Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this guarter:

- A. **Human Trafficking:** In this quarter we hear from two sexual abuse survivors who share their stories. These episodes focus on trauma and recovery.
- B. **Economic Growth.** The City of Casper is growing, and experts feel there is a "tipping point" for fast-growing cities that could both positively and negatively affect our community.
- C. **Housing.** Young people are fleeing the state because of a lack of job opportunities, particularly in the tech area. In this quarter we discuss why a diversified workforce is necessary to keep younger people in Wyoming to settle down and buy affordable housing.
- D. **Domestic Abuse.** Domestic abuse and abuse of minors in foster homes has been a rising concern in Wyoming. In the past two years, allegations of abuse of individuals in and from foster homes have been coming to light. This quarter we hear from a few victims who are telling their story.
- E. **Racism.** February was Black History Month. K2 Radio News aims to show the historical racism that has happened in Wyoming and why it is important to learn from the past as there is still some lingering prejudice in the state.
