AS1154 - SALVATION ARMY - MYRA - 141 SPOTS

This public service announcement informs the Naples community about the new Youth Learning Center that will be built in Collier County for latchkey kids.

Traditionally, The Salvation Army's bell ringers in Collier County help generate significant support for programs community-wide at their Red Kettles even though the cost of providing this help continues to increase year after year.

AS1157 - Collier Mosquito Control District #2 -40 spots

A PSA for the charity for children in Naples. Mission is to take a leadership role in advocating for the improvement of the quality of life for Collier County, Florida's *children*, youth and their families.

AS1158 - Collier Drowning Prevention - 104 spots

Collier County produced spot to create awareness about drowning prevention techniques. Florida has the highest overall unintentional drowning death rate for 1-4 year olds, three times the national average.

The Alliance for the Arts proudly supports artists and arts organizations in our area as the state designated Local Arts Agency for Lee County.

AS1172 - Holiday Rush - 18 spots

Charlotte County Sheriff's Dept. reminder to be safe on the roads. If there will be drinking at your holiday get-together, choose a designated driver who will remain alcohol free. Also limit distractions like cell phones and loud music.

ISSUES

Politics & Government

Several political stories dominated the final months of 2013. This quarter WZVN followed a national political story developing in the heart of Southwest Florida. District 19 Representative Trey Radel admitted to buying and doing cocaine in Washington, D.C. He is the first congressman ever to face these types of charges. WZVN extensively covered his federal hearing, his public apology to his constituents in Southwest Florida, and his recovery in rehab. WZVN uncovered potential politicians who may run for his seat if he resigns. Congressman Radel's former opponents like Chauncey Goss, Gary Aubuchon, and Paige Kreegel are likely candidates. For the first time since 1994, the federal government shutdown. WZVN uncovered which agencies would begin furloughs as well as the potential impact to Southwest Florida's economy. We also cover one of the most anticipated political races of 2014. Governor Rick Scott and former governor Charlie Crist officially file to run. The gubernatorial race is expected to be one of the most expensive of 2014.

Health & Medicine

Doctors in Southwest Florida are seeing an alarming trend in flu cases. A doctor in Fort Myers tells WZVN he has seen the flu virus year-round for the first time in 30 years. Health officials are urging families to get vaccinated with this season's flu shot. A Collier County student makes national headlines after receiving a so-called fat letter from her

school district. The 11 year old girl is 5'3" and 127 pounds. The school letter said Lily's weight was in the at-risk category. Florida state law requires students to get health screenings at the start of the school year.

Economy & Local Development

WZVN discovers Lee County commissioners will consider using millions of taxpayer dollars to lure a business to the area. However, officials do not know the name of the company. The consideration comes shortly after a very similar deal to lure global car rental company, Hertz to Lee County. Hertz is scheduled to launch its new headquarters in 2015. WZVN also covered Hertz' groundbreaking live during our 9am newscast. Hertz is expected to bring more than 700 jobs to the county. Governor Rick Scott attended the ceremony saying that this is an example of the type of economy communities want to build, by drawing large companies into the state.

Crime & Personal Safety

WZVN closely covers a mysterious disappearance of a West Palm Beach mother with ties to Southwest Florida. Kimberly Lindsey was last seen at Florida Gulf Coast University with her daughter for parents' weekend. Investigators later discovered her body in a sugarcane field in Hendry County. Detectives say her ex-husband killed her. We also highlight an unsettling case of stalking in Lee County. A middle-aged man followed two Cape Coral teens for several miles after a late-night movie. The man told police he thought the girls wanted him to spend time with him because they smiled at him. A record number of animal abuse charges have been filed in Charlotte County. Thirty-eight cases ended with sentencing during the 2012-2013 fiscal year. WZVN discovers that's 29 more than the previous year. Also, ABC News was the first network to offer a special report after a shooter begins firing inside the crowded LAX airport. A TSA agent was killed

Weather & the Environment

WZVN tracks a red tide bloom off the coast of Lee County. The bloom threatens tourism and begins to kill marine life. WZVN found several dead fish lining the coast, from Captiva south to Bonita Springs beach. The bloom not only harms the environment but can also exacerbate breathing problems for people. WZVN takes viewers to the center of a national story. Dozens of pilot whales are found stranded in the Everglades. Wildlife officials don't know why the whales have beached themselves. Several have died and others refuse to head into deeper water. WZVN broadcast live from the Everglades to show how environmentalists were working to save the animals. Also, unseasonably warm temperatures could damage Florida's citrus crop. The trees are not preparing for cooler temperatures, so a cold snap could kill the trees.

Community Services

This quarter WZVN covered several events of volunteers coming together to offer Thanksgiving meals to the less fortunate in Southwest Florida. This year, officials with “Feeding the 5,000” believe they actually fed close to 8,000 people. The Thanksgiving meals are possible through monetary donations and more than 1,000 volunteers. Also more than 2,000 Immokalee farm workers and their families received a Thanksgiving meal. It’s something the families likely could not afford themselves. WZVN also covered a heartbreaking story in Cape Coral. A 9 year old boy was orphaned after police say his father killed his mother, then tried to kill himself. We learned the boy’s neighborhood came together to help him celebrate the holiday after the tragedy. The neighbor who organized the donations, Robert Soler, says he was overwhelmed by the response of the community.

Title: Government Shutdown

Source: Local & National

Description: Southwest Florida wakes up to a government shutdown. Federal workers were furloughed for 17 days. In Southwest Florida, national parks closed, forcing visitors to change their plans. WZVN was at J.N Ding Darling Preserve as workers closed the national park. Some tourists we spoke with didn’t know the park would close because of the shutdown.

Title: Construction Permits Impact Shutdown

Source: Local

Description: WZVN discovers the government shutdown is impacting construction industry. Since the Army Corp of Engineers is run by the federal government, the department cannot process permits to build along Cape Coral canals. Employees with Honc Construction fear the government shutdown will impact their profit. Travis Schmidt tells us he’s afraid he’ll lose his job since there is a ban on seawall permits.

Title: Grandezza Collier County Lawsuit

Source: Local

Description: A controversial beach renourishment project is forcing communities to take legal action. 6 communities in Lee County worked together to sue Collier County. The communities are upset sand-hauling trucks are using Lee County roads for a Collier County project. The communities want courts to step-in and force the trucks to find a different route.

Title: Governor Race

Source: Local

Description: Former Governor Charlie Crist announces he will run for governor as a Democrat. Early polls show it would be a tight race between Crist and current Governor Rick Scott. Governor Rick Scott also announces a new campaign ad set to hit airwaves next week. WZVN breaks down the upcoming race, which is expected to be one of the closest watched elections in the nation.

Title: Sullivan Requests Recount

Source: Local

Description: Cape Coral Mayor John Sullivan officially requests a recount following his 121 vote loss to Marni Sawicki during the general election. The loss is not close enough to trigger an automatic recount. WZVN discovers Mayor John Sullivan is willing to pay for the recount.

Title: Trey Radel Charged

Source: Local

Description: WZVN discovers local representative Trey Radel is charged with cocaine possession during a sting operation in Washington, D.C. WZVN closely followed the breaking developments throughout the evening. Representative Radel released a statement apologizing and admitting to struggling with the disease of alcoholism.

Date/Time: November 20, 2013, 5pm, 6pm, 11pm

Duration: 15 minutes

Title: Trey Radel in Federal Court

Source: Local/National

Description: District 19 Representative Trey Radel appears in federal court and pleads guilty to a misdemeanor charge of cocaine possession. WZVN is live in Washington,

D.C. for the Congressman's appearance. We also break down what this could mean for Representative Radel's seat if he chooses to resign.

Date/Time: November 20, 2013, 10:30pm

Duration: 30 minutes

Title: Trey Radel Press Conference

Source: Local

Description: WZVN has a duty to inform our viewers about government officials elected to represent Southwest Florida. WZVN carried Representative Trey Radel's live press conference in its entirety. This allowed viewers to hear Congressman Radel address his constituents for the first time since his cocaine charge. Representative Radel apologized to District 19 and announced he would enter a drug rehab program in Naples.

Title: Rick Scott Announces Re-election

Source: Local

Description: Governor Rick Scott officially files his re-election bid. The governor will face a tough race against former governor Charlie Crist. For the past two years, Scott has been raising millions and millions of dollars for a political organization called Let's Get to Work.

Health & Medicine

Date/Time: October 9

Duration: 15:00

Title: Katie, Lyme Disease

Source: Syndication

Description: Katie sits down with Lyme Diseases specialists. According to the CDC, up to 300,000 people could contract Lyme disease in a given year. Dr. John Halperin explains when individuals have acute Lyme disease, meaning within the first month or so of the bite and becoming infected, they can develop severe headaches that can be incapacitating.

Title: Katie, Brain-eating amoeba

Description: After a Southwest Florida child gained national attention for contracting a brain-eating amoeba, Katie speaks with an Arkansas mother whose daughter survived the illness. The school letter said Lily's weight was in the at-risk category. Florida state law requires students to get health screenings at the start of the school year.

Title: Estero Hospital Appeal

Source: Local

Description: WZVN is closely following Lee Memorial's push for a brand new hospital in Estero. The Florida agency for health care administration denied the proposal to build an 80 bed hospital. Representatives of Lee Memorial have gone to Tallahassee for an appeals hearing. Officials with the hospital must prove the hospital is needed in the area, before the proposal can be approved.

Title: HIV Exposure Arrest

Source: Local

Description: A Lee County man is accused of knowingly spreading HIV. Investigators say 56 year old, Tony Paulino slept with 3 women, ultimately infecting each one. According to reports, after one of the women confronted Paulino, he said he had the virus, but didn't need to take medicine for it. He is still in jail on a \$100,000 bond.

Description: Burn victim, Carmen Tarleton, sits down with Katie to talk about her revolutionary face transplant. In June of 2007, Carmen's estranged husband broke into her home, severely beat her, and doused her face with chemicals. She sits down with Katie and talks about her 15 hour surgery.

Title: Bonita Fire EMS Meeting

Source: Local

Description: Lee County and Bonita Springs officials work together to building a better ambulance service. Both sides have quarreled about which agency would better serve the city. WZVN discovers a compromise reached today would create a partnership between the county and city. Bonita Springs would also agree to buy more ambulances for both agencies to use. The city wanted the ability to treat and transport patients in its own ambulances, but the county denied the application.

Description: WZVN discovers an alarming early spike in flu cases in Southwest Florida. Some figures indicate the number of flu cases in early November was 50% higher than in recent years. Dr. David Schulze, doctor at Lee Convenient Care tells us he's seen cases of influenza year round for the first time in 30 years. H1N1 is the most prevalent flu strain in Florida this year. The flu shot protects against the strain.

But WZVN learns that the organization needs more money to pull off the event. Up to 80,000 people are expected to come on and off Manasota Key during the three-day event. Charlotte County decided to invest \$250,000 to help make the event happen. Only \$30,000 has been committed by sponsors, nowhere near enough cover expenses.

Neighbors tell us they are shocked and traumatized by the accusations. Alexander was fired from his job as firefighter for the South Trail district. Both men are being held on \$100,000 bond.

Title: Immokalee Teens Killed

Source: Local

Description: Tragedy hits a Collier County community when three Immokalee teens are killed in car crash on Halloween night. WZVN discovered they were coming home from a haunted house when the driver lost control, slamming his Mustang into a concrete barrier. A fourth teen in the vehicle was able to pull himself out of the car and survived the wreckage.

Title: LAX Shooting

Source: Network

Description: A gunman goes on shooting spree inside LAX terminal. One TSA agent was killed and 7 other people injured. ABC News dominated coverage by being the first network to go on air with a special report at 1 o'clock. Investigators later identified the shooter as Paul Ciancia and say he used an assault rifle.

Title: Missing Nurse and Mother

Source: Local

Description: A nurse and mother missing from West Palm Beach was last scene with her daughter at Florida Gulf Coast University. Today WZVN speaks with friends of her daughter. They tell us Kimberly Lindsey was last seen at FGCU for parents' weekend. Lindsey's car was found in her driveway along with her personal items.

Title: Woman arrested 38 times

Source: Local

Description: WZVN investigates how a Fort Myers woman has been arrested a 38th time. Officials tell us Shanice Stewart is drawn to stealing. In addition to dozens of theft charges, investigators say she used her kids to pull off the crimes. WZVN was in court as a judge denied bond for Stewart.

Description: A female resource officer tazes a student to break up violent fight. Two teenagers were arrested for the fight. WZVN kept viewers informed throughout the morning about the traffic impact of the deadly crash.
