Community Events

FLU SHOTS

WZVN worked with Walgreens to provide flu shots to people in our viewing area. On Sept. 21st, WZVN news anchors broadcast live from a local Walgreens store throughout the day letting viewers know they could come to any local Walgreens to receive a flu shot that was free to them. Prior to September 21st, the station broadcast public service announcements letting people know about the opportunity and the special event. Walgreens tripled its January numbers protecting 2,249 patients with 667 of the shots being provided thru the voucher program. That means 667 patients received a free flu shot that wouldn't have been able to afford it otherwise. In addition, patients received 128 additional shots that they didn't know they needed. In total, 2,377 shots were provided with the Get A Shot/Give A Shot program with the UN: 2,377 additional vaccines will be given to children in underserved countries so they can receive lifesaving immunizations.

Public Service Announcements

AS1229 - Recycle - :30 – 220 spots

How to find recycling services in your area. Recycling reduces the amount of waste sent to landfills and incinerators. Recycling also conserves natural resources such as timber, water and minerals.

AS1228 – Hispanic Scholarship Fund- :30 – 305 spots

This PSA generates awareness about scholarship opportunities for young Hispanic students. 19% of Lee County residents identify as Hispanic. The population continues to grow in Collier County as well. It nearly doubled in Collier from 2000 to 2010.

AS1230 – Save the Children - :30 – 241 spots

This PSA asks for donations to help feed, clothe and educate children worldwide. In the United States and around the world, Save the Children gives children a healthy start, the opportunity to learn and protection from harm, by transforming children's lives now, the agency changes the course of their future and ours.

AS1225 – AARP Caregiver – :30 – 330 spots

American Association of Retired Citizens raises awareness about caregivers for the elderly. Southwest Florida has a large elderly population.

AS1313 – NCH 2016 Ball – 279 spots

Naples Community Hospital's major fundraiser. The NCH Healthcare System is one of the most progressive in the country. The NCH Healthcare System is an alliance of more than 700 independent physicians and medical facilities in dozens of locations throughout Collier County and Southwest Florida.

ABC7 sponsored this event to raise money for at risk youth in Collier County. With 19 non-residential centers throughout Florida, PACE Centers provide a safe environment where middle and high school aged girls can thrive.

AS1310 – PACE Love That Dress- Lee – 358 spots

ABC7 sponsored this event to raise money for at risk youth in Lee County. The event raised more than \$250,000.

AS1314 – ABC7 Flu Shot Day – 332 spots

This PSA lets viewers know that WZVN is working with Walgreens to provide flu shots free to viewers. Viewers can go to a Walgreens location on Sept. 21st to meet ABC7 news anchors and receive a flu shot. As a result of this public service effort, Walgreens tripled its January numbers and protected 2,249 patients with 667 of the shots provided thru the voucher program. 128 patients received additional shots that they didn't know they needed.

COMMUNITY ISSUES

Politics & Government

This quarter WZVN sent anchor Jeff Butera to Cleveland, Ohio to cover the Republican National Convention. Jeff brought our viewers unique coverage from the convention from the perspective of a southwest Florida resident. Donald Trump claimed the mantle Tuesday as the Republican presidential nominee, capping a stunning rise to power for his insurgent campaign. WZVN also sent political reporters to the Democratic National Convention to cover Hillary Clinton as she received the Democratic nomination for President. WZVN anchor Jeff Butera reported live from Germain Arena as Republican Presidential Candidate Donald Trump campaigned in Estero. About 8,000 people packed the arena to hear the businessman's campaign speech. Special speaker Newt Gingrich was also present. WZVN is committed to informing our viewers about the 2016 election. On Primary Day, August 30th, WZVN provided live updates throughout the evening with the latest polling results from Southwest Florida. Our live coverage began during our 7pm newscast and continued throughout our 11pm newscast.

Economy & Local Development

WZVN covered the event as Governor Rick Scott announced Arthrex, a medical device manufacturer, will expand its operations in North Naples, create 560 jobs and invest more than \$63 million in Collier County. WZVN learned Arthrex already employs more than 2,200. Arthrex has been based in Naples since 1991 and has developed more than 9,500 products and surgical procedures to advance minimally invasive orthopedics. WZVN closely followed a developing story in Collier County this quarter. County officials are considering building a sports complex to attract tourists to the county. Consultants said land on City Gate Drive is one of three locations that could support a proposed sports complex. Miguel Arreguin lives in the area and was excited about the idea of the complex. A North Fort Myers restaurant will close its doors for good on Friday. For a restaurant that's only been open shy of five years, there is a lot of history inside Firehouse Sports Grill on US-41 North. The restaurant adds to the slew of empty storefronts across a small part of North Fort Myers, just north and between the Caloosahatchee and Edison Bridges. It's an area Lee County is currently studying.

Crime & Personal Safety

This quarter WZVN covered a heartbreaking story that received national attention. A woman was killed in an accidental shooting at the Punta Gorda Citizen Police Academy.

The police department said Lee Cole was involved. He is on paid administrative leave during the investigation by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. Chief Tom Lewis called Tuesday night's incident a "horrible accident." A tragic shooting in Fort Myers dominated national headlines. Two teens died and 18 people were injured after gunfire broke out in the parking lot of a Fort Myers club. The first concerns were that this might have been a terrorist act similar to what happened in Orlando. Police responded to Club Blu Bar and Grill, on Evans Avenue, around 12:30 a.m. and found several victims suffering from gunshot wounds. Golden Gate parents are calling for change after another stranger danger case in Collier County. A 10-year-old boy tells deputies a man tried to lure him into his car while he was biking to school. It happened right near Golden Terrace Elementary School.

Health & Medicine

Florida Health officials are investigating a possible non-travel related Zika infection in a patient in Miami-Dade County. The case under investigation is one of 1,300 cases of Zika reported in the U.S. But, it's raising some alarm because it does not appear to be travel-related. Most health experts say you shouldn't be concerned, but you should be aware, and you should be taking precautions. The price of a life-saving EpiPen has jumped 400 percent in just a couple years. An EpiPens two-pack costs \$739 before insurance, according to a North Naples mother with whom we spoke. She still had to pay \$130 out of pocket for the injectors, which expire in a matter of months. New research reveals that 50 years ago, the sugar industry quietly paid Harvard scientists to downplay the risks of sugar and point the finger at fat. The industry wanted to dismiss sugar's possible role in heart disease.

Weather & the Environment

Tropical weather is impacting many businesses on Fort Myers Beach. Some have closed or cut staff this week because there's not enough work. Many businesses said things have been slow for two or three days, but they are hoping for a bump this weekend. Many restaurants have cut staff, and managers have served customers. WZVN is proud to be the most accurate team of meteorologists in Southwest Florida. Our team closely tracked Hermine as it formed in the tropics and threatened to hit our coastline. The weather team alerted our viewers to Hermine's timeline, track, and how much rain viewers could expect with the hurricane. Sea turtle eggs were stolen out of a nest along Doctors Pass in Naples. This is the second incident in three weeks, according to Florida Fish and Wildlife. The second incident happened near the Naples Pier. A surfer caught a man digging up a sea turtle's nest. FWC and the Naples Police Department were called, but by the time law enforcement arrived, the suspected thief was nowhere to be found.

Community Service

WZVN wants to keep our viewers healthy this flu season, so we partnered with Walgreens for Flu Shot Day. Our viewers could visit any neighborhood Walgreens Pharmacy to receive a flu shot covered by your insurance or free with a voucher. Pharmacists say now is the perfect time to get your shot. Flu season typically starts in

October, getting the flu shot now will make sure viewers are protected by the time the flu hits. This quarter WZVN introduced our viewers to a 9-year-old who is finding a unique way to battle against bullies. Olivia Trader said she was picked on for being small. She wants to install a special bench on her Cape Coral elementary school playground. If any student is looking for a friend, they can sit on the bench, as a visual cue for other students.

Title: Florida Abortion Law

Source: Local

Description: A federal judge blocked key provisions of a sweeping new state law that would have barred abortion providers from receiving public funds for other services and required a dramatic increase in inspections of abortion records by health officials. U.S. District Judge Robert Hinkle's preliminary injunction came just hours before the new law would have gone into effect. Planned Parenthood affiliates are challenging three portions of the law, approved by the Republican-controlled Legislature and signed by Gov. Rick Scott earlier this year. Hinkle sided with the abortion providers in two of the three components, and ruled that state officials had resolved concerns about a third --- dealing with a change in the definition of the first trimester --- during a hearing in the case.

Title: FMPD Chief Contract

Description: WZVN learns the deal with the new Fort Myers police chief isn't done. The City Council unanimously approved Derrick Diggs to lead the Fort Myers Police Department last Thursday, but a subsequent investigation has revealed he's not been offered a contract. Mayor Randy Henderson said he hopes the council will offer Diggs a long-term contract -- with a minimum three-year duration -- that's in line with the city's previous police chiefs. Council members have not responded to requests for comment. The council's next meeting is set for July 18 and Henderson said he'd like a contract to be ready for approval at that point.

We also learned that Bongino will not vote for himself in the Congressional District 19 race because he's registered to vote in another district on the east coast of Florida where he owns a house. Bongino told us there is no legal requirement to be registered to vote in the county.

He encouraged everyone to empty standing water ahead of a tropical depression moving toward Florida.

Myers and Buckingham. Holton talked with parents and educators about Clinton's ideas for solving the rising cost of higher education. She emphasized Florida parents should listen to some of Clinton's ideas on affordability. She said, "we have middle-class families that can't figure out how to make higher-ed work. We have low-income kids who are just missing out altogether."

We reached out to the Trump campaign to see if the tickets can be transferred from person to person, or if they're locked into whoever registered for them.

There are now more than 11.3 million firms owned by women in the United States, employing more than 9 million people and generating more than \$1.6 trillion in revenues. Glenn Delong has lived in the neighborhood for more than 20 years. He said he eventually would be on board for any project that involved the mining site moving out, which ultimately helps pave Southwest Florida roads -- but he said the area isn't ready for the growth yet. The purchase has much of the community wondering what the plans are, especially when the developer hasn't said much about the recent purchase at an undisclosed price, other than looking into the possibility of a residential project.

Description: Governor Rick Scott announced Friday that nearly 5,000 new private sector jobs were added to the Naples area in the last year. The area's unemployment rate is down .8% from last year to 5.4%. Despite the job growth, some say they still can't afford the county's high cost of housing. Jennifer Kupiec has worked for Collier County schools for the last three years. When she first moved to town, she found a place in Naples, but after giving birth to her baby boy, she said she needed more space. Jennifer had to move to

Lee County because the same home she was considering in Collier County was \$100,000 more. WZVN learned several people live in Lee County and commute to Collier County for work.

Title: Estero Greek Charter School

Source: Local

Description: A new charter school could be built right in the middle of Estero's new downtown, but the proposal has some leaders and residents within the village concerned. From increased traffic to design to noise, there are a number of questions surrounding the potential growth project that Lee County will have to review, and ultimately, determine whether that growth is worthwhile. Perhaps the most significant factor is location. LAI Construction wants to build Athenian Charter Academy, a two-story school that will specialize in teaching Greek and Spanish, on a plot of land that belongs to the county at Estero Community Park, which is used by retirees to work out at the recreation center, college students to study, and families. It would be capable of holding 1,145 students, and according to the contractor, ready for the next school year if approved.

The concepts even include something as simple as a front porch. There will be many different homes and buildings in Babcock Ranch, but they all have to be certified "green" by the state of Florida. In development for more than 10 years, Babcock Ranch will open early next year. It will be a sustainable town powered by the sun, putting sustainability and an active lifestyle in the forefront. Homes are starting in the \$200,000 range, and the builders say they already have a lot of interest. Model homes should be open at the beginning of 2017.

Description: Lee County deputies say the three suspects accused in the murder of a Buckingham man are awaiting extradition in Kansas. The body of Ted Lee was found in a church parking lot in Manatee County just hours after deputies said they believed the 58-year-old was in danger. The Lee County Sheriff's Office said Jonathan Ruffini, 18, and Hunter Tyson, 23, were charged with second-degree murder, grand theft of an automobile and fraudulent use of a credit card. Lavaya May, 16, was charged with accessory after the fact of murder, grand theft of an automobile and fraudulent use of a credit card. Detectives said Lee and May lived in the same neighborhood for years.

The club was hosting a Swimsuit Glow Party Sunday night for teens where no ID was required, according to a flyer promoting the event. No alcohol was served during the party Sunday night because the club's liquor license was revoked on June 7th.

Title: Punta Gorda Deadly Police Academy Shooting

Description: This quarter WZVN covered a heartbreaking national story. A woman was killed in an accidental shooting at the Punta Gorda Citizen Police Academy. The police department said Lee Coel was involved. He is on paid administrative leave during the investigation by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. Chief Tom Lewis called Tuesday night's incident a "horrible accident." He said the shooting happened during a "shoot or don't shoot" scenario in which they use simulated lethal force in a live role play. Two participants were randomly selected. Lewis said there were approximately 35 people in attendance. Lewis said the victim, 73-year-old Mary Knowlton, was "mistakenly struck with a live round." Description: Lesbian, gay, and bisexual high school students are much more likely to be victims of physical and sexual violence and bullying, and more needs to be done to protect them, a new U.S. government study says. Dr. Jonathan Mermin is the director for the National Center for HIV/AIDS Prevention. He says, "these tragic disparities call for accelerated action by public health and education agencies, communities, and families to protect the lives of lesbian, gay and bisexual youth." Getting a better assessment of the extent of the problem, "is critical to protect the health and well-being of more than one million lesbian, gay and bisexual high school students," he added in an agency news release. The CDC report found that lesbian and gay students were much more likely than heterosexual students to report: being raped, 18 percent versus 5 percent; sexual dating violence, 23 percent versus 9 percent; being bullied at school, 34 percent versus 19 percent; and being bullied online, 28 percent versus 14 percent.

The vice principal reported the video to the school's resource officer. The student that received the video said she wasn't offended by it, which is why it wasn't reported sooner. The district recommends parents monitor their child's Chromebook use, which is part of a technology agreement both parents and students need to sign at the beginning of the year.

Most health experts say you shouldn't be concerned, but you should be aware, and you should be taking precautions. Some campers went on a hike at

"It was kind of on our radar, but now it will be even more on our radar," Amy Sera with Calusa Nature Center and Planetarium said. Health officials have been predicting that Zika could start spreading within the U.S. this summer. They said Florida would be especially vulnerable because it's on the Gulf Coast.

Eighty million Americans have HPV today, and 14 million more get infected each year. HPV puts you at a higher risk of cancer like cervical cancer.

Description: The price of a life-saving EpiPen has jumped 400 percent in just a couple years. The doctor prescribed him an EpiPen just in case. The family filled his first prescription last month. EpiPens cost for a pack of two: \$739 before insurance, according to the North Naples mother. FWC said a person who disturbs a sea turtle's nest or eggs could face jail time plus up to \$100 per egg in fines. So far, no one has been arrested. FWC asks anyone who sees someone disturbing a sea turtle's nest or eggs to report it.

The girl's biological father, Martin Alvarez Moreno, who lives in Tehacuan Puebla, said he does not have her and has not seen her since she disappeared.

- At the Club: Two girls are in line at a nightclub, excited about their night out. When they finally make it to the front of the line, the bouncer has a very strict and offensive admission policy, berating one of the girls about how she is not thin enough to get in. How will bystanders respond?

Friday, July 29, 2016

- Adderall Addiction: Two male college students in a bar start popping Adderall and drinking alcohol to stay up and party. They try to convince the girl they are with to join them. Will anyone try to stop the students from this potentially dangerous behavior?

- On the DL: A husband and wife are having lunch, celebrating their anniversary. They seem to be in love, but the husband keeps getting distracted by the texts on his phone. When the wife goes to the bathroom, a man comes in and kisses her husband on the lips. It's obvious he's cheating on his wife with this man. When the wife returns the boyfriend leaves and hides. Will customers say something?
- Parental Approval: A girl is introducing her parents, who are visiting from out of town, to her boyfriend. He arrives, and her family is surprised to see that he is in a wheelchair – something they are not happy about. When he goes to the bathroom, they express their disapproval, making derogatory remarks. How will customers react?
- Shopping While Black (OAD: 5/23/14): An African American man is shopping at an upscale clothing store near Wall Street. A salesperson tells the shopper he is watching him and asks if he can even afford to shop at the store. Continuing to follow the shopper, the salesperson tells him they don't have any "urban" clothes in this store. Eventually, the salesperson calls the security guard over to pat him down before he leaves the store. Will anyone defend the shopper from being racially profiled? "Shark Tank" host and entrepreneur Daymond John joins Quinones to discuss the results. What happens when Daymond John plays the part of the profiled shopper?
- Snarky Ventriloquist: A snarky ventriloquist street performer is berating passersby with inappropriate jokes. Will anyone stand up to the ventriloquist?

Friday, August 5, 2016

- Car Trouble (OAD 1/26/16): On a suburban street outside an ice-cream shop, a woman makes it clear she is having trouble changing her flat tire. Will a passerby stop to help her? What will responses be when she is wearing a traditional Muslim hijab?
- Diet Pills (OAD 1/26/16): Three teenage girls are out to lunch when two of them start to peer pressure the third into taking diet pills. As they try to convince their friend to take the pills, the pressured teen grows more skeptical. Will bystanders say anything?
- Sore Loser Dad (OAD 1/26/16): A coach takes his little league team out for ice cream after a hard-fought game. He offers to buy everyone ice cream, except his son, telling his son that his strike-out ended the game; therefore, he gets no ice cream. The son is visibly upset, telling his dad that he tried his best. The coach doesn't want to hear it, saying he wasn't good enough and needs to try harder to earn the ice cream. Will the other patrons say something?
- We're Having a Girl (OAD 1/26/16): While out to eat, a pregnant wife tells her husband the exciting news that they are having a girl. The only problem? They already have two girls and wants a boy. What will fellow diners do when they witness his very obvious displeasure?
- Online Predator 2 (OAD 1/26/16): At a café, a 16-year-old boy is waiting to finally meet up with a girl he met online – a girl he thinks is his age. But when she turns out to be an older woman in her 40's, he can't decide whether he should leave with her. Will fellow patrons say anything?

Friday, August 12, 2016

- Baby in a Hot Car (OAD: 8/8/14): A mother leaves what appears to be a child in the car to run an errand. When passersby hear the child crying, how will they react? How will people react when it's a dad who leaves the child in the car?
- Alzheimer's Abuse (OAD: 2/9/16): While she's supposed to be taking him out for a day on the town, a caregiver takes advantage of her dementia patient's short-term memory—or lack thereof—to take a personal day of her own. At a nail salon, the caretaker is dismissive and downright insulting to her patient while using his credit card to pay for her manicure, but she explains to onlookers that it's fine, because he won't remember in five minutes anyway. Will any of the customers stick up for the patient and tell her that she is wrong for treating him this way?
- Portland Predator (OAD: 2/9/16): A 15 year-old girl with a guitar is at a café studying when an older man approaches. He claims to have a music studio at his home and invites the teen back to his house to "jam." Our teen is intrigued but suspicious. As our stranger becomes more and more insistent, will bystanders come to her aid before she leaves with a complete stranger?
- Steroid Situation (OAD: 2/9/16): A group of three high school jocks are grabbing a meal. Two of the guys start telling their friend that the way to grow muscles and become faster is to take steroids. They tell him "Steroids is the way to go. It really enhances your performance. It's not dangerous at all." He's skeptical, but they are persistent. Will anyone step in to stop this peer pressure?
- Car Dealership: When a man walks into a dealership looking to buy a car, he is greeted by a friendly saleswoman. This car buyer will have none of it. Women can't possibly sell cars. They don't know what they're talking about. The car buyer asks for a different salesperson, insulting the saleswoman in front of other customers. Will someone stand up for the saleswoman?

Friday, August 19, 2016

- Veteran (OAD 7/17/15): San Antonio has one of the nation's largest active and retired military populations. So what will happen when a military veteran at the check-out counter does not have enough money to buy his groceries? How will other shoppers react?
- Interracial Couple (OAD 7/17/15): A Hispanic man and his Caucasian girlfriend are on a date at a local San Antonio restaurant when they begin to be harassed by another customer, a Hispanic woman. She tells them that they should stick to their own kind and that races should not mix. How will bystanders react?
- Young Guns (OAD 7/17/15): At a gun store, a father wants to buy his son his first gun for his seventh birthday. But a customer confronts the father telling him the son is too young and the father is being irresponsible buying him a gun. How will other shoppers react?
- PDA (OAD 7/17/15): A female customer expresses her displeasure when two cowboys hold hands and kiss while sitting at a BBQ restaurant in Blanco, Texas. How will other customers respond?
- Rude Street Musician (OAD 7/17/15): A street musician is playing his guitar at a busy plaza. He is singing songs with lyrics that include obnoxious and rude descriptions of the people walking by. How will people react?

Friday, August 26, 2016

- Interracial Couple: An interracial couple in their early 20s is in love and getting married. The parents of the bride-to-be know she is dating someone new, but don't know that her fiancé is Asian. When they meet for the first time, they learn the truth and tell their daughter it's unacceptable. How will bystanders react?
- Nannygate: A Father is having an inappropriate relationship with his baby's nanny. Will any of the patrons say something to the father, nanny or to the mother?
- Shoplifting Granny: A seemingly innocent elderly woman browsing in a store shoplifts. How will the other customers respond?
- Inappropriate Dad: A son introduces his new girlfriend to his father. When the son steps away, the father hits on his son's girlfriend. He tells her how beautiful she is, how the two of them should spend time together, and how she should be with a real man because his son is a kid. Will someone tell the son or tell the father to stop the inappropriate behavior?
- Domestic Abuse: A husband and wife are shopping when he begins to verbally abuse her. Will any of the shoppers defend the wife and tell the man to stop?

Friday, September 2, 2016

- Concerned Mom: A mother is with her son at a sporting goods store. She is trying to buy the son a new pair of soccer cleats, when the son sees a pair of football cleats. He tells his mom he wants to play football instead, and she immediately shuts the idea down. Mom cites the health concerns regarding the sport, especially given the recent attention paid to CTE, caused by repeated blows to the head. The son tries to plead with the mom, but she isn't budging. Will any of the other customers interject?
- Children Ask Customers for a Lighter: New York State law says minors cannot buy tobacco products, and in some counties they must be 21 to purchase them. But there is no law that prohibits minors from smoking if they get their hands on a cigarette. What will passers-by do when two 12-year-old boys ask for a light? What will they do when two 12-year-old girls ask?
- Angry Teens: A teenage boy is using his mother's guilt over her divorce to try to get an expensive pair of shoes. Loudly, in the middle of the store, he yells, "You're so stupid. No wonder why Dad left," and "This is exactly why I want to live with Dad!" How will the patrons react? What if it is a teenage girl saying this to her mother?
- Accessible Parking: Two people without disabilities park in an accessible spot, just because they don't feel like parking in a spot further from the door. Will anyone say something?
- Hibachi Chef From Hell (OAD 7/24/15): Customers at a Hibachi restaurant want great food and a fun show to go along with it. What happens when customers end up with the worst Hibachi cook of all time? He barely knows how to use his tools and he can't do the basic tricks. Will they tell the manager and ask for a new chef?

Nearly the entire event was captured live on TV and on rescue workers' helmet cameras in some of the most terrifying crash video ever to hit the air.

Murder in the Maternity Ward

Rick Worthington, a father of eight, burst into Alta View Hospital demanding to find the doctor who performed a tubal ligation surgery on his wife two years earlier claiming the doctor performed the procedure without his wife's knowledge or consent while she was sleeping.

Jae Lowder and Cindy Tovey were at the hospital at the time and were caught in a violent hostage crisis. Glade Curtis, sharing his story for the first time ever on television, was the doctor Worthington came to kill. He was at Alta View that night and called 911; no one did more to keep moms and babies alive than the nurses, including Margie Wyler, who helped a mom deliver her baby during the crisis, and Karla Roth, who sacrificed her own life in a brave attempt to wrestle a gun away from Worthington.

Saturday, August 6, 2016

Tragedy InTornado Alley

On May 20, 2013, just after 1PM, the Storm Prediction Center issued a tornado watch for Eastern Oklahoma. Two hours after, storm spotters confirmed that an EF5 tornado had touched down and was ripping across the state towards the city of Moore, where school was in session. Saturday, August 6, 2016

Married couple Rob and Kim Stearns struggle to pull a drowning man from a frigid river. Both EMTs, not only do they share a home, but they also share an ambulance.

Also in this episode, colleagues Zackary Randall and Terry Mentele face a different challenge—calming a hysterical 6-year-old who fell out of bed and fractured his arm. And everybody’s favorite boss, Lt. John Cotter, responds to a building set ablaze after a resident forgets to extinguish a scented candle.

Saturday, August 13, 2016

An urgent 911 call summons the EMS to the tough Dorchester neighborhood where two gunshot victims are lying severely wounded in the middle of a snowy street. Across town, paramedic Beth Rimas comforts a young mother whose 2-year old is having a febrile seizure. This situation hits close to home for Beth, as her own son suffers from the same condition.

Also in this episode, Deputy Supt. Ed Hassan responds to a suspicious package left outside a daycare. As the bomb squad assesses the threat, Hassan can’t help but get emotional while talking about the events he witnessed when the Boston Marathon was bombed.

Saturday, August 20, 2016

Lt. Cotter races to a raging house fire that is being fueled by high winds and threatening to impact an entire city block.

Also in this episode, EMTs Roger Furtado and Ben Parham arrive at the scene of a car accident to treat an injured woman who is eight-months pregnant.

Across town, EMT Nick Camacho tries to convince a young woman who was viciously assaulted to make a report to the police, especially after her attackers recorded the violence and posted it on Facebook.

Saturday, August 27, 2016

A patient gains a new perspective on life after being shot in the thigh, telling paramedics and EMT’s that he’ll turn his life around to care for his nine-month-old child if he survives.

Across town, paramedic Randy Souza shows tough love to a sick patient refusing life-saving medical treatment, persuading him to accept care for the sake of his young children.

Paying close attention to anything that has the potential to be a mass causality incident, Deputy Supt. Ed Hassan races to a school where carbon monoxide alarms are ringing and students report feeling dizzy.
