

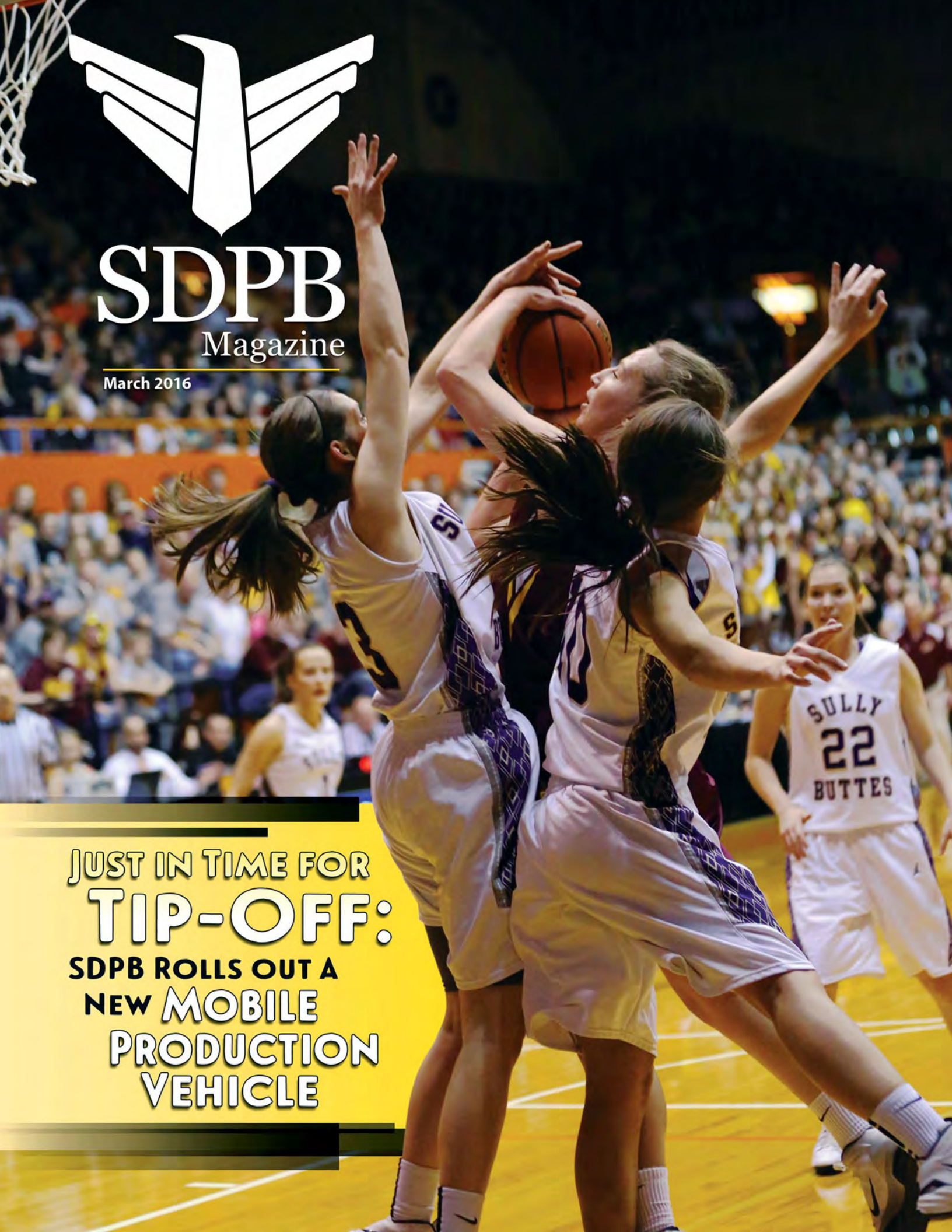

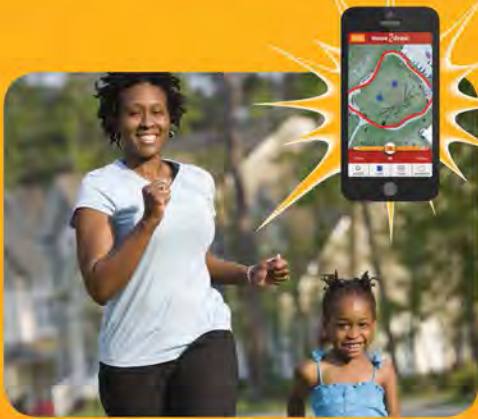

Passport

Start Your Journey

SDPB Passport is a new member benefit that gives eligible members access to an expanded on-demand library of PBS and SDPB programs online. SDPB members who give at the \$5 monthly level, or \$60 annually, receive access to Passport through the SDPB video portal at watch.SDPB.org.

The Passport library currently offers members more than 1,000 episodes to watch, with new PBS programs added weekly. The library features episodes from popular programs like **American Experience**, **American Masters**, **Antiques Roadshow**, **Nature**, **NOVA**, and **Masterpiece** — including all six seasons of **Downton Abbey**. In addition to these signature series, the library is full of public television's acclaimed arts, science, history, and lifestyle programs, including **How We Got to Now**, **EARTH: A New Wild**, **Austin City Limits**, and a rotating selection of films from celebrated documentarian Ken Burns.

Locally, eligible SDPB members can access older South Dakota high school football, basketball and other sporting events, as well as classic editions of **Dakota Life** and **SDPB documentaries**.


It's important to note that Passport

is an extension of content already available online. Meanwhile, free on-air broadcasts and free online viewing of programs, particularly kids programming, news and public affairs, and series like **Frontline** and **Independent Lens**, will remain. "Free, universal access has always been at the core of both SDPB's and PBS's missions," says Ryan Howlett, CEO of Friends of SDPB. "We're not budging from that commitment. Programs will continue to be broadcast, for free, over the air. Public television has a long history of leveraging our content for charitable support, including videotapes in the 1980s and DVDs in the 2000s. SDPB Passport uses current technological advances to efficiently deliver some of that same content to our members as an added benefit for their support."

"Nearly all programs are typically available for online viewing for free on SDPB.org and PBS.org," says Howlett, "and also via SDPB apps and the PBS channels on Roku, AppleTV and other streaming services, usually for a limited window of time — typically two weeks for national programs and the entirety of the current season for SDPB programs." The rare exceptions occur when SDPB does not have free

streaming rights.

"Currently, when the viewing window closes on programs, those shows are removed for all viewers and are not accessible to anyone, unless the DVD is available," says Howlett. "The Passport library will now contain older programs that are not currently broadcasting. In the SDPB Passport universe, eligible members can now access an extensive library that simply did not exist before."

Eligible donors who wish to take advantage of SDPB Passport can activate their account for access by visiting the video portal watch.SDPB.org/passport or at PBS.org/passport, where you'll be asked to register to confirm your identity and membership status. After registering, you can immediately start enjoying SDPB Passport. Look for videos with the compass icon.  SDPB Passport can also be accessed via the PBS Video apps for Android and iOS smartphones and tablets, and the PBS app on AppleTV when you have identified SDPB as your local station.

JUST IN TIME FOR TIP-OFF:

SDPB ROLLS OUT A NEW MOBILE PRODUCTION VEHICLE

We like to think SDPB distinguishes itself as a media outlet in many ways, but one feature of our broadcast mission that makes us truly unique is our status as one of the few public broadcasters in the nation who covers state-sanctioned high school activities. Mobile Production Vehicles (MPVs) and smaller portable broadcast units make it possible for SDPB broadcast crews to bring minute-by-minute soccer action or soaring soprano solos to fans and families watching at home. Just last

year, SDPB broadcast and produced over 650 hours of local programming and logged thousands of miles using mobile production to cover twelve categories of South Dakota High School Activities Association (SDHSAA) events like wrestling, gymnastics, and All-State Band. This is in addition to local programming like the Governor's State of the State Address, the Daschle Dialogues, South Dakota Symphony Orchestra concerts, JazzFest, and high school rodeo championships.

We're pleased to announce SDPB's mobile production operations have a new high-tech addition that can showcase high school achievement in a manner that's more worthy of the tremendous efforts put forth by South Dakota's students, parents, and coaches. Through the generous support of SDPB members and key funders, a new state-of-the-art MPV will launch just in time for this season's state basketball tournaments. Fully loaded with the latest digital broadcast equipment, the new MPV replaces "Winnie," the well-worn analog production Winnebago that logged thousands of miles at competitions throughout the state.

The new MPV will capture the touchdowns, tip-offs, and concerts SDPB viewers have come to rely on, but now in High Definition (HD). Additionally, the new customized system will better integrate with HD audiovisual and scoreboard systems at event venues

like the Premier Center in Sioux Falls and Rapid City's Rushmore Plaza Civic Center.

Delivering the MPV from concept to reality took an effort both SDPB-wide and state-wide – from Friends of SDPB fundraising and corporate support, to the creation of artwork and design displayed on the vehicle itself. But centermost to the planning and execution were Director of Engineering and Operations SeVern Ashes, Production Manager Bradley Van Osdel, and SDPB engineering and production staff. These SDPB staffers conducted thorough research and development to outfit the MPV with high-tech equipment capable of being integrated not only with existing SDPB systems but also with HD equipment at a wide variety of event venues around South Dakota.

HD is an update SDPB viewers have been asking for. “It was a long time coming,” says Ashes, “Now SDPB viewers will get a deeper, fuller HD experience.” SDPB viewers will notice an energized HD look, thanks to the MPV’s improved cameras, replay, and state-of-the-art audio, as well as updated graphics and video effects capabilities. Behind the scenes, SDPB production crews are now enabled with the latest generation of production equipment used by other national providers. According to Van Osdel, “Now production personnel can create full HD productions more easily and more quickly while maximizing their creativity.”

Directing and producing fast-paced, unrehearsed content like basketball games and coordinating cameras so viewers get the most out of symphony and jazz concerts is where television art meets science. Everyone working a mobile unit – from directors to announcers to camera operators – must be familiar with the sport being broadcast. Similarly, SDPB employs

music readers at mobile production sites to ensure cameras are positioned on woodwinds or string sections at key moments during concert broadcasts or recordings. The experience and efforts of hardworking production crews help provide seamless coverage of action – whether scrimmages or symphonies – which translates into a quality viewing experience.

A case in point is the complex production coordination required to broadcast this month’s Boys and Girls State High School Basketball Tournaments. Forty-eight teams will compete in three classes (AA, A, and B) during two separate tournament weekends in five separate cities. Coverage planning began for Van Osdel and his staff last spring. With crews and camera operators stationed in Huron, Watertown, Aberdeen, Rapid City and Sioux Falls, SDPB will work round-the-clock to cover games and also upload graphics, train high school students in camera operation, and constantly coordinate with tournament directors for TV time-outs and half-times. Meanwhile, master control operators at station headquarters in Vermillion monitor feeds to confirm broadcasts are reaching fans watching on TVs, laptops or phones from Edgemont to White Rock.

At the end of the tournaments, after the MVPs are interviewed and trophy ceremonies are filmed, crews work late into the night to strike the equipment, load the production vehicles and head back home. Back in Vermillion, producers set to work to edit game DVDs created by SDPB technicians and mailed to fans and coaches by administrative personnel.

staff dig in to day-to-day operations until, days later, it’s time to hit the road again with crews and equipment to cover the high school musicians who gather for three days to rehearse and perform for All-State Band.

SDPB will be there.

SDPB’s new Mobile Video Production Vehicle was made possible by the public-private partnership that is SDPB. The SDPB network funded approximately two-thirds of the cost of the vehicle, and the Friends of SDPB funded the remaining third. Hartford, SD Student Awarded Opportunity to Study Cancer Research

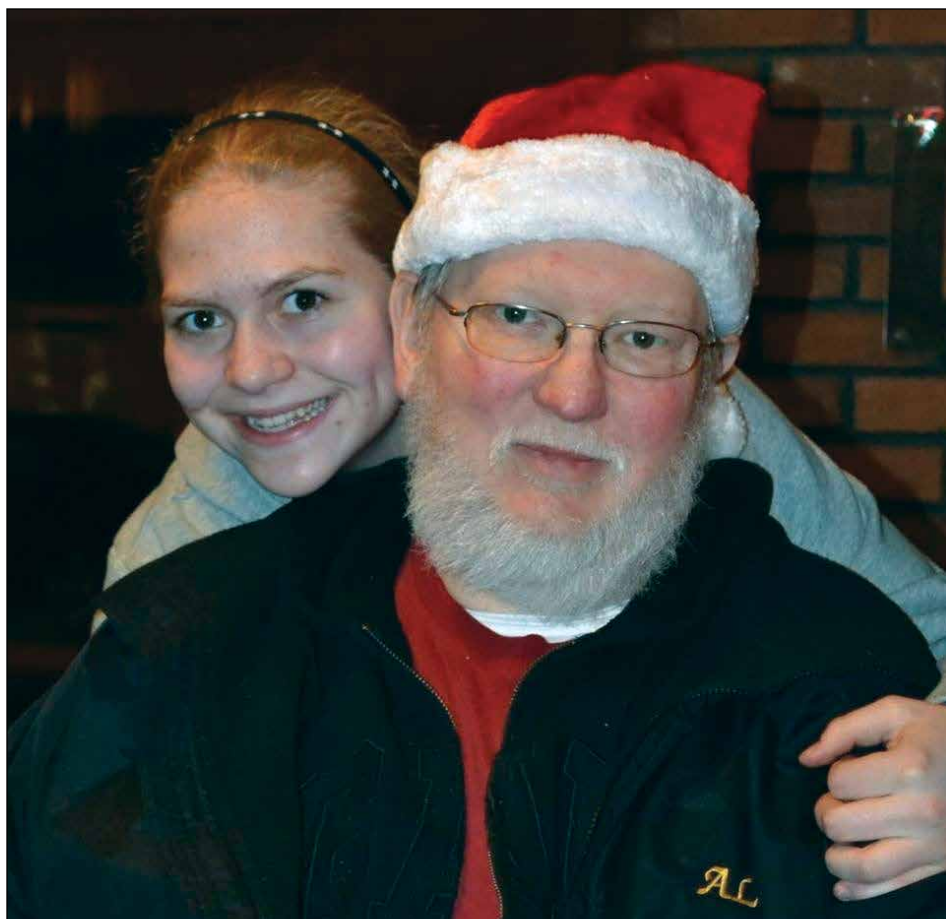
Alyssa Bursott, a junior at West Central High School in Hartford, SD is an inaugural winner of the 2015 Emperor Science Award. The award provides opportunities for 10th and 11th graders to work alongside a university-level mentoring scientist to explore careers in science and become part of the next generation of cancer researchers.

Bursott learned about the opportunity from her advisor of HOSA, an international health sciences student organization. When Bursott heard her application and essay was one of 100 winners chosen nation-wide from 1,200 applicants, she says her first reaction was “pure shock.” Bursott says, “Then I started jumping up and down. It was almost the end of the school day, so my entire honors chemistry class got to see my excitement. I knew how big this was, and I did not want to miss an opportunity to celebrate.”

Winners were chosen based on “demonstrated awareness of emerging developments in cancer treatment including precision medicine, immunotherapy and epigenetics.”

Bursott’s essay focused on her father, Alan Wurm, and his cancer battle, during which Bursott and her family endured the shock, defeats and triumphs so endemic to cancer diagnoses and care. After an impaired arm revealed the presence of a large tumor, Wurm underwent surgery but did not regain full health. Next came admittance to a trial study for oral chemotherapy pills, which initially provided relief. Bursott writes in her essay, “The new medicine was a miracle. While the tumors would never go away, the treatment was decreasing the size of some. Sadly, the treatments began taking their toll. Alan’s body became weaker, allowing tumors to grow despite treatment.” Brain radiation followed, but tumors had grown and spread. Wurm died at fifty-four.

Bursott says, “I chose to write about my father because of the journey we took as a family. He taught me so many things, and I learned a lot about life in the time before he passed. Witnessing

someone pass away from cancer is an indescribable experience. Putting it into words was a long, painful process.”

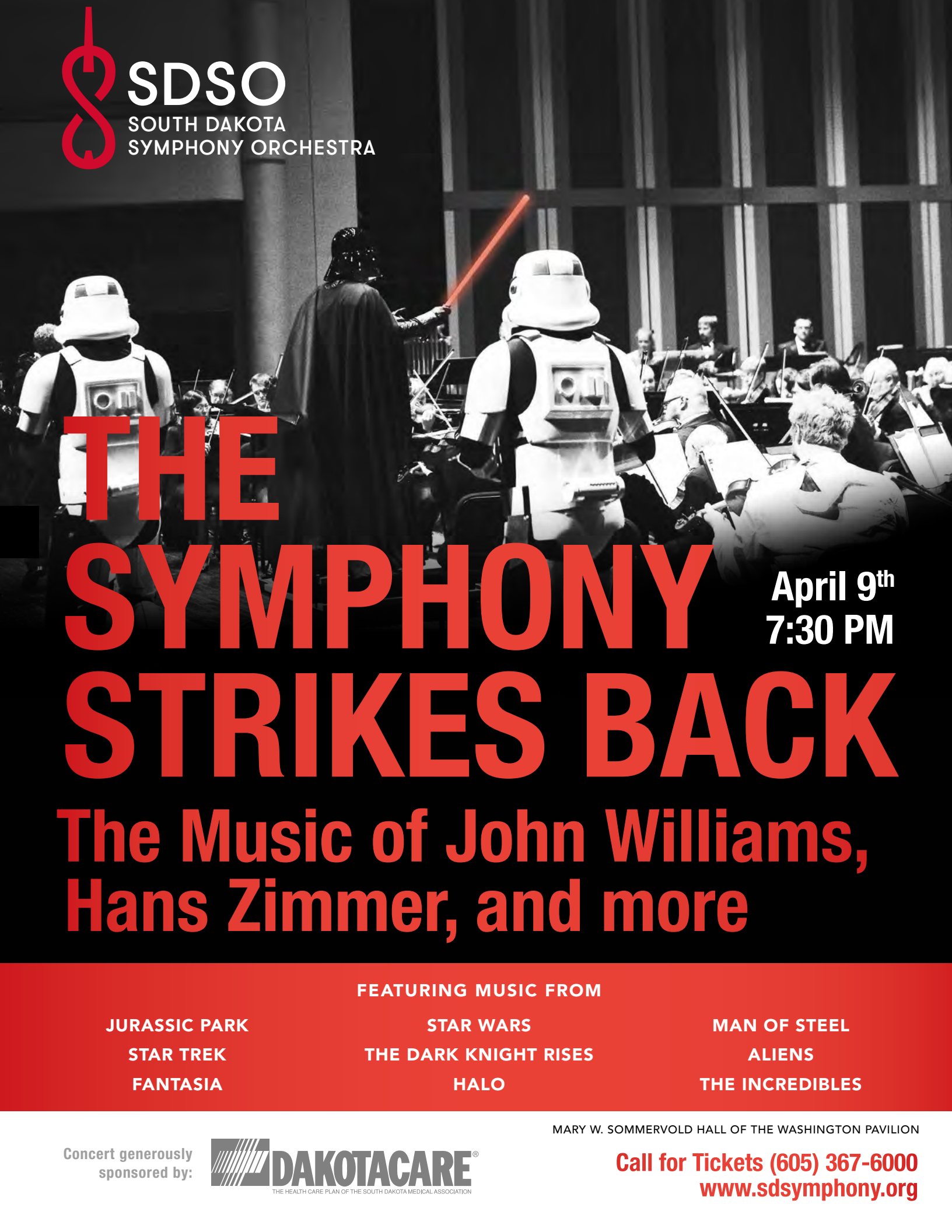
Bursott writes in her essay that the loss of her father was a profound continuation of an interest in the medical field she’s had since youth. She writes, “When I was younger, my Christmas lists consisted of microscopes, anatomy coloring books, and stuffed animals for ‘surgeries.’” Later in school, Bursott’s science projects focused on meningitis, schizophrenia, and methicillin-resistant staphylococcus aureus, or MRSA, an antibiotic-resistant infectious disease.

As part of her award, Bursott is paired with Dr. Angela Ozburn, a researcher at the Portland, Oregon VA Health Care System. She plans to visit Dr. Ozburn and attend one of her conferences. Bursott plans also to eventually major in psychology and neuroscience and become a neurosurgeon. “I want nothing

more than to be a part of something bigger than myself,” says Bursott. “I hope someday I am able to make my mark in the battle against cancer.” Of her essay and award, Bursott says, “It was a tribute to him in a sense that his story inspired me. I feel that this award was his final gift to me, and I do not want to let him down.”

The Emperor Science Award is made possible in part by PBS LearningMedia, and is one of several teaching components of WETA’s three-part documentary **Cancer: The Emperor of All Maladies** on the Ken Burns Classroom, a multimedia, customizable website designed for teachers to incorporate history about cancer and cancer research into curriculums.

Images of the Past: The Houses of Adams and Pettigrew

The latest segment of SDPB's ongoing series **Images of the Past** looks at the preserved homes of two of South Dakota's most prominent citizens. W.E. Adams made money in the grocery business in the early days of Lead and Deadwood and was politically active in municipal government. Adams was also a real road warrior – he and his wife took road trips from the Black Hills to the Southwest and southern California at a time when automobile travel was a rugged adventure.

R.F. Pettigrew was among the first settlers in Sioux Falls. He represented Dakota Territory in Congress and became South Dakota's first U.S. Senator after statehood. Pettigrew made his fortune in real estate and other business ventures. He travelled abroad regularly and collected many souvenirs – some considered valuable, some not.

Both the Adams and Pettigrew houses are preserved and serve as museums. Both offer a look at late 19th through early 20th century furnishings for the well-to-do. Think *Downton Abbey* on the prairie.

South Dakota's Role in Space Exploration

Twelve months on the International Space Station, (ISS) and American astronaut Scott Kelly and Russian cosmonaut Mikhail Korneenko are about to come home. **A Year in Space**, chronicling the longest space stay in history, debuts Thursday, March 3, 7pm (6 MT) on SDPB2.

Kelly's space stay has tested human limits for space travel and is laying the groundwork for a manned mission to Mars. Back on Earth, South Dakota scientists are also contributing to the possibility of future planetary exploration.

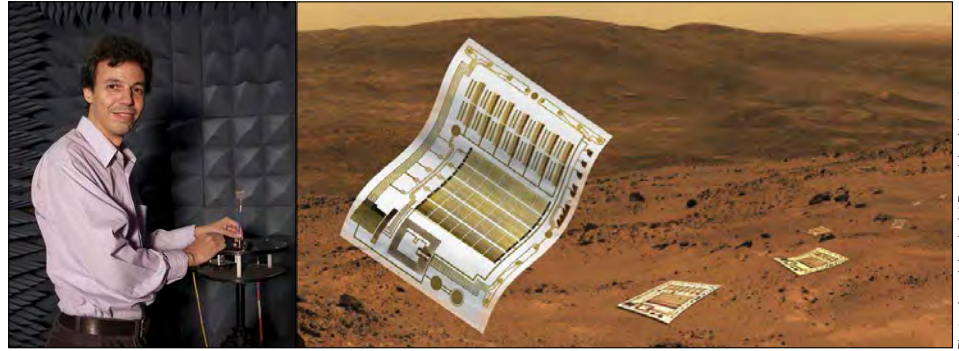
NASA has awarded the South Dakota NASA EPSCoR program a \$750,000 grant to develop "printable spacecraft" for future space exploration missions. The project is a collaboration of researchers from South Dakota School of Mines & Technology (SDSM&T), the University of South Dakota, and South Dakota State University. The scientists are partnering with NASA Glenn Research Center and NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory, and are planning multiple K-12 outreach activities.

Dr. Dimitris Anagnostou, Associate Professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering at SDSM&T is technical lead.

SDPB: Can you define the term "spacecraft" in this project?

DA: By "printable spacecraft," NASA envisions thin, lightweight, flexible substrate sheets with embedded customized sensors and electronic modules for data gathering, communication, and micro-propulsion. These sheets will be embedded with electronic components and devices using a materials printer, which could occur in the lab prior to launch, or on demand during a mission. The printed spacecraft will be deployed above a target world and flutter to its surface like leaves – eliminating the need for complex landing systems. The spacecraft will act as a large wireless network of sensors that transmits data back to the host spacecraft for further processing and/or transmission to Earth.

SDPB: Can you describe a scenario in which the printable spacecraft are deployed?

DA: NASA came up with a mission scenario where they defined a Mars environmental meteorological network, named STANLE (acronym for Structure of the Atmosphere-Network Lander Experiment). The mission would consist of thousands of small sheets of printed electronic science stations which would flutter to the surface of Mars after being released from their entry vehicle. The printable spacecraft would cover an area of hundreds of square kilometers to support the measurement of moderate scale atmospheric phenomena.

SDPB: Why is this research taking place in South Dakota? What are SDSMT, SDSU and USD able to offer the project?

DA: South Dakota, and particularly the Direct-Write laboratory at SDSM&T, has singular resources in printing capability and extensive experience that give us the highest capability for success in this work. We have been working in this technology for more than 10 years, with many faculties, and have developed in-house materials and nanoinks to print.

SDPB: Can you theorize how printable spacecraft will have applications back on Earth?

DA: There may be direct applications, for example in the exploration of hard-to-reach surfaces such as volcanic craters, as well as indirect – a better understanding of planetary phenomena which could help us answer important scientific questions and enable the creation of reliable human environments and habitats for space and planet colonization. The latter is actually one of the grand challenges of NASA.

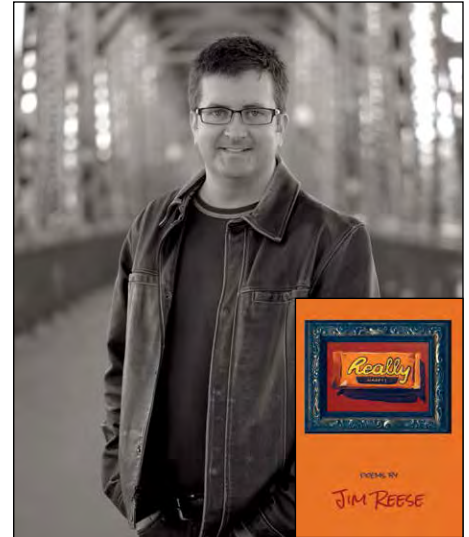
