner, 40, and David Loos, 66, were arrested for possession of methamphetamine with intent to deliver, possession of marijuana with intent to deliver, possession of a weapon during the commission of a felony, and no drug tax stamp. The investigation is ongoing and additional charges may be added.
