Description: This was a WZVN special report. It was not long ago, many people would not be able to point Fort Myers out on a map. Now, it appears the quiet corner on the coast is no longer a secret. The Mayor of Cape Coral said 1,000 people are moving to Florida every day and almost one-third of them are coming to Southwest Florida. The problem is, there are not enough homes to go around. So where are the people coming from? Southwest Florida realtors say buyers are predominantly from the Midwest and Northeast, along with New York and California. These are areas where the cost of living is notoriously high. Realtors say they are coming to the table with a lot of cash, making it tough to compete. There are also not enough homes on the market, which drives up prices. On top of the high cost of buying homes, rising rental costs are also a problem. According to the rental platform, Zumper, the average rental fee for a 1-bedroom apartment in Fort Myers jumped 45% compared to last year. Naples saw a 53% increase and Cape Coral a 16% jump.

Issues:

Weather & Environment

Summary: This quarter saw the peak of the dry season in Southwest Florida. Many water ways were are record low levels. Cities like Cape Coral were forced to limit irrigation to conserve water for essential services. The spring also meant more mosquitoes. WZVN rode along with mosquito control showing viewers how the organization controls the mosquito population and cuts down on the spread of disease. Spring also brings gator mating season and turtle nesting season. WZVN made sure viewers were prepared to navigate the waterways and beaches safely around wildlife. WZVN also investigated pollution in our environment created by microplastics. WZVN meteorologists and state leaders prepared viewers for hurricane season and the first storm of the year.

Health & Consumer

Summary: WZVN focused a lot of resources to investigate the insurance crisis in Florida this quarter. Home and car insurance rates have skyrocketed and many residents are being dropped completely. WZVN walked viewers through what local and state leaders have done and have not done to address the issue. WZVN also explained ways to seek relief. WZVN educated viewers on health impacts of the meningococcal outbreak in Florida. The metaverse is also an emerging frontier that viewers are starting to dive into. WZVN took viewers through the new world and warned of the dangers and opportunities there.

Tourism & Local Economy

Summary: Southwest Florida is growing fast, and the amount of development that happened this quarter proves it. The Margaritaville Resort project on Fort Myers Beach sparked some controversy over beach activity permits. Downtown Fort Myers hosted discussions regarding ways to revitalize the area as an entertainment and social site including the river with a new water taxi service into midtown. The city met with business owners on what can be done to revitalize the area in the future. All this development could be coming too fast so WZVN investigated whether our infrastructure can handle such a surge of people.

Inflation & Shortages

Summary: Consumers were hit hard by rising prices for everything from food to gas as well as shortages. WZVN walked viewers through what was causing these shortages and the best ways to keep pantries stocked. Along with high prices, consumers noticed they were getting less for the same price, known as shrinkflation. Consumers have many ways to save money, and WZVN investigated which iviewers the greatest bang for their buck.

Law & Public Safety

Summary: This quarter was filled with controversial laws being signed. Courts dealt with redistricting issues ahead of this year's elections. WZVN walked viewers through the confusing issue and how it impacts them at the ballot box. New laws dictating what books can be in schools also sparked controversy. The state rejected dozens of textbooks and residents tried to get even more removed from classrooms. Activists against the move made the case that the bible should be removed from classrooms for the same reason other books on the chopping block were getting blocked. Representatives also pushed their case for removing children from parents who take them to drag shows.

Positively Southwest Florida & Bright-Side Blocks

Summary: This segment is a gem in WZVN's weekday evening newscasts. For the 6pm and 7pm newscasts, WZVN has created two segments that highlight the good happening in Southwest Florida and around the world. We pick a variety of human interest stories that showcase how people in our community are helping others and giving back to further develop our community, our people and our paradise.

Title: Cape Coral Canal Levels

Description: Canals in Cape Coral experienced low water levels this quarter during the dry season. The city was operating on a two-day irrigation schedule, but officials say many people were overwatering and pulling more water from canals. As the situation worsened and canal levels continued to drop, the city of Cape Coral discussed revising watering schedules to once a week based on address. That would result in a 40% reduction in water use and provides improved water pressure for customers and fire services. Come May at the peak of the dry season, the city issued a one day water schedule. One day watering was in place until canal levels rose to appropriate levels.

Title: Composting Clothes

Description: Fashion retailers created baby clothes that can be composted. It is an effort to be more environmentally friendly. The new line from H&M launched in May. It included baby tops, bottoms, jackets, hats, and blankets. But local environmental experts in Southwest Florida thought that the initiative actually missed the mark. Professors at Florida Gulf Coast University said the brand did use sustainably sourced cotton as opposed to polyesters which are made out of plastics. But experts believed the initiative would not cut down on textile waste. One reason why, is because once these baby clothes are used, it is up to the parents to compost them; if they even have a composter. So for viewers who want to make a more environmentally conscious decision when buying clothes, experts recommend buying second hand from a consignment store or local Goodwill.

Title: Gator Mating Do's & Don'ts

Description: Spring means alligator mating season in Southwest Florida. It also means people are more likely to see them around. Local trappers said in a two week time period, they had experienced an increase in emergency calls. Trappers warned people to keep a safe distance from alligators and avoid trying to get close to the wild animal to take selfies. Trappers said males usually are out trying to find females so they move from pond to pond. Experts said to check under cars, in lanais, and even pools because anything that can hold water could have a gator.

Description: The end of the dry season meant the start of mosquito season in Southwest Florida. The Lee County Mosquito Control District started preparing for the rise in population as more rain moved in. The heat can often prevent mosquitoes from breeding. The district sent crews to look for places where water sits to see if any larvae had started to develop. Homeowners also play a role on population control. Experts recommended dumping pitcher plants and standing water.

Date/Time: May 3-4, 6pm, 7pm, 5am, 6am, 9am, 10am Duration: 6:00 Title: Turtle Nesting

Description: Turtle nesting season started in Southwest Florida. The first nest was spotted on our beaches this quarter. Wildlife experts say a clean and safe beach is key to sea turtle nesting success. A hotel on Fort Myers Beach said trash heavily affects wildlife. This quarter the resort installed new special trash cans to help encourage people to pick up after themselves. The cans also keep sea turtle nesting in mind. They are less intrusive and less obstructive than normal cans.

Title: Microplastics

Description: In this WZVN special report, Meteorologist Sami Squires investigated microplastics in our water. At Florida Gulf Coast University, Marine Science students put microplastics under the microscope. They were counting microplastic particles one by one to see how many are in our waterways. They found essentially every body of water they sampled had microplastics in it. Plastic can contain chemicals that make them more colorful or flexible. If any animal ingests it, it can be passed along the food chain. Experts say to get plastics out of the water, it starts at home by changing habits.

Title: Cape Coral Algae

Description: Blue-green algae was detected in Cape Coral canals this quarter. The bloom spanned 20-acres and six freshwater canals. The City put out health alerts warning people to stay out of the water and to keep their pets away. City officials say rapid housing growth, a large sports complex field and extensive landscaping in new developments may have been to blame for the bloom. Crews treated the canals with a peroxide-based algaecide. Officials also tried to combat toxic algae blooms in canals with charcoal. 100 bags of charcoaled tree products were lined along a canal to test the method. Experts say the charcoal absorbs the nutrients toxic algae needs to thrive, but experts say this method should be used sparingly.

Bags could soak up too much nutrients and kill good algae. Officials say aquatic plants could emerge along the water that will help compete with bad algae.

Title: Hurricane Season Preparations

Description: Ahead of the first tropical system of the season, viewers prepared for heavy rains and potential flooding. In Cape Coral, a project to bring reclaimed water into the city broke a drainage pipe and caused flooding in one neighborhood. An afternoon rain storm flooded the neighborhood streets. Crews were able to fix the pipe before the first tropical system of the year. State leaders also gave tips on how to prepare for hurricane season. Many viewers stocked up on supplies for emergency kits in the event of a strong storm or hurricane. Many took advantage of the tax holiday. The state is also offering more tax incentives for the next two years and qualifying Floridians could receive grant money from the state that can help reinforce or replace windows, garages and parts of their homes against a storm.

Title: Tropical Storm Coverage

Description: WZVN provided viewers with extended coverage as a potential tropical cyclone brought heavy rain and flooding to parts of Southwest Florida. Reporters went to major problem areas to survey conditions as meteorologists updated the latest forecast track for the storms and how it could impact viewers.

Title: Law Enforcement Mental Health

Description: Law enforcement agencies across Southwest Florida addressed the nationwide mental health crisis head-on. In Lee County, deputies are required to participate in deescalation training every week. Over the past few years, we were told the county had seen an increase in the number of calls related to mentally unstable individuals. In Charlotte County, the IRIS teams were prepared to assist the community. IRIS stands for 'Integrated Response for Intervention and Support.' There are two IRIS teams throughout the county. Each team is made up of a Charlotte County Deputy, a mental health clinician, and a paramedic from Charlotte County Fire & EMS. The IRIS program first launched in October of 2021 and so far, we are told it's been a success.

Title: Telehealth Bill
Description: A new Florida Law allowed doctors to prescribe controlled substances using
TeleHealth. Over the last two years, many people have relied on digital doctor visits because of

COVID-19. A lot of times though, people couldn't get the medicine they needed. That is because there were many drugs that doctors weren't allowed to prescribe through a telehealth visit. The new law allows doctors to prescribe medicines like controlled substances that required a face-to-face visit before. The law takes effect July 1, 2022.

Title: Car & Home Insurance Crisis

Description: Florida is facing an insurance crisis. Home insurance rates have gone up this year, and many have had their policies canceled altogether. It happened at an alarming rate. The high home insurance rates have kept many people from buying homes. Lawmakers blame countless lawsuits against insurance companies and roofing scams in part for the high rates. This year, three major Florida insurance companies went out of business and more could soon follow. The insurance industry lost \$1.9 billion last year. Lawmakers called a special session to try and solve the issue this quarter. Many homeowners were hoping these new bills approved by lawmakers this week would open the doors to lower rates but that isn't necessarily the case at least immediately. The bill will ensure that an insurance company can not drop customers because of the age of the roof. Car insurance rates also spiked this quarter. On average, Florida drivers already pay \$2,700 a year for full coverage, the second highest in the nation. Drivers on average in Florida are seeing a 14% increase. Experts say some reasons for the increase include the number of uninsured drivers in the state and the cost to repair a car from a wreck going up.

Title: Meningococcal

Description: Health officials warned of Meningococcal Meningitis in Florida. The Florida Department of Health reported cases of meningococcal were spreading across college campuses in Florida in the LGBTQ community. It is easily spread by kissing or by sharing a drink with someone. The Florida Department of Health reported meningococcal cases statewide this year have already surpassed the five-year average. Experts think more people are getting out and socializing this year, causing the uptick.

Title: Chemical Beauty Products

Description: In this special report, WZVN investigated beauty products and chemicals. Social media and television series are exposing claims about beauty products with hidden chemicals that have been linked to diseases like cancer. Now people are using apps to scan their products for potentially toxic ingredients and tossing them out if they are determined to be bad. The Environmental Working Group aims to help consumers understand and learn more about what is in the product they put on their bodies every day. The promising news to many is that more companies want to play it safe. More companies are starting to turn away from using

talcum powder, also known as talc. It is a naturally occurring mineral, mined from the earth that is used in many powders and products like eye shadow. Because of its proximity to asbestos, talc can contain carcinogens.

Date/Time: May 5, 7pm Duration: 5:00 Title: Into the Metaverse

Description: The metaverse was first dreamt up in a 1992 novel, just a few years after the invention of the internet when even that was a foreign concept. As people were trying to wrap their heads around email, something we now use every day, Author Neal Stephenson wrote about a virtual world where his characters could go to escape a totalitarian reality. That digital world is now a reality with the metaverse. The metaverse is basically a virtual 3D universe and you enter it, and you are fully immersed. Instead of experiencing websites and social media platforms on a flat screen, users can put on Virtual Reality goggles and hold controllers and enter portals into different "worlds." There are "places" to explore that look like fairytale forests. Users can meet up with others from around the world in a nightclub or a more practical meeting space. But first, users need to create your avatar – your "digital twin" and it can be anything. Right now, there are several different platforms that have their own different portals to enter and explore. Some are free to experience and create. Others are worlds where users can buy real estate and all sorts of products. Companies can also use the metaverse for advertising real world products.

Title: Safe Swimsuits

Description: It is always swim season in Florida. As the third most populated state, Florida ranks number 4 nationwide for unintentional drownings among children ages 4 and under. The drowning rate for kids aged 5 to 12 has also increased during the past decade. The department of children and families reported in 2021, there were 98 deaths caused by drowning. This year alone 21 children have already drowned. Now parents across the country are sharing safety tips like how a child's swimsuit color can help prevent drowning. WZVN visualized how different colored swimsuits are easier to see underwater than others.

Title: Fort Myers Beach Parasailing

Description: Fort Myers Beach city leaders discussed changing its parasailing ordinance for the new Margaritaville Resort. For decades, Fort Myers Beach limited how many companies can offer parasailing on the island. Margaritaville wanted to change that. Fort Myers Beach has seven licensed parasailers that are allowed to operate on Estero Island, as well as 11 licenses for those that can rent out Jet Skis. Parasailing companies were worried the town was planning to gift the resort licenses for both, something longtime Fort Myers Beach businesses worked

years for. Margaritaville announced it was not moving forward with wanting those permits. That sent the town council back to the drawing board which could mean more businesses can operate water activities on the beach.

Title: Fort Myers Yacht Basin

Description: The future of the waterfront in Downtown Fort Myers was up in the air as city leaders discussed a huge renovation along the water. However people who live at the Yacht Basin felt they were being pushed out. Fort Myers City officials said they hope to make a real river walk for the city with shops, restaurants, and events for everybody who lives and visits. The city was hearing proposals from as many as five developers. Fort Myers officials said they were aware of rising costs and told developers to fix rental market rates that may allow people to remain.

Description: There was a new water taxi service running on the Caloosahatchee River. It is the first-of-its-kind in the downtown Fort Myers area. But It was not just bringing more people there, it was also helping to put North Fort Myers on the map. The water taxi runs seven days a week, and does about seven loops a day. During each loop, it makes three stops. In Fort Myers and North Fort Myers, expanding consumers horizons. The owner said he has plans to expand the route as the area continues to grow.

Title: Midtown Fort Myers Plan

Description: The City of Fort Myers hoped to get an idea of what can be done to redevelop parts of the Midtown area in a special meeting with property owners. The area sits just south of Downtown Fort Myers. It is home to the City of Palms ballpark, several businesses, single-family homes, and a lot of empty lots and lots that sit unused. Many business owners thought the area would be the next boom town, but that never happened. The city already owns a portion of the land. Midtown was a focus in 2018 to get a refresh when the city released a vision plan. City leaders are picking it up again, beginning by talking to property owners to see if owners would partner together with the city or consider selling to develop.

Title: Food Truck Park

Description: The first food truck park in Lee County broke ground in Bonita Springs. City leaders said it is a project that will transform downtown Bonita Springs. Many business owners said they remembered when the area was not developed as much. Now with historical

landmarks, public parks, and the Imperial River, the area is growing. The Project is expected to take about a year and a half, with the bar expected to open by late 2023.

Title: Is Southwest Florida Moving Too Fast

Description: As more people move to Southwest Florida, construction is in full swing to try and create less traffic. Over the past ten to twelve years, most areas within Southwest Florida have grown tremendously in size. But the growth has ramped up even more these past two years, specifically within Lee County. Due to the dramatic increase in population across the county, there are at least 12 road expansion projects underway to address congested roads. There are even more expansion projects in the works in the next five to ten years. There are also talks of expanding the highways in the area.

Data shows, as of April, that nearly one in three formula brands are sold out at stores. Families noticed scarce shelves nationwide, especially in specialty formulas. The shortage not only impacted parents, but also local organizations. Experts said the shortage is due to supply chain issues, rising inflation, and previous recalls on formula. More parents and caretakers explored alternatives. But those could be dangerous. Baby formula listings on third-party sites, like Facebook Marketplace, were on the rise. The listings often charged a premium fee. Others tried DIY baby formula recipes or diluted whatever formula they have left. The FDA strongly advised against both. Another option WZVN explored for viewers was human milk donors. WZVN talked to a resale shop that aims to help parents struggling to find baby formula in Fort Myers.

Title: Paper Shortage

Description: Paper is in short supply around the country and it is hitting businesses here in Southwest Florida. Not toilet paper or paper towels, but run-of-the-mill office paper. Staff members at Panther Printing in Fort Myers said, in 30 years of business, they have never seen anything like it. Along with the shortages, businesses say they are paying higher prices too. Owners blamed the supply issue in part on the majority of products coming from overseas.

Title: Inflation Hits Women

Description: Rising prices did not keep women from the hair salon, but they did find other ways to save money. Inflation hit 8.5 percent in March, the largest 12-month increase since the period ending December 1981, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Rising business expenses translated into price increases, but business was not slowing down. Viewers we talked to say they were not bargain hunting at the salon, but they could not overlook a good deal elsewhere. Many started going to consignment stores and thrift shops.

Title: Shrinkflation

Description: As inflation drove prices up, products were also shrinking in size. From toilet paper to yogurt and coffee to corn chips, manufacturers quietly shrunk package sizes without lowering prices. Ikt is dubbed "shrinkflation." A small box of Kleenex now has 60 tissues. A few months ago, it had 65. Chobani Flips yogurts have shrunk from 5.3 ounces to 4.5 ounces. Shrinkflation isn't new, experts say. But it proliferates in times of high inflation as companies grapple with rising costs for ingredients, packaging, labor, and transportation. Global consumer price inflation was up an estimated 7% in May. WZVN talked to local businesses forced to change what they buy to deal with rising prices.

Experts said inflating tires to the right pressure, and keeping uncessaring weight out of the trunk could save fuel. Experts say driving habits could save 10-20% at the gas station.

Description: Rising prices are not stopping Southwest Florida from dining out. According to data from Square, a digital payment platform, the price of some lunchtime staples are up as much as 18% from 2021. Those prices are being passed onto consumers. Title: Redistricting

Description: Election offices in Southwest Florida were crippled when Governor Ron DeSantis vetoed the state's congressional redistricting maps. There were concerns the maps could end up in court and with just four months before the next election. That could have become a major problem for election offices statewide. While lawmakers hashed out the new maps, election offices could not layout or print hundreds of thousands of ballots. They also can not program voting machines or tabulators. Voting rights groups accused the governor of pushing for the congressional map that was not fairly drawn. An appeals court reinstated the governor's chosen congressional map.

Title: Lee County 911 Upgrade

Description: Lee County commissioners unveiled improvements to Lee County's 911 system. There were 3 major upgrades. One was to the calling system. Calls will now be immediately routed to a call taker rather than a pooling system. 911 hang-ups will receive automatic callbacks. The system will automatically manage numerous tasks that were previously manual. Residents can now text 911 for help. The upgraded system also added advanced location services that use a phone's GPS signal to find the emergency. Officials said this upgrade marks the largest overhaul to the system in 35 years. The project cost \$3 million.

Title: Textbook Battle

Description: Math and race are not exactly two topics you would think have much to do with each other, but the Florida Department of Education says otherwise. The department rejected 54 math textbooks submitted to be used in Florida classrooms. They said it was because the books included references to critical race theory and included common core. The publishers whose books were rejected have a chance to appeal. The battle over books continued during a school district meeting. Residents in Collier County called on the school district to ban math and english books. They claimed the books contained references to LGBTQ issues and critical race theory. None of the people protesting the books were parents. The school district rejected the residents' requests.

Title: Disney Special District Status Stripped

Description: The Florida State Legislature voted to strip Disney of its self-governing power after a fued with Governor Ron Desantis. The feud started when Disney objected to the Parental Rights in Education Bill and pulled all political donations in Florida. DeSantis responded by pitching a bill to strip Disney of its self-governing power. Lawmakers passed it. The bill dissolves special district status granted before 1968. The Reedy Creek Improvement District was created so Disney could basically become its own city, operating its own fire department, police force, and trash pickup. Disney paid for all of these things. People in Orange and Osceola County don't pay taxes to keep Disney running. If this Reedy Creek Improvement District goes away, Disney will be forced to operate under county rules and taxpayers in the two counties will be forced to pay for all of its services adding up to about two billion dollars. WZVN also looked at special districts in Southwest Florida and how they would be impacted.

Title: Bible Banning
Description: An activist pushed to ban bibles from Florida schools. Starting July 1, a new law went into effect banning books and learning materials that discuss inappropriate content for

kids. The activist sent letters to 62 school districts asking for the banishment of any book that references the bible. The activist compared the bible's references to murder, adultery, sexual immorality, and fortification to "Date Night Friday Night." The activist was making a point that the new law is so broad, it can be used to ban almost any book.

Title: Superintendent Elections

Description: Lee County Superintendents could soon be elected, not appointed. Voters will decide in November whether they want to start electing superintendents. The state legislature approved the referendum. Prior to 1974 when the district had fewer than 30-thousand students, the superintendent's job was an elected position but voters then wanted it to be an appointed position. Across the US, there are more than 13,000 school districts and 99% of them appoint their superintendents rather than elect them. Florida and Alabama are the only two states that allow elected superintendents. Some fear elections can lead to unqualified candidates taking over the district. Others say they don't trust board members to appoint good candidates. If voters approve this referendum that means the next superintendent would be elected in 2024 for a four-year term.

Title: Does Your Vote Count

Description: Florida voters have made their voice heard and the Florida Legislature has often found a way to hit the 'mute' button and silence them. In Florida, voters can approve ballot initiatives with 60% of the vote, bypassing the legislature and signing off on issues directly. But on multiple occasions, state lawmakers have then undercut those efforts by tweaking, changing or outright neutering the intent of those initiatives.
