Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- Louisiana's COVID-19 Pandemic: From local businesses, to festivals, to sports teams, and schools, the state of Louisiana continued their reopening after the COVID pandemic lockdowns. Multiple experts explained how the state's economic recovery, school openings, and the return of festivals to the state.
- Shreveport Crime Surge & Police Reform: The City of Shreveport has been facing a surge in crime, and record high homicides. The Chief of Police was terminated, and officers are leaving in record numbers. The Department pays the lowest in the region, so their pay rates became a big topic whenever the crime wave was brought up.
- Infrastructure: The Federal Government will be investing in Louisiana's infrastructure, and Shreveport has a lot of projects that need the help. But it's not just roads and bridges. Schools, businesses, and even fire departments need help too.
- Louisiana's Gaming Industry: Sports Gambling has come to Louisiana, and there are a lot of changes happening fast. Additionally, one of the casinos in the Shreveport-Bossier area was up for a potential move to South Louisiana this year.
- **Social Media:** After multiple fights and shootings in the Shreveport area appeared to start on social media, we talked to a local expert about the dangers presented by social media.
- **Hurricane Response:** After the state was struck by powerful hurricanes again, the response to get people back on their feet was slow and incomplete. This led to many elected officials asking "why?"
