Sandy McCool was one of the original founders of Champions of Hope, a local event that would honor and encourage breast cancer survivors. On November 23rd, 2011, Sandy lost her 7 year battle with breast cancer. This event since it’s inception has raised over \$300,000 to help expand the cancer services and programs provided by the Medical Center, including the southeast regional health screening program, a 45 foot mobile medical vehicle that has a digital mammography suite, lab and education area.
