April 3: 5:00 AM till 5:30 AM – American Radio Journal was broadcast. American Radio Journal is a thirty minute public affairs program produced by the Lincoln Institute of Public Opinion Research, Inc. Lowman Henry spoke with Michael Abrams author of the book *Bringing Value to Health Care* about how to move to a more free market-based system. Andy Roth of the Club for Growth discussed how congress is supposed to adopt a federal budget. Eric Boehm and Matt Kittle reported on the upcoming Wisconsin Presidential Primary. Dr. Paul Kengor from the Center for Vision & Values at Grove City College provided a commentary on rhetoric in the presidential debates.
