Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- Louisiana's COVID-19 Reopening: From local businesses, to festivals, to sports teams, and schools, the state of Louisiana continued their reopening after the COVID pandemic lockdowns. Multiple experts explained how the state's economic recovery, school openings, and the return of festivals to the state.
- **Issues with Shreveport's First Responder Departments:** The City of Shreveport is facing challenges with keeping their Fire Department operational, and finding a new Police Department. Multiple fire stations in the city had to be temporarily closed as the city's older fleet of trucks continued to break down. The Police Department has also found struggles in trying to replace their current headquarters, which is in disrepair.
- **Infrastructure:** The Federal Government will be investing in Louisiana's infrastructure, and Shreveport has a lot of projects that need the help. But it's not just roads and bridges. Schools, businesses, and even fire departments need help too.
- **COVID-19 Mandates:** From COVID vaccines to masks, the state and federal government have been introducing mandates due to COVID-19. The President of the United States announced his intention to create vaccine mandates, while Louisiana's Governor made masks mandatory for the whole state.
- Shreveport Smoking Ban: The City of Shreveport put in a comprehensive smoking ban, and during 2021 the local casinos asked for an exemption. The exemption request made its way in front of the Shreveport City Council, and sparked a massive debate.
- Louisiana Legislative Session: This year's Louisiana Legislative session addressed a lot of big topics for the state. Including emergency powers in response to pandemics and natural disasters, as well as the Governor's vetos. Some of those vetos led to the first ever Veto Session of the Louisiana Legislature, that was held after the conclusion of the full session.
- Hurricane Ida: The state was struck by another Hurricane. The landfall impacted Southern Louisiana, but the economics of the impact touch the whole state.
