ISSUES

BP HORIZON OIL SPILL

This quarter we continue to keep our viewers up to date on the efforts to contain the flow of oil in the Gulf, the efforts to cap the well and resulting problems caused by the oil spill. This story is significant to our viewers because it is impacting tourism, threatening our beaches, hurting local food pantries and depressing home sales.

CRIME & PUBLIC SAFETY

Obviously personal safety is of keen interest to our viewers and they want to know how law enforcement is tracking down criminals and learn preventive measures to stop crime or accidents. This quarter we tell viewers about the red light camera law that is now in effect across the state, a soccer coach arrested for lewd and lascivious behavior, a car loan fraud ring broken up in Cape Coral and the impact that budget cuts are having on firefighters. This quarter we broadcast a half hour special on hurricane season and how residents should prepare.

DEVELOPMENT

Southwest Florida continues to struggle to climb out of the recession. While the economy is tough, managing the development in our area is still a top issue. The area has grown tremendously in the last decade and residents are sensitive to congestion and the impact on the environment they love however they understand the need to grow and develop to keep the area vital. This quarter we tell viewers about a grocery store coming to a low income area that has been without a store for 3 years, a project to install sidewalks is moved up by a year following pedestrian accidents, a roadways extension in Collier County and a new facility for Lee County's Public Bus Transportation.

POLITICS & GOVERNMENT

From the national scene to the local cities in our area, we cover the movement of politicians and the laws they work to pass. This quarter we keep viewers up to date one who is running for what offices. We tell viewers about the campaign activities and the positions of the candidates. We follow a number of bills making their way to the Senate as our elected leaders in Washington work to pass laws that will help to prevent a future recession, further regulate banks and provide funding to extend unemployment benefits. We also cover the local political scene and in one story explain how the City of Cape Coral is being sued by a developer for not allowing his planned high rise.

ECONOMY

On a daily basis, we provide viewers with a snapshot of the health of the economy. This quarter we let viewers about gas prices, unemployment, foreclosures, the financial markets, jobless announcements and housing starts. Residents in our area continue to suffer from excessively high unemployment and many face losing their homes. We tell viewers about an effort to try to allow people to stay in their homes and a grant that is providing judges to go through the backlog of 22,000 foreclosure cases. We tell viewers about the less than exciting summer travel forecast and show them how local municipalities are dealing with budget shortfalls.

ENVIRONMENT

Southwest Florida has a sensitive environment. We live in a coastal community with multiple rivers, swamps and lakes. Our environment is what attracts people – so keeping it healthy is vital to its economy. Many of our residents are passionate about protecting wildlife and the quality of life that drew them here in the first place. This quarter we tell viewers about a new system that will allow them to monitor beaches and see daily pictures of 8 beaches in Lee County, we explain how the threatened snowy plover population is declining and detail a new program for tracking sea turtle nests.

BP DEEPWATER HORIZON OIL SPILL

Title: Oil Containment Day 73

Date/Time: July 1, 2010 All newscasts

Duration: 7:00

Today is Day 73 following the explosion on the Deepwater Horizon rig in the Gulf. We have provided significant coverage of this explosion, the oil spill and the resulting impacts to wildlife, beaches, tourism and the economy. At this time, it looks as though the containment cap over the well is working but Hurricane Alex is making conditions in the Gulf rough and difficult for clean up and containment efforts. Governor Charlie Crist has asked BP for \$50 million for Florida to promote tourism throughout the state. Publix Supermarkets are starting a campaign to let consumers know Florida fish is safe. The State is asking inventors to show the best ways to clean tar up off beaches and Charlotte County is asking for special funding. Hurricane Alex brings tar balls up onto Panhandle beaches and water warnings are posted there.

Title: Crisis in the Gulf Day 77

Date/Time: July 5, 2010 All newscasts

Duration: 10:00

Engineers are working to put wells in place to contain the gushing oil. The first may be placed by early August and the second a few weeks later. They are also working on a blowout preventer concerned the pressure is so great that the current efforts to contain the oil may not hold. Clean up efforts are being delayed because of Hurricane Alex. Warnings are posted on Gulf Beaches in

the panhandle telling people to stay out of the water. We also take a look at the health toll the spill is taking on people.

Title: Oil Flow Finally Stopped on Day 87

Date/Time: July 15, 2010 All newscasts

Duration: 12:00

The oil flow from the blown out well at the bottom of the Gulf has finally stopped after 87 days. While it has been successfully capped, this is only a temporary measure as the permanent solution is the 2 relief wells. We also discuss the claims against BP and the systems in place for claims to be made against the oil giant. We also talk with local realtors to find out some transactions have been cancelled as a result of the oil spill and there are concerns it will have a negative impact on the local housing industry.

Title: Day 107 Oil in the Gulf Static Kill Procedure Successful

Date/Time: August 4, 2010 all newscasts

Duration: 8:00

The Gulf oil spill has now completely been stopped after 107 days and 205 million gallons of oil. Workers permanently plugged the top of the Deepwater Horizon rig. A second effort is still underway to seal the well from below.

Title: Sanibel Food Pantry Hurt by Oil Spill/St. Matthew House in Collier

Date/Time: August 26, 2010 6pm

Duration: 2:45

A Sanibel food pantry is struggling to meet its clients' needs. The Gulf Oil spill has drastically reduced the number of tourists visiting the island in the summer. As a result donations are down. The need for food is greater as workers have lost income. We profile this organization, the work it does, the people it serves and how viewers can help. The situation is much the same for St. Matthews House in Collier County. We show this organization and talk with its executive director.

CRIME & PUBLIC SAFETY

Title: Red Light Cameras

Date/Time: July 1, 2010 6am August 4, 2010 6pm

Duration: 1:30

We have been following the controversy surrounding red light cameras for well over a year. The Red Light Bill is now in effect. The statewide fine will be \$160 for running a red light. This is also a follow up to all the coverage we have given to the red light camera controversy in Collier County. The \$160 state fine is double what the fines were in Collier County. In Collier County receipts from red light runners start to drop. In April, 5,000 drivers were caught running red lights and in July it was only 700.

Title: 4th of July Bottle Rocket Destroys a Home

Date/Time: July 5, 2010 6pm 7pm

Duration: 3:00

A bottle rocket zooms into a house window causing a fire. The house was destroyed before fire fighters could get there. The family may face charges as it is illegal to light anything other than sparklers in Florida.

Title: Budget Constraints Impact Firefighters

Date/Time: July 15, 2010 6pm 11pm

Duration: 3:00

We talk with local firefighters about the impact that budget constraints are having on their staffing. They have to do creative scheduling that prevents them from having all positions staffed. In the case of the fire that changes their plan of attack. Now firefighters are going through training to make sure they stay safe as they try to keep you safe.

Title: Soccer Coach Arrested for Leud and Lascivious Behavior with a Minor

Date/Time: July 28, 2010 6pm 7pm

Duration: 3:30

A local soccer coach is arrested. We have been following the investigation of Adrian Holland. He is a well liked soccer coach suspected of sending inappropriate messages to young teens. We provide the details that investigators are just now releasing.

Title: ABC7 News Surviving a Hurricane

Date/Time: July 28, 2010 8pm-8:30pm

Duration: 30:00

In this 30 minute prime time special we detail what viewers need to do to be prepared. From explaining what should be in their hurricane kits, to how they should prepare their landscaping to what they should do with critical documents, this special covers a wide spectrum of how viewers can be prepared this hurricane season.

Title: Samir Cabrera Ruling

Date/Time: August 3, 2010 6pm 7pm 11pm August 4, 2010 11pm

Duration: 2:45

We have been following the case against Samir Cabrera since 2008. Tonight we learn the convicted real estate broker's attorney's have filed an amended appeal to his conviction. A ruling by the Supreme Court in June weakened one of the laws that Cabrera was convicted of breaking. The appeal argues that his convictions be thrown out because the federal law is vague and the evidence was insufficient to support the conviction.

Title: Night Out Against Crime

Date/Time: August 3, 2010 6pm 11pm

Duration: 2:00

Residents of Fort Myers participate in an anti-crime march along Palm Beach Blvd. We interview the Police Chief who explains this event helps build the relationship between citizens and law enforcement. The campaign brings public awareness to crime and drug prevention. In Collier County, law enforcement officers perform bomb squad demonstrations and K9 searches.

Title: Cape Car Loan Fraud Ring Broken

Date/Time: August 26, 2010 6pm 7pm 11pm

Duration: 3:50

Cape Coral Police bust 4 men for car loan fraud. The men are accused of buying 9 cars and then getting a towing company to tow the cars and place liens on the cars. We explain to viewers how the investigators figured out this elaborate scheme.

DEVELOPMENT

Title: Sav A lot Opening in downtown Fort Myers

Date/Time: July 15, 2010 6pm 7pm

Duration: 2:15

Sav A lot will open a grocery store in the vacant shopping center located in downtown Fort Myers. Publix left the location 3 years ago. Many people who have low incomes live in the area and have had had no close options for 3 years. This is significant because many people in this area walk to the grocery store and do not have cars.

Title: Lee Tran

Date/Time: July 20, 2010 6pm

Duration:1:00

The Lee County bus operation will build a new facility on a 23 acre parcel on Evans Avenue. This could mean 450 construction jobs and an economic shot in the arm for the county. This location

also provides enough space for the facility to expand in the future. State and Federal money will pay for the new facility.

Title: Santa Barbara Expansion Opens in Collier County

Date/Time: August 3, 2010 6pm 7pm

Duration: 1:30

A roadway expansion opens in Collier County. This cut commute time in half for some drivers and eases congestion on the surrounding roads.

Title: Sidewalks

Date/Time: August 26, 2010 6pm 7pm 11pm

Duration: 5:25

The state provides Cape Coral with a \$300,000 grant to build sidewalks on Trafalgar Parkway from Skyline to Santa Barbara. This project will start one year ahead of schedule. This comes after two accidents where children were struck by cars on the roadway. We talk with the mother who lost her son. The speed limits in the area have also been reduced.

Title: Jackson Labs in Collier County

Date/Time: September 14, 2010 6pm

Duration: 2:10

Jackson Labs, a biomedical company from Maine, makes a pitch to come to Collier County bringing badly needed jobs to the area. However, Collier County Commissioners turn down the plan because they don't have enough information.

Title: Burnt Store Road

Date/Time: September 23, 2010 7pm

Duration: 1:45

Burnt Store Road in Cape Coral has been approved for a widening project. The state grant is for \$7.7 million. The widening project will help to make the road safer as lights will be installed at intersections. This route is also a hurricane evacuation route.

POLITICS & GOVERNMENT

Title: Financial Reform

Date/Time: July 15, 2010 7pm 11pm

Duration: 3:00

A financial reform bill is passed in the Senate that will crack down on Wall Street. The intent is for this legislation to help prevent another recession. The law calls for two new government agencies and tougher rules that will regulate banks and investment.

Title: Unemployment Benefits

Date/Time: July 20, 2010 7pm 11pm

Duration: 2:30

We have been following the efforts in Washington, D.C. to pass legislation extending unemployment benefits. With a new democratic senator sworn in, we let viewers know that the bill will come up for a vote tomorrow and is expected to pass. Republicans are not happy with the plan but they do not have enough votes to block it.

Title: Ruling on Arizona Immigration Law

Date/Time: July 28, 2010 7pm

Duration: 2:15

With an influx of immigrants living in southwest Florida, our residents have been watching the passage of the Arizona Immigration law closely. Now we follow up and let our viewers know a federal court has dramatically weakened the Arizona law that goes into effect tomorrow. We also provide a statement from Bill McCollum.

Title: Developer Sues City of Cape Coral

Date/Time: August 3, 2010 6pm 11pm

Duration: 3:00

The city of Cape Coral is being sued by a developer it denied. The developer had hoped to build a 14 story high rise in the northwest part of the city. Council members turned the development down after reviewing recommendations of city staff, planning and planning and zoning.

Title: Vote 2010

Duration: 2:15

We provide a summary of the days activities of politicians running for various offices this year. We tell voters about the candidates for Governor in Florida and who Alex Sink has chosen as a running mate, the latest poll out on Rick Scott and Bill McCollum and the campaign events of Greene and Meek.

Title: Collier Approves Funding to promote Tourism

Date/Time: September 16, 2010 6pm

Duration: 1:00

Collier County Commissioners approve a one time love of \$1million from a beach and park facility fund to help promote tourism. This brings the total dollars that the Convention and Visitors Bureau has to market the area to \$3million.

Duration: 2:00 x 2 daily Monday-Friday

This daily segment gives an overview of the economy and the hot issues of the upcoming day and the big news from the day before.

Title: Unemployment Rates/Jobless Figures/Home Sales/Stock Market Indexes/Gas Prices/Foreclosures

Date/Time: Multiple dates and newscasts as numbers are released county, state & federal levels

Duration: 90:00+

We regularly provide the unemployment figures, homes sales, stock market index results, gas prices and foreclosures and explain to provide viewers these gauges of the economy. This quarter pending home sales drop to a record low. For the first half of the year, Fort Myers/Cape Coral was ranked 2nd in the country for # of foreclosures and Naples/Marco Island was ranked 13th. We reported in August that Lee Counties weekly foreclosures have dropped in half.

Title: Property Appraisals Throughout Southwest Florida Counties

Date/Time: July 1, 2010 6pm 7pm 11pm

Duration: 3:00

We tell viewers how property appraisals are down throughout the area and provide percentages for each county and some of the larger cities. We explain how these values impact the budgets of the government entities.

Title: Summer Travel Forecast

Duration: 3:15

AAA releases its summer travel forecast for Florida and the numbers are not good. We also call many local hotels and booking agencies to find that people are not willing to risk coming to Florida even if the beaches are clean right now.

Title: Foreclosure Court

Duration: 1:00

22,000 foreclosure cases sit in the Lee County court system. A program with \$425,000 in state funding for one year pays for judges to work through cases. We look at how the program is working and the progress it has made so far clearing 2,200 cases in one month.

Duration: 4:45

We show viewers how Lee County and Cape Coral are cutting budgets and losing positions. We explains how these cuts will impact serves in the area. Lee County staffing is at 2000 levels serving a 40% larger population.

Florida Fish and Wildlife are keeping a much closer eye on sea turtle nests as the oil spill in the gulf has a huge impact on wildlife. They are now digging up the nests, checking the eggs and using a GPS to track the location of every nest. The FWC then posts stakes around the nests to protect them.

Title: Beach Monitoring System

Date/Time: August 3, 2010 6pm 7pm

Duration: 1:30

Mote marine Laboratory has purchased 11 droid phones through a grant from the Lee County Tourist Development Council. These smart phones will be used to provide pictures with the "beach conditions" reports put out twice a day. The reports will list whether beaches have red tide, dead fish, rip currents or oil.

Title: Single stream recycling

Date/Time: August 4, 2010 6pm 7pm

Duration: 2:00

A new single stream recycling system comes on line in Lee County. Now residents can throw all their recycled items into one bin and the multi million dollar machines will sort the refuse.

Title: Snowy Plover

Date/Time: August 4, 2010 6pm 7pm

Duration: 1:30

The number of snowy plovers on Sanibel Island is down and environmentalists are worried the number may drop lower as many of the females are at the end of their life cycle. People are told to stay away 100 feet away from the birds as the exposure to humans causes them stress. The cold winter and stormy spring also contribute to the low numbers. The snowy plover is one of Florida most threatened birds.

Title: State of Emergency in North Fort Myers

Duration: 2:00

Flooding rains cause Lee County Commissioners to declare a state of emergency. The North Fort Myers Fire Chief says this is the worst flooding he has seen in 15 years. We talk with the fire chief, residents and commissioners about what this means and what kind of help residents can expect.

- **DATE RAPE:** Suppose you saw a stranger slip a suspicious powder into his date's drink - would you tell his date?
- **GAS THEFT:** When a man takes a running pump from another car and puts it into his tank while the victim is inside the store, will any motorists nearby confront the thief or alert the station attendant?
- **SUPERMARKET-EXPRESS:** Suppose customers are in the express check-out line at a grocery store behind a person with an overflowing shopping cart. Will they say something in this all too familiar situation or just hold their tongue?
- **FIVE MILLIONTH CUSTOMER:** A sweet, elderly woman asks to cut in the express check-out line at a supermarket only to discover she is the store's "five millionth customer," winning a check for \$500. When the younger woman she cut in front of speaks up to claim a prize that is rightfully hers, how do people react?

Friday, July 16, 2010

- **BEGGING:** With high gasoline prices and a falling economy, how will people react to someone who approaches them begging not for money, but for a few gallons of gasoline?
- **SHOPLIFTING:** A mother shoplifts and uses her daughter as an accomplice, placing the stolen items in her child's backpack. Will fellow shoppers step in and confront the mother in front of the child – or mind their own business?
- **VANDALISM:** Will anyone in the neighborhood intervene when they witness teenagers trashing a parked car? And will the reactions differ if the vandals are black?

- **POLYGAMY:** At a restaurant just outside of Las Vegas, Nevada, a man in his 60s and his three wives are celebrating his impending marriage to a 15-year-old girl, who is visibly upset about becoming wife #4 against her will. How will fellow diners react to a reluctant child bride in need of help?
- **LATINO BASHING:** Straight from the headlines of men being attacked because they are Latino, Qui-ones asks, "What Would You Do" if you witnessed a hate crime?.
- **INFOMERCIALS:** Many infomercials are true, but what about some of those "real people" you see whose lives have been "magically transformed." How many people would make outrageous claims about a product they have never used or that they know doesn't work, and even may cause harm - just because they were offered money and a chance to be on television?

Friday, July 30, 2010

- **HAZING:** Hazing is all too common on college campuses and even high schools across the country. Although hazing normally goes on behind closed doors, what will happen when guys in diapers led around like dogs or saran wrapped to a pole are forced to drink what appears to be a staggering amount of alcohol in a public place?
- **MOMZILLA:** Shopping for a wedding dress should be a wonderful experience for all brides. But what happens when an overbearing and controlling mother berates her daughter in one of New York City's most exclusive bridal salons – will anyone step in to support the bride and confront the Momzilla?
- **WAITING ROOM:** Several surveillance videos in which bystanders ignored people in dire need of help have recently made headlines. How will people react when a woman who collapses on a busy street during morning rush hour?
- **PHARMACY - CONTRACEPTION:** A 16-year-old teenage girl walks into a pharmacy with a valid prescription for birth control pills. The pharmacist refuses to fill it because, at her age, he does not believe she should be having sex. In one scenario the teenager is a clean-cut all American girl and in another she is sassy. Will bystanders defend the teen or will they support the pharmacist?

Tuesday, August 3, 2010

- **HOMELESS ATTACKS:** “Bum bashing” is an alarming trend, where teens around the country attack homeless victims for sport. In most cases, no one is around when it happens. But what if people were? “What Would You Do” creates an example of this shocking phenomenon in a New Jersey town to find out.
- **HANDICAPPED PARKING:** When an able-bodied woman barges into a handicapped parking space and refuses to move -- even when a handicapped person asks for a spot – will anyone intervene?
- **STRANGER FLIRTATION:** Imagine you are out for a romantic dinner at a cozy restaurant. Everything seems lovely until the attractive waiter or waitress begins to openly hit on your spouse. How will six significant others react?
- **EMBARRASSING MOMENTS:** An oblivious stranger has spinach in her teeth, toilet paper on her shoes, or an unbuttoned blouse.... will anyone tell her and save her from becoming a laughingstock?

Friday, August 6, 2010

- **MUSLIM WOMAN:** What Would You Do?” finds out what happens when a Muslim woman wearing a veil is denied service by the owner of a popular bakery. Who will come to her defense, and who will support the owner who wants to kick her out?
- **PARALLEL PARKER FROM HELL:** What will people do when they see a parallel parker bulldoze her way into a tight spot, knocking the fender off the car behind her – and then saunter away? Will they intervene to alert the damaged car’s owner?
- **MEAN GIRLS:** When “What Would You Do?” creates a scenario where three girls verbally attack another in a park, what will witnesses do?
- **CHEATERS:** Imagine being out to dinner when you notice an amorous couple -- playful and flirtatious -- and upon a closer look realize that the man is your good friend’s husband? And that the woman he’s cuddling with is a complete stranger. Do you tell your friend that her husband is up to no good?

Tuesday, August 10, 2010

- **DRUNK DRIVING:** What will people do when they see a stranger who’s had too much to drink try to get in a car? And will it make a difference when it’s a mom with her children? “What Would You Do?” reports on how far people will go to stop a drunk driver.
- **OVERWEIGHT HARRASSMENT:** An overweight person encounters a cruel group of teens who ridicule her while she’s sitting on a public bench at a beach boardwalk. Will anyone walking by intervene?
- **BRIDAL GOWN:** At a wedding gown fitting, a bride-to-be reveals her choice to friends and family. But what if the gown is so ugly that her closest friends and family want to scream? Will they keep their thoughts to themselves or speak up honestly?
- **CHEATING COUPLES:** “What Would You Do?” continues the “cheating couples” scenario in which viewers see a best friend’s husband getting way too cozy with another woman, but this time the stakes are higher. Will she tell her friend?

Friday, August 13, 2010

- **LATINO DAY LABORERS:** In exploring how people react when they witness blatant racial discrimination, in this scenario, Latino men and women attempt to place an order in broken English at a deli in downtown Linden, NJ. But their requests are met by extreme prejudice from the cashier.
- **TALKING DOWN TO THE HELP:** “What Would You Do?” explores how people react when they witness an abusive situation between an employer and an employee, in this case a mother, her child and a nanny...will people intervene.
- **UNWANTED ADVANCES:** How will people react when they witness a woman being incessantly hit on by an aggressive man at a bar? Will other patrons protect the woman, rely on someone else to intervene or ignore the unwanted advances all together?

Tuesday, August 17, 2010

- **GOOD SAMARITAN:** Based on a famous university experiment, “What Would You Do?” asks people to prepare a speech on the biblical parable of the Good Samaritan and then go to another location to record their speech on camera. But on the way, they encounter someone in need. Will anyone stop to help and be a real-life Good Samaritan?
- **STRANGER FLIRTATION:** How will men react to a waiter hitting on their significant other during their meal? And, one woman gets the surprise of her life after her dinner – how will she respond?
- **INTERACCIAL ABUSE:** When a boyfriend is on the verge of physically harming a woman in a public park, will people intervene? Viewers see that some people show incredible courage while others just walk right by. Will bystanders show the same courage when the boyfriend is black and the girlfriend is white? Will their interpretation be different?

Friday, August 20, 2010

- **BABY LEFT ALONE IN A HOT CAR:** Almost 40 children die every year after being left behind in a hot car. Did these kids go unnoticed or did strangers just walk on by? Using a lifelike doll, "What Would You Do?" examines how people passing by would react if they did indeed notice - would they come to the baby's rescue?
- **LOST CHILD:** You're rushing to work, running an errand or simply out for a stroll when you pass by a little boy all alone, crying. Do you notice or stop to help? And what if the lost child is a girl? Will people try to help a child on the street who appears lost?
- **GAY PDA:** Who says public display of affection can't spark dinnertime conversation? But what will that conversation be when the couple displaying affection is gay?
- **DOG IN HOT CAR:** Will people react differently to a dog left alone in a hot car than to a baby? Will they come to a Golden Retriever's rescue or walk on by, even when he barks for help?

Tuesday, August 24, 2010

- **BLIND TRUST:** What happens when a cashier gives the incorrect paper currency as change to a blind customer? Will any of the bystanders step in?
- **AUTHORITY FIGURE:** "20/20" reported the unimaginable story of a female McDonald's manager following orders from an unknown voice on the phone - pretending to be a police officer - insisting that she perform inappropriate acts on a subordinate. She complied. Using a real-life bounty hunter, "What Would You Do" asked how far everyday people would go to obey someone they believe is an authority figure.
- **CHEATERS:** What will happen when friends notice a mutual friend out to dinner, cheating on his/her spouse? How willing will they be to intervene in such a personal matter?
- **OPEN HOUSE THEFT:** Two well-dressed women show up at an open house to see a 1.4 million dollar home for sale and are soon stealing everything in sight. Will other visitors to the open house notice and say or do anything? And will the response be different if the thief is black or a man?

Friday, August 27, 2010

- **DRUNK PILOTS:** What would you do if you witnessed two commercial airline pilots drinking heavily at a bar just an hour away from getting into the cockpit?
- **SPECIAL NEEDS - SPECIAL TREATMENT:** People with intellectual disabilities have more professional opportunities than ever before, but they still face ignorance and even bigotry. Will unwitting observers take a stand against this abuse, or will they ignore it?
- **GAY PARENTS:** A lesbian couple is eating dinner with their two young children when a nosy waiter interrupts them, questioning their relationship. The waiter complains that having two mommies is "unnatural," Will other restaurant patrons intervene, or will they look the other way?
- **BRIDEZILLA:** From over-the-top bridesmaid gowns to a bridesmaid contract outlining the bride's expectations about hair, weight, and even how many drinks can be consumed at the reception, "What Would You Do?" tests the limits bridesmaids can be pushed to by their Bridezilla friends.

Friday, September 3, 2010

- **THE GIRL WHO HAD TOO MUCH:** How will people react when they witness a young woman – helplessly intoxicated at a bar – and a male stranger who approaches and tries to take her home? Does it make a difference if the girl is dressed provocatively?
- **BIKE THEFT:** What happens when a thief snatches a bike in broad daylight in a crowded park? To find out, “What Would You Do?” set loose a trio of thieves – white, black and female – armed with bolt-cutters, hacksaws and a fierce-looking electrical grinder, in full public view.
- **LOTTO:** During these troubled economic times, more and more people are playing the Lotto. What happens when a store clerk turns out to be a crook and tries to pocket the winning ticket of his customers?
- **SHOPPING WHILE BLACK:** It’s a form of racial profiling so common that researchers have given it a name, Shopping While Black. What will happen when the shoppers are not only black, but teenagers – who are targeted most?

Friday, September 10, 2010

- **BEATING THE BREATHALYZER:** Will anyone actually help an inebriated woman start her car?
- **OUT-OF-CONTROL SOCCER COACH:** Will park goers intervene when an out-of-control soccer coach pushes a young player beyond his limits?
- **SKYROCKETING PHARMACY COSTS:** Will fellow pharmacy customers come to the aid of an elderly woman who needs a prescription filled but can no longer afford it because insurance won’t cover anymore?

Friday, September 17, 2010

- **BATTERED WOMAN:** Domestic violence is a serious problem in America, with many cases of abuse going unrecorded. Do fellow diners try and help a woman when she seems in obvious danger of a man with a bad temper?
- **SHE CAN’T TAKE IT ANYMORE:** What happens when a mother gets so fed up with her children’s misbehaving– fed up to the point of forcing them out of the car after a dispute? Will people confront the mother?
- **BREASTFEEDING IN PUBLIC:** “What Would You Do?” explores how people react when a restaurant manager harasses a mother breastfeeding her baby in plain view of others.
