By our best estimates, it is going to cost between 200 and 400 dollars to ship all these shoes. If there's any chance that your radio station could get the word out, we would really appreciate it. 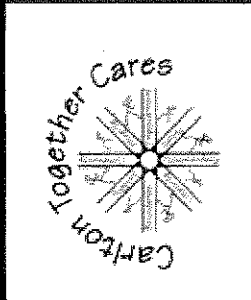
Hearing Voices 2010 Storytelling Festival
