4. Health insurance Nevada outlook 10/30/16. Janel Davis of the Silver State Health Insurance exchange informs people how to apply and get coverage. what documents they'll need and how many have joined the exchange here in Nevada.
5. Dealing with death Nevada Outlook 11/23/16. Emilio Parga founder of the Solice Tree Teaches people to deal with grief. Especially this time of year when suicides tend to rise.
6. Homeless and crime Nevada Outlook 12/25 & 30/16. The team from Washoe Counties Crossroads Program along with the Sheriffs dept. explain how the program keeps repeat offenders off the street and gives them a new opportunity at life with the job skills and drug treatment they need to stay clean and sober.
