World Wildlife Federation “Wildlife Crime” 119 :30 second spots

WWF uses expertise in policy, wildlife trade, advocacy, and communications in an effort to stop wildlife crime in the US and around the world. ISSUES:

Weather & Environment

The number one priority from city, county and state leaders this summer is to prevent another blue-green algae crisis. Governor Ron Desantis established the first ever Blue-Green Algae task force. The committee is made up of scientists, researchers and state health leaders to help

monitor, track and research how blue-green algae grows and how to kill it. The committee has met twice this quarter. Funding and projects were approved for the committee to research both blue-green algae and red tide in our waterways.

Wellness & Safety

A big focus this quarter was the safety of our students waiting for the school bus in Lee County. At the end of March a Cape Coral 8-year-old was hit and killed while sitting on the grass waiting for her school bus. Police say the driver, Logan Hetherington, hit her and drove straight to work. For months parents, community leaders, the Lee County school district and Lee County Sheriff's Office worked on ways to keep kids safe at the bus stop. It started with make-shift projects made by homeowners. Then the city of Cape Coral partnered with the other local groups to regulate 'Safe Zones.' The city created 40 hurricane proof bus stop benches and put them at some of the most dangerous bus stops across Cape Coral and Lee County. They hope to have the new Safe Zones set up by the beginning of school this fall.

Tourism & Local Economy

Boat races are coming back to Fort Myers Beach. After nearly 15 years, boat racing will return to Fort Myers Beach. The racing is expected to draw in thousands of people and millions of tourist dollars. The town is expecting to see 70,000 people and an estimated \$6 million pumped into local shops and hotels. It is set for this October. It's been 15 years in the making and Cape Coral is finally moving forward with a new park to attract more youth programs and sports. The city is paying for it with the \$60 million bond voters approved last November. The park will receive more than \$5 million of that bond.

Politics & Government

The Florida Legislature finished up this year's session in mid-May. For months we reported on the potential new laws Florida was considering. Only one in ten actually passed. Of the 1,861 bills filed just 195 passed and most were signed by the Governor. Some of the most impactful passed: 1) Texting and driving is now a primary offense in Florida. 2) Felons who have served their time must pay off court fees and fines before becoming eligible to vote. 3) Local government entities are prohibited from adopting or enforcing ordinances and regulations relating to single-use plastic straws. Plus, the Department of Agriculture has also created the first ever Hemp and Medical Marijuana Committee. It will monitor the industry and how to grow and distribute hemp and CBD in Florida.

Technology & Social Media

Naples leaders want to improve traffic and wait time at stop lights. Naples accepted a \$129,000 grant from the Florida Department of Transportation to try to use bluetooth in cars and at the traffic lights to monitor the flow of cars on the road. Amazon's Alexa could be listening to your conversation without you knowing it. Florida's Chief Financial Officer sent out a warning to Alexa customers about the sharing medical records with the device.

Positively Southwest Florida

Local organizations are lending a hand to those in need through a new mobile app to help Collier County students who may not get lunch now that school is out. Lee County foster children are being placed with their forever families, but there are still many without homes. Thanks to the help of a local restaurant owner, he's giving some of his profits to local foster children to help improve their opportunities while bouncing from home to home. A Collier County student created a new app that gives students a safe zone to talk about school and after hour programs online.

Title: Collier Beach Improvements

Description: Collier County leaders want to widen the beaches in the county. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers want to spend \$30 million to make beaches wider and taller. It would protect our area from serious storm surge during a hurricane or tropical storm.

Title: Nuisance Alligators

Description: Within a one week timeframe, alligators have been found in pools, storm drains and even on school campuses. Florida Fish and Wildlife sent out a warning about nuisance alligators wandering into places they shouldn't be reminding residents it's mating season and the reptiles can be aggressive.

Title: Manatee Rescue

Description: An 8-foot long manatee rescued from a drainage ditch in Fort Myers. A bunch of neighbors crowded around the canal along Summerlin Road as Florida Fish and Wildlife crews rescued the manatee. Crews say after several days with heavy downpours, the manatee was able to make his way into the canal. The manatee was rescued and relocated with a new name Brantley.

Title: Fort Myers Algae is Back

Description: ABC7 confirmed the green build up in the canals behind a Fort Myers home is toxic blue-green algae. Our crews found the green gunk a few days before, so our crews took

samples to a scientist at Florida Gulf Coast University. Experts confirm it is the toxic algae that took over our canals during the summer of 2018. Last summer, it killed hundreds of thousands of sea life and banned fishing for months. Experts say it's not expected to grow as bad as last year.

Title: Kissing Bugs

Description: New concerns over kissing bugs in Florida. A lot of people are talking about the deadly bugs online. A Golden Gate Estates woman says she thinks she found them in her yard. We took them to the experts. An environmentalist said it was not a kissing bug. Experts say they could be in Collier County and could be crawling around in Florida. But so far no residents have to worry of the bugs biting people.

Title: Blue-Green Algae Task Force

Description: For the first time in history, Florida Governor, Ron DeSantis approved a new Blue-Green Algae task force. The committee is made up of three Southwest Florida leaders and local college scientists. The committee will study how the toxic algae forms, how to prevent it from spreading, the health effects of the algae and how Lake Okeechobee release relate to the blue-green algae growth. The committee was appointed and had one meeting during the second quarter of this year.

Title: Lemon Bay Algae

Description: Scientists at Florida Gulf Coast University confirm toxic blue-green algae was found at Lemon Bay. The algae was found on the Charlotte side of Englewood and on the Sarasota County side as well. County officials put out health warning signs to let people know before getting into the water.

Duration: 4:00

Title: Water Crisis Meeting

Description: An open door discussion on water crisis only attracted about 50 people in Collier County. A week earlier there was a meeting between the CDC, Health Officials and several Florida lawmakers. The public and the media was not invited. Congressman Francis Rooney did hold a press conference after the meeting to tell the public what it was about. Several people were angry it was a meeting about public health, but closed off the public.

Title: Naples Fertilizer

Description: The city wants to ban fertilizer use in lawns and businesses during the rainy season. City leaders approved to ban nitrogen and phosphorus based fertilizers. Some believe the fertilizers wash down the roads during big down pours and into our canals and waterways. Some believe it is a factor in blue-green algae blooms.

Title: Algae Research

Description: Summertime is here and the big question across Southwest Florida is will the nasty blue-green algae return to our waterways? It killed off marine life and many want to know what it can do humans and our health. The Centers for Disease Control is planning to research the long-term health effects of harmful algae blooms. The CDC is in the early stages of planning the study, but the agency wants to recruit 50 people who lived near the algae infected waterways last summer. CDC plans to start the research in early 2020 during bloom season.

Title: Collier Evacuation Zones

Description: There's a new hurricane evacuation procedure for Collier County residents. Instead of evacuating everyone at once, Collier County officials will evacuate in zones. Before the evacuations were ordered for a broad area at a time. Now the county will be broken up into zones. Homeowners are expected to know their zone in case of an emergency or another hurricane hits Southwest Florida.

Title: Bear Vs. Truck on 75

Description: A Florida black bear is the cause behind a serious crash on I-75 in Collier County. Three people were hurt, one was a child. A pick-up truck hit the bear on the interstate, then a semi-truck flipped trying to avoid the crash. It happened near the Bonita Beach Road exit backing up traffic for nearly ten miles. The bear was hit by 5 vehicles before everyone came to a stop. Troopers say the bear just wandered out of the woods. Crews warn while the population continues to grow, so do our chances for increased incidents with Florida wildlife.

Title: The Dead Zone

Description: The Gulf of Mexico could soon feature a lifeless swath, the size of a small state. There is a dead zone in the Gulf of Mexico that expands and shrinks every year. Researchers warn the patch could become the size of Massachusetts this summer. Those dead zones have extremely low levels of oxygen in it, killing almost anything living in it. Researchers say the dead fish rot and can cause huge red tide blooms. The good news for Southwest Florida, it sits at the mouth of the Mississippi, and researchers say it's moving west.

Title: Animal Crossings

Description: Bears, panthers and coyotes caught on camera crossing I-75. State leaders are concerned with a new toll project to run through some of Florida's most rural areas, crews want to build more animal crossings. It's essentially an underpass underneath I-75 to allow wildlife to pass the busy highway without putting drivers in danger. Crews want to put two new crossings at State Road 82 in Collier County and another one at State Road 29.

Title: Recycling Robot

Description: A new robot is revolutionizing the way we get rid of trash! A recycling company in Sarasota is using a machine with a mind of its own. It actually learns as it works and can sift through hundreds of tons of trash a day. It's the first of its kind in the entire state. It will pick up 80 items a minute, twice as fast as a person. Eight more of the robotic arms are coming to the Sarasota facility this August.

Title: Summer Heat

Description: It's officially the first day of summer and Southwest Florida hit near-record heat. Several heat advisories are out through the weekend. WZVN meteorologists predict we could break a record this weekend. City officials are warning parents to test the temperature of playgrounds before letting kids play on hot outdoor equipment. Plus, veterinarians warn pet owners to keep pets hydrated and off hot pavement if they plan to be outside.

Title: Make-Shift Bus Stops

Description: After the death of an 8-year-old Cape Coral girl, hit and killed waiting for her school bus, the community isn't waiting for the city and county to make changes. Several organizations have been started after Layla Aiken's death. The "Babes for Benches" organization is now teaming up with the Rotary Clubs in Cape Coral pushing city leaders to set new safety guidelines at bus stops. Rotary clubs want to add benches at Lee County School District bus stops, to keep kids off the road.

Title: Buy Benches for Bus Stops

Description: A dad in Cape Coral posted a Facebook video online saying if someone from the community pays for a bench from Lowe's, he'd pick it up, build it and put it at a school bus stop. He called it the #ParkBenchChallenge. It went viral locally. The challenge started after a Cape Coral 8-year-old was hit and killed at her bus stop. Daniel Webb started a minor workshop with dozens of Cape Coral residents to build and put the bus stop benches in place, while the city and Lee County School District work on new code enforcement for the benches.

Title: Kratom Warning

Description: The Centers for Disease Control are sending out a warning about an herbal supplement called kratom. It could cause seizures, hallucinations, psychosis and in serious cases death. According to the CDC between 2016 and 2017 kratom overdose killed 91 people nationwide.

Title: Pickleball Health Concerns

Description: A popular pickleball park has been the center of controversy for weeks in Punta Gorda. A community surrounding the parks says the constant sound of pickleball is unbearable. One man says the sound even caused him to have a stroke. Bernie Depaul spent \$10,000 of his own money to pay for a study to see if it's possible. The study done by Thorton Acoustics and Vibrations, says the noise of pickleball creates a human health risk. The city eventually voted to create a pickleball committee to manage issues between the court and the community. Plus the city bought acoustic sound barriers to block out the sounds.

Title: Tobacco and E-cigarette Use

Description: Florida state leaders launch a week-long campaign about teens using tobacco. State leaders specifically warn parents about the 'e-epidemic' across the country. Experts say the e-cig trend among teens has reached epidemic levels. Also this same week, Lee County School District holding three seminars about how to keep kids tobacco free and alcohol free.

Title: Bobcat on Pole

Description: A bobcat climbed on top of an electrical pole along I-75 in Collier County. Florida Highway Department of Transportation noticed it on their cameras. WZVN put the live video on Facebook and the post went viral. Florida Fish and Wildlife were called to the scene and helped lure the bobcat down safely. The bobcat was a bit dehydrated but got away safely. The entire rescue was caught on camera.

Title: Golden Gate Gun Noise

Description: Gun shots keeping people up in Golden Gate Estates caused community members to ask county commissioners to change the laws on backyard shooting ranges. The shootings aren't crime related; and, county commissioners essentially can't do much because backyard shooting is protected under a Florida state statute.

Title: Ahmed Ahmed 911 Call

Description: A resident in Collier County went to Off the Hook Comedy Club in Naples and called 911 on a comedian. The comedian and actor, Ahmed Ahmed, made a joke about the number of Muslims in the crowd. A person in the audience didn't like the joke and accused the comedian of making a terrorist comment. Collier County deputies responded to the club, but after investigating he was not charged.

Title: Longer Days at School

Description: The school days are about to get longer for Charlotte County students.

Kindergartners all the way to seniors will be spending an extra half hour at school come fall 2019. The school district approved the time extension in order to help students with test preps. The extra half hour to pay teachers and staff will come from the tax increase approved by voters in November 2018.

Title: Helpless Addition

Description: A special report done by ABC7 anchor Jeff Butera provides unique perspective on the growing drug crisis in Southwest Florida through the eyes of parents whose daughter was addicted to heroin and meth. The Collier County mom and dad watched their child spiral out of control. Deputies suggested putting her in jail could be the safest place for her. So the parents charged their daughter with trespassing. She was arrested and sent to jail for the night. The next morning deputies went to check on her and she was dead. She committed suicide.

Title: Cape Deadly Hit and Run Arrest

Description: The man accused of hitting and killing a Cape Coral 8-year-old was arrested. Cape Coral police arrested Logan Hetherington for driving the red truck that killed the little girl in March. One of WZVN's primary anchors reported live from the press conference during the 6 and 7pm newscasts. The crime rocked the community when it happened sparking change to school bus stop regulations across Lee County. Since her death parents, residents and grandparents have been pushing county and district leaders to make bus stops safer for kids

waiting in the dark. Logan Hetherington has entered a not guilty plea.

Title: Hetherington Bonds Out

Description: What's next for the man accused of hitting and killing a Cape Coral 8-year-old waiting for her school bus? Logan Hetherington was charged with vehicular manslaughter, driving away from the scene of a crash and two other drug charges. He has entered a not guilty plea. But police say they have surveillance video of Hetherington's truck driving through the neighborhood where Layla Aiken was killed. Officers also say Hetherington was texting and googling about how car technology detects if it hits something. Police say Hetherington was also texting his dad and a friend after the crash happened saying he was quote 'going to jail.'

Title: Keywest Express Rescue

Description: A popular shuttle service taking people to Key West is being thanked for rescuing people in the Gulf of Mexico. A group was on a boat just off the coast of Marco Island, when the Key West Express heard about a report for a rescue not far from them. The group's boat was on fire and the crew on Key West Express turned to help rescue the people. Naples fire rescue arrived shortly after to put out the massive fire on the boat. The couple and their two dogs were not hurt.

Title: First Safe Zones up

Description: The first of the new Safe Zones will start to go up this week to help make School Bus Stops safer. The community rallied together for months after a Cape Coral 8-year-old was hit and killed by a runaway driver waiting for her school bus. The rotary club of Cape Coral is teaming up with the Kiwanis Club, the city, Lee County School District and even local businesses to fund new bus stop benches. The clubs will build 40 benches for 40 bus stops across Lee County. The benches are hurricane proof and will be cemented into the ground.

Title: FMPD and Ring

Description: Fort Myers Police Department and city leaders just approved a partnership with the Ring Doorbell Company. Now the police station is partnering with the company to use home surveillance video to help catch crooks. Police can not access the video unless the homeowner gives officers permission.

The Woman in the Suitcase

On February 21, 2005, Inna Budnytska was found unconscious, naked, beaten and near death, abandoned in an undeveloped Miami cul-de-sac. Budnytska, a guest in a nearby airport hotel, had no memory of her attack and rape. Authorities looked at the hotel's surveillance footage for potential answers, but found puzzling information. In a two-hour documentary, "20/20" reports on the mysterious case and features private investigator Ken Brennan discovering how Budnytska left the hotel and tracking down the man whose DNA matched her attacker.

Your Biggest Fan

named Robert John Bardo, trekked across state lines and shot her point blank at the door of her Los Angeles home, killing her. "20/20" looks back at Rebecca's life and budding career, and uncovers the details of Bardo's fixation, exploring the startling truth behind what it's like to have a stalker and how stalking laws have changed in the aftermath of Rebecca's death.

Donor 106

A "20/20" documentary event exclusively documents the emotional journey of Eve Wiley as she searches for her biological father. Eve was conceived with the help of a sperm donor and thought she found her father 14 years ago when she was united with "Donor 106" from the sperm bank's records, and the two formed a loving father-daughter relationship. But recently, as Eve searched DNA websites for siblings, she was shocked to discover that "Donor 106" wasn't her father and instead, her biological father is her mother's former fertility doctor. ABC News consultant CeCe Moore and alongside ABC News investigative correspondent Kyra Phillips report.

Friday, May 10, 2019

Death Row

After claiming to survive the brutal stabbing that left her two sons dead, Dallas housewife Darlie Routier urged police to find the alleged intruder. In a shocking twist, she became the No. 1 suspect and was sentenced to death. Now, nearly 23 years since the case first captured the nation's attention, a two-hour "20/20" documentary explores the details of the crime, trial and Darlie's current defense team's retrial strategy for her as she sits on death row.

Overturned

When 19-year-old college student Mark Fisher was murdered, the public outcry was deafening. John Giuca and his neighbor Antonio Russo were both convicted and sentenced to 25 years to life in prison for Fisher's murder. But, just last year, Giuca's conviction was overturned by an appeals court and, shortly after, Russo confessed to detectives that he shot and killed Fisher, without implicating Giuca. A two-hour "20/20" documentary reports on new details of the case, and features a new interview with anchor Juju Chang.

Friday, May 24, 2019

One Night in Central Park

Trisha Meili was viciously beaten, raped and left to die inside New York City's Central Park. The series of events that followed, triggered a media frenzy and forever changed the lives of all involved, including the five African American and Hispanic teenagers – Raymond Santana, Antron McCray, Yusef Salaam, Kevin Richardson and Korey Wise – who were convicted in the attack due to their confessions, which they said were coerced by police. Their verdicts were later set aside after Matias Reyes confessed to and was convicted in the attack. Now, 30 years after the attack, a two-hour "20/20" documentary re-examines the brutal crime and its aftermath.

Friday, May 31, 2019

The Final Act

In May 2010, authorities found a 23-year-old college student and dancer, Juri "Julie" Kibuishi, dead inside the home of her close friend Sam Herr. Police initially suspected that Sam pulled the trigger, but as they continued to investigate, they quickly unraveled the mystery that Sam's friend and neighbor, Daniel Wozniak, was the true killer. Wozniak confessed to killing Sam. ABC News correspondent Jim Avila reports the new details of the case, including Wozniak's confession, motive and fate as sits on death row.

The Perfect Nanny

When Michele MacNeill's 6-year-old child found her unresponsive in her bathtub, her daughters Alexis Somers and Rachel MacNeill immediately suspected that their father, Martin MacNeill, had killed her. It took authorities five years to charge Martin, a wealthy doctor and father of eight, with Michele's murder. A two-hour "20/20" documentary reports on the twists and turns of the story including what prosecutors say was Martin's plot to kill Michele; his affair with another woman, Gypsy Willis, who moved in as the nanny just weeks after Michele's death.

Diane Downs

A mother's infatuation with a married man who said he had no interest in being a father to anyone's children was the possible motive behind the crimes of Diane Downs, who shot her three young children in her car, seriously injuring two and killing one. Diane captured the nation's attention as the story made headlines and became a bestselling book and a two-part TV series starring Farrah Fawcett, both titled "Small Sacrifices." Now, 36 years after that tragic day, Diane's youngest child, Becky Babcock, who was born while Diane was incarcerated and adopted by another family, speaks to "20/20" in a new interview. (OAD: 3/22/19)

Friday, June 28, 2019

A Family Affair

Ronald "Scott" Catt shocked a community when police apprehended him in Texas for doing what most fathers could never imagine – robbing two banks of \$108,000 with his son, Hayden, while his 18-year-old daughter, Abby, drove the getaway car. A two-hour "20/20" documentary unravels the details behind the heists, including the manipulative tactics Scott used to rope Hayden and Abby into the crimes.

1969: Manson Girls

Two young women, while still in their teens, fell in love with Charles Manson and became part of his group of devoted followers. Lynette "Squeaky" Fromme and Dianne Lake describe in revelatory detail the journeys that led each of them to join the so-called "Manson Family." The two former Manson Family members give an inside view of what life with Charles was like; how the counter culture of the '60s that extolled sex, drugs and rock 'n roll shaped their view of the world; and the convictions that moved the group toward a violent drug-fueled murder spree that left seven dead, including actress Sharon Tate, who was more than eight months pregnant at the time and living in the home she shared with her, husband, Roman Polanski.

1969: The Girl in the Car

While Apollo 11 astronauts orbited the moon preparing for their historic landing, realizing a goal set by the late President John F. Kennedy, his brother Senator Ted Kennedy drove off a bridge into the waters of Martha's Vineyard. Ted left a young woman, Mary Jo Kopechne, in the submerged car. Kopechne died and her story has largely been lost to history as the media and the public focused on the man whose career was forever damaged by the accident.

Tuesday, May 14, 2019

1969: The FBI and the Panther

In 1969, a running battle between the Department of Justice, the Nixon White House and the Black Power movement reached its height. Patterns of infiltration, wiretapping and violence marked that year.
