

Learn. Dream. Grow.

In her article "Everything I Know About Surviving in Quarantine I Learned from *The Long Winter*," (Boston Globe, April 17, 2020), writer Lizzie Skurnick pep-talks pandemic-weary readers with pearls of wisdom gleaned from Laura Ingalls Wilder's survival story of the 1880-81 winter in Dakota Territory:

# Rule No. 1: "It's Going to Be a Hard Winter"

In times of crisis, you listen to the authorities.

Before the storm solidifies, a "very old Indian" arrives by pony at the general store to inform "you white men" of De Smet that "heap big snow come."

The incoming storm, he goes on, will last seven "moons." This wildly offensive, walking stereotype was, of course, created out of whole cloth by Wilder, but he was also right. In times of trouble, pay attention to the wisdom you're offered. If the doctors say we must stand six moons apart, stand six moons.

Skurnick's article touches on truisms about Wilder and settler stories well-known to many South Dakotans: yes, Wilder's books are both well-loved and problematic; and, yes, in many ways rural Middle Americans may have a leg up when it comes to social distancing and going without.

Skurnick, a Black and Jewish essayist who writes extensively about Wilder and the Little House books, is one of many contemporary writers and cultural observers featured in American Masters — Laura Ingalls Wilder: Prairie to Page. Premiering on SDPB1 Tuesday, Dec. 29 at 8pm (7 MT), the documentary promises to explore the context in which Wilder lived and wrote, as well as the true nature of her personality.

The film features never-before-published letters, photographs and family artifacts. Directed and produced by Emmy® Award winner Mary McDonagh Murphy (Harper Lee: American Masters), it includes original interviews with Pamela Hill Smith, whose very successful Wilder biographies Pioneer Girl and Laura Ingalls Wilder: A Writer's Life were published by South Dakota Historical Society Press.

Also appearing are Caroline Fraser, who won a Pulitzer Prize for her autobiography Prairie Fires: The American Dreams of Laura Ingalls Wilder, Wilder historian William Anderson, and authors Louise Erdrich, Roxane Gay, Lizzie Skurnick, and Linda Sue Park, author of Prairie Lotus, a YA novel about Hannah, an aspiring young dressmaker in Dakota Territory who navigates cultural crossroads as the daughter of a Chinese immigrant in a White frontier-town near the Ihanktonwan reservation.

The film also includes interviews with actors from the beloved TV series Little House on the Prairie, including Melissa Gilbert (Laura), Alison Arngrim (Nellie Oleson) and Dean Butler (Almanzo).

In a year marking the 85<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of *Little House on the Prairie*, **American Masters—Laura Ingalls Wilder** helps capture the writer's lasting and multiplex impact on the larger world.

# Laura Ingalls Wilder Pageant 2020 The Hard Winter

To ensure the show went on despite the pandemic, this summer De Smet's Laura Ingalls Wilder Pageant performed The Hard Winter as reader's theater, written for stage by Marian Cramer and Jennifer & Adam Rudebusch. Jennifer Rudebusch, who co-directed this year's pageant performance with her husband Adam, says the context of the play is particularly apt. "We've used the Laura Ingalls Wilder Memorial Society archives to research and ground our play in the historical events of 1880, a terribly hard winter that stopped the trains and kept the pioneers of De Smet stuck in their houses for weeks at a time—a particularly apropos show for this year."

SDPB filmed and edited the production. "Audiences can expect a fun show that feels a bit oldtimey, with a bit of the flavor of A Prairie Home Companion," says Jennifer Rudebusch. "We have a foley artist for sound effects, a wonderful band to play between scenes, and a talented troupe of actors. COVID has really thrown everybody for a loop this year, and although it has presented us with some challenges this year, we're excited for this opportunity to work with SDPB to keep Laura Ingalls Wilder and the town of De Smet in people's hearts and minds."







Join SDPB for a special holidaythemed **Dakota Life** *Greetings* from Canton. Organized in 1861, the site for the town of Canton was believed to be located directly opposite Canton, China – hence the name. The seat of Lincoln County, Canton's motto is "Can live, can see, can do."

The history of Augustana University is rooted in Canton. It fostered noted author Ole Rolvaag and Nobel Prize winning physicist E.O. Lawrence. Canton was also home to the Hiawatha Insane Indian Asylum, a controversial and notorious mental hospital established in 1898.

During the 1910s, a ski jump set up by Augustana students became a training ground for recordsetting athletes bound for winter Olympics competition during the 1920s.

We'll also visit a Christmas tree farm near Canton and an annual holiday craft fair. Plus, meet 10-year-old Jacob Richards, who for the last three years has been programming and sharing a choreographed Christmas light show with the Sioux Falls community.

And we'll head west to The Chapel in the Hills in Rapid City, an exact reproduction of the Borgund Stavkirke in Laerdal, Norway, famed for the use of "staves" or pillars, used as supports in this unique architecture.



# Ella Wishes You a Swinging Christmas

The host of SDPB's **Jazz Nightly** speaks to the timelessness of Ella Fitzgerald's classic Christmas album.

Christmas is all about tradition: the same ornaments on the tree that you've had since childhood; the same cookies and desserts that grandma made; and, most of all, the same seasonal songs that you've heard all your life. With the exception of the traditional carols, which are centuries old. most of the popular Christmas songs come from 1934-1954, a two-decade span that roughly coincides with the era known as the Great American Songbook. There are very few songs of more recent vintage that have found a permanent place in the Christmas repertoire.

From Irving Berlin's poignant and wistful "White Christmas" to the light-hearted novelty "Santa Claus is Coming to Town," these timeless songs are masterfully crafted both lyrically and musically and can withstand a myriad of interpretations, changing tastes and styles. They're so deeply embedded in the American cultural experience that it's nearly impossible for other songs to find some space and take root.

Dozens of Christmas albums are released every year and most of them feature performances of the same old handful of songs. Ella Fitzgerald's Ella Wishes You a Swinging Christmas is no exception, but while most other Christmas albums recorded through the years have faded from memory, this album remains a classic, sixty years after its release in 1960.

When Ella recorded this Christmas album she was at the peak of her powers. With her clear, pure, bright tone, she possessed one of the most beautiful voices in all of jazz and popular music. She had an easy sense of swing that's second-tonone. There's also an unmatched playfulness and joy in her singing that's infectious. Listeners can't help but smile and tap their feet while listening to Ella.

Christmas is a season of joy, and it's Ella's ebullience that

makes Ella Wishes You a Swinging Christmas a perennial favorite. She rescues tiresome chestnuts like "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer" and "Let It Snow! Let It Snow! Let It Snow! Let It Snow! and makes them fun and enjoyable again. She doesn't reinvent the songs so much as removes the layers of schmaltz these songs have accumulated through the years.

Ella ranks among the most beloved singers in jazz and American popular music and she continues to inspire younger performers, twenty-six years after her death. A few of them join vocalist Vanessa Williams and the American Pops for a PBS celebration of Ella Wishes You a Swinging Christmas. The television performance is a fitting tribute to the legacy of the great Ella Fitzgerald and one of the most enduring Christmas albums of all time.

Enjoy an evening celebrating Fitzgerald's entire iconic album presented by the American Pops Orchestra. Features appearances by Dee Dee Bridgewater, Norm Lewis, Carmen Ruby Floyd, Nova Payton, Dave Detwiler and Morgan James.

Hello Mr. Termes,

I am an art educator in an urban school. Covid-19 has caused me to reevaluate the way I teach. I have been teaching a drawing class to high school students for 22 years, and I have always taught how I was taught, by drawing through observation. Right now the tables in my class are bisected by plexialass barriers, there is little room for students and it is impossible to teach to draw from observation.

I always start with the basic shapes (cube, cylinder, sphere, cone) and I was worried about how I would teach this with the limitations I was facing. I stumbled upon your PBS series while exploring my options and I am so happy I did. It is making teaching basic drawing under the conditions we're in possible, and it is providing help for students who have opted to stay home. THANK YOU! Your method of teaching is so direct, especially with students who have confidence issues. I am experiencing a lot of success using it (and they are having so much fun doing the work).

As an artist I feel like I have been pushing observation for so long, I have negelected the creative aspect of drawing. More than ever in this digital age, kids need a creative outlet. Thanks so much. I am so glad I found your work and it has made teaching during this pandemic a bit more bearable. Have a great day.



# 2020 Tax Laws Benefit Large and Everyday Donors

"I would say 2020 is the best year in recent memory for making charitable gifts, if you're able to."
- Attorney Andrew Knutson of Sioux Falls' Thompson Law summarizes this year's enhanced charitable giving incentives.

The other aspect of the CARES Act was that for people thinking about making a large gift this year.

Act was that for people thinking about making a large gift this year, the CARES Act upped the amount of charitable deduction you can take. In a typical year, if you were going to give a large charitable gift, you could only deduct up to 60% of your adjusted gross income (AGI).

Just for this year, they're moving that cap from 60% to 100%. So, large charitable gifts could result in your owing zero income tax this year. Corporations also got their cap lifted as well, if you're an owner of a corporation looking to give. Note that the 100% limit applies only to gifts made directly to charitable organizations, like SDPB, not to contributions to donor-advised funds or private foundations.

# In 2020, Smaller Gifts Aren't Getting Lost in the Shuffle

First, the CARES Act says that for the over 90% of people who do not itemize their deductions, mainly because how high the standard deduction is now, those individuals can deduct donations to charity up to \$300 per person.

If you've given up to \$300 this year (\$600 married filing jointly) you can take that as a deduction on top of the standard deduction, which saves tax money. It's for people who may say, 'I'm not in a position to be giving thousands, but I did make a contribution as part of the pledge drive – and it's a couple hundred dollars.' Normally that gift would likely be lost in the shuffle. But now you can add that on top of the standard deduction – reducing your taxable income.

# Seniors & Retirees Not Required to Take Minimum Distributions

Another thing that makes this year especially good is if you're older and have an IRA or 401K, the CARES Act says that we do not have to take our required minimum distributions this year, the RMDs.

If you're over 70½ right now and were having to take RMDs from your traditional IRA or 401K, then you know when you take

that money out, you pay income taxes on it. If you do not need the RMDS, you could take distributions from your IRA for gifting to charity. You can offset any taxes by the charitable deduction. Again, in 2020, you're not obligated to take your RMDs.

Another option is to make a 'qualified charitable distribution' directly from your retirement account to a charity, up to \$100,000, tax-free.

Also, if you're 59½ or older, and going to take a withdrawal from your IRA, you wouldn't pay a penalty for doing so. You'd still pay income tax on it. So this year, some people are thinking, well, if I convert my IRA to a Roth, or if I take money out of my retirement account, I could offset that tax bite with a charitable contribution. Because again, we can deduct up to a hundred percent.

It's easy to get deep into the weeds whenever you're talking tax laws like this. But it boils down to the fact that the tax laws are as favorable as they will be for the foreseeable future. And coming 2021 and beyond, we expect that to change and be less favorable from a tax perspective."





