The coronavirus pandemic is now the deadliest disease outbreak in our nation's history. The COVID-19 death toll in the U.S. is closing in on 700,000 – surpassing the 675,000 deaths from the 1918 Flu. In May of 2020, Matter of Fact Special Contributor Joie Chen looked into the history of the 1918 pandemic. When we produced that piece, we were looking for lessons to guide us through this unprecedented time.
