July 3: 5:00 AM till 5:30 AM – American Radio Journal was broadcast. American Radio Journal is a thirty minute public affairs program produced by the Lincoln Institute of Public Opinion Research, Inc. Lowman Henry spoke with Marian Tupy of the CATO Institute about the impact of the Brexit vote. Andy Roth of the Club for Growth discussed the key planks for the GOP platform. Eric Boehm and Matt Kittle reported on New York preparing to outlaw web property rental services. Lowman Henry provided a commentary on potential vice presidential picks.
