Democracy Now! Monday-Friday, 7 am - 8 am, 60 minutes. Democracy Now! is an independent, global news hour anchored by award-winning journalists Amy Goodman and Juan Gonzalez that airs on 1,300+ TV and radio stations in the United States and around the world. <http://www.democracynow.org>.

Modesto Sound California Audio Roots Project, Sundays 11:30 am & 8:30 pm 30 minutes 30 episodes of locally produced stories from local area residents, hosted by Janet Seay and others. The program is part of the non-profit Modesto Sound audio training program that teaches students about sound and audio recording and engineering.

NEW: Collaboration with Modesto Sound with its 255,000.00 grant from KDA and the California Arts Council to broadcast new interviews with low-income residents as part of its grant. 80 interviews are planned.

- G. Culture & Diversity – Celebration of the diverse heritage and cultures of our local area
- H. Youth – Issues that affect youth and how the local youth are engaged with their community
- I. Disability – Issues such as barriers to independence, resources, services and changes in legislation
- J. Health – Issues relating to the general health and wellbeing of the valley communities. Discussions about Covid-19.
- K. Mental Health – Issues addressing the mental health crisis. Interviews with students, adults affected by mental illness.
- M. LGBTQI+ - Issues relating to the rights, culture, and diversity of LGBTQI+ communities
- N. Women’s Issues – Issues affecting women in education, career, family, health, social justice, and more.
